Notion of the Month – Health Alert

Instead of highlighting a favorite notion please take note of these health warning signs. Several members are dealing with "surprises" and want all of us to know what to do just in case....

***If you see flashes, usually in just one eye, call your eye doctor immediately. This can be a problem with your retina, and you should not wait! Your vision is at risk.

While growing up in India, rich colors, hand-woven textiles, and handcrafts were part of Sujata's daily life. She learned to appreciate the irregularities and imperfections of handmade crafts. Her instinctive ability to work with colors and textures combined with her education in graphic design has helped her develop a unique style as a quilt designer.

Inspired by utilitarian quilts and handmade crafts from around the world, she developed an abstract form of traditional quilt blocks and subsequently published the book, *Cultural Fusion Quilts*.

The presentation includes a slide show of her travels in India as well as her journey as a quilter. Slide show is followed by the trunk show of original quilts.

Inspired by folk art applique flowers, Peppermint Pinwheels is a perfect spring or summer project. One might ask: is it possible to make a pieced block with curved flower petals without any patterns or templates? The answer is, yes! This design focuses on cutting multiple curves through layers of fabrics and sewing the pieces into free-form flower blocks. Participants will follow instructions from the book *Cultural Fusion Quilts* and construct blocks resembling large appliqued flowers with appliqued centers. The process is easy to learn and quick to reproduce. I will share many tips on making free-form blocks and offer many suggestions for color combinations and layouts during the class.

5. Scrumptious Treats: The food was a hit! We indulged in delicious treats while bonding over our shared love for quilting.





Article VII Committees

Section 2. The Standing Committees positions are Bee Coordinator; Church Facilities Liaison; Comforters Coordinator; Community Service Coordinator; Door Prizes; Endowment Grants; Historian, Show and Tell, Learn-to-Quilt Booth; Librarian; Opportunity Quilt Chair; Parliamentarian; Publicity Coordinator; Retreat Chair; IT Coordinator, Charity Quilt Day Coordinator, Membership Activity Coordinator. The Board and may add, suspend, or remove positions as needed.

d. Endowment Grants Chair - Solicits applicants for endowment grant funds a minimum of twice a year for evaluation and committee approval.


