The next time you are trying to quilt with your domestic machine and you're having difficulty getting a grip on the fabric: cut a couple of squares of that waffly, rubbery shelf liner stuff, put them under your hands on the quilt top, and you've got a great grip on your project!



### UPCOMING WORKSHOPS

Wednesday/Thursday, February 21-22, 2024
9am-3 pm
Lea McComas "Powerful Portraits"
\*\*Two-day workshop\*\*
Location: Congregation Brith Shalom

Create a portrait quilt from your own photo. Learn the basics of portrait composition and how to manipulate a digital image to produce a pattern for a portrait quilt. The workshop will also include instruction on fabric selection for pictorial projects. Quilters will cut fabrics and use a fused, raw-edge applique technique to create an amazing life-like portrait quilt approximately 18-inches in length and width, and will do limited quilting to complete the piece. Lea will also provide instruction on how to edit photos and prepare digital files for use in making the pattern. Due to time constraints, each person will send Lea 2-3 digital photos at least 2 weeks prior to the workshop so that she can edit and prepare a printout for their use in making a pattern. A \$5 kit fee will be paid to the instructor at the workshop.

Sharon Kralj's son, Jason G. Kralj, Ph.D., and his group are receiving a Gold Medal Award and a Silver Medal Award from the US Dept of Commerce on 1/24/24. The Gold Medal Award is the highest award given by the DOC. The Silver Medal Award is the second highest honor conferred by the DOC.

Gold Award: For ultra-rapid development (within less than 30 days) of mpox (monkeypox) virus assay control materials to ensure accuracy of diagnostic testing in support of global outbreak response. ### COMFORTERS' CORNER

For the benefit of our new members as well as our long time members, I would like to explain how Comforters works. In a sense, Comforters is a community service quilting bee. All the quilts we make are given to various charitable organizations throughout the greater Houston area. In order to participate in Comforters, you may check kits out at meetings and return the completed projects by signing them in with the number of hours that you worked on the project. This record is kept to help establish our hours of community service.

Dependent upon your interest, various types of kits are available. Some kits contain precut fabric for completing a quilt top. These come with instructions and are of varying degrees of difficulty. Some are perfect for beginners! When the top is complete, return the top and then I will prepare the next kind of kit. This kit will contain the completed quilt top, batting and backing fabric so the quilt can be quilted. Next in the process is a binding kit. This includes the quilted top and fabric for binding.

You can always do your own thing. Comforters will accept quilt tops and completed quilts. Feel free to use your own stash to make something for Comforters. I have had members who sew a top and want to quilt it but request the batting and backing fabric from Comforters. I will be happy to provide these materials so the quilt can be completed. Obviously, there are many variations on the theme. If you want to help Comforters, we can find a way. If you have questions, feel free to ask me.

Last, but not least, we also will be happy to celebrate your birthday with you. Make a quilt in the month of your birthday, sign it in as a birthday quilt, and we will hoot and holler to celebrate with you.

Anyone who sleeps under a quilt is COMFORTED by love.



#### Official Notice of Bylaws Revision

ARTICLE V - Board

i. Chooses workshops working in conjunction with the Program Chair Elect to schedule the following year's workshops, April – March. The term of office remains January – December. (Example: in 2024, Workshop Chair Elect schedules for April 2025 – March 2026)
