

Sunshine

QGGH is filled with talented members who create, make, display and give of their talents to further the art of Quilting. It's worth celebrating when our talents are recognized. Congratulations to two of our members who submitted works that were selected from 150 entries and are now in the display "Seeing in Color" at the Texas Quilt Museum in La Grange, Texas through December 2022.

Sharon Kralj began hand embroidery at age four and sewing on the machine at six. By seventh grade made all of her garments. Sharon caught the quilt bug shortly before working at Great Expectations and infected her mother, aunt, and sister with quilt-pox!

A miniature quilt magazine started her quilting hobby. In 1993, she picked out a Hunter's star quilt that was supposed to be 2-inch blocks but ended up making 12-inch blocks using all half-square triangles in lights and darks. It's even hand-quilted and still being used today.



Passion Flower

Sharon joined QGGH in 1996, 26 years ago. The guild and the **Blockbuilders Bee** have been wonderful sources of inspiration and information. Sharon's latest adventure is to learn longarm quilting. Maybe some of those tops will finally become quilts!

"Passion Flower" was made in response to the 2019 quilt show challenge, Flora. Coincidentally, she took a four-day class with Jane Sassaman in Kerrville and her focus was flowers.

The Passion Flower has so many interesting sections that allowed for experimentation and it could have some three-dimensional parts. The colors are vibrant and its growth habit is vigorous (to say the least). My flower displayed those bright colors and that the vines grow so quickly they seem to be taking over.



Allegro!

Allegro! was acquired at the 2019 QGGH quilt show auction. Allegro! was made by the **Cut-Ups Bee** and quilted by Rhonda Dort for the 2019 auction. Sharon saw it being worked on at retreat and knew she was buying that beautiful piece. She had just bought the pattern for making one but hadn't started collecting fabrics – so it was a WIN-WIN! Now she had this beautiful quilt and didn't have to make it!

Charlene Morrison was introduced to the world of quilting in 2005. Years of garment construction made it easy for her to get involved in quilting. Over the years, she has progressed from a novice to an advanced quilter. Charlene is continually perfecting her artistry by taking every opportunity to learn from prize-winner quilters and quilt artists.

She is frequently called upon to provide lectures about Gees Bend and African American's role in quilting and shares her extensive trunk show. It is Charlene's desire to teach African Americans and others the skills that has been prevalent in their history for centuries. Preserving the remaining historical quilts is a necessity.



Life in the Big City

"Life in the Big City" was created during the Coronavirus virus outbreak. She took her first online class with Barbara Black through the Quilt Show.com. The quilt was "Color My World" block of the month 2021 by Australian designer Wendy Williams. For three months in 2021 Charlene was forced to stay in hotel while her home was being repaired from the winter freeze damage; this provided the perfect opportunity to work on this quilt. It came together as she pulled vibrant colors from her stash and used Texas patterned fabric as the background. She quilted it on a domestic machine. Charlene has been a member of QGGH for more than 6 years and is the owner of Quilting My Way.

And now with 4 years of new members who have perhaps never entered a quilt in a show, don't be hesitant to ask your questions!

Although it is not difficult to enter your quilt(s), there is a procedure to follow. First off, thoroughly read all of the show rules, categories and the registration form. All are available online at www.houstonjoyofquilts.com. Registration forms can be submitted at any time up until December 16. You **DO NOT** need to wait until the last minute! Quilts do not have to be finished in order to submit an entry form. It does need to be in progress far enough that you can submit a photo of the quilt (or part of it) so that the finished item can be recognized from the photo.

PLEASE NOTE: *Karen Benson* has recently moved. Be SURE you are using her Galveston address currently on the Joy of Quilts website. There are some forms printed earlier that may have a Houston address on them.

Yippee! This year we have two County buses for Quilt Festival on Thursday, November 3 and Friday, November 4, 2022.

The buses are scheduled to leave Memorial Drive Presbyterian Church at 9:00 AM and scheduled to leave the George R Brown Convention Center at 7:15 PM both days. **Yes, we will park and leave from Memorial Drive Presbyterian Church.** Please park near the brown painted MDPC Scout House near the Memorial Drive (westside), Parking Lot C. LTQ Volunteers – Please remember

to get your volunteer badge as soon as you get in the Convention Center. Show your badge and you don't have to wait in the long lines to get into the Show.

If you volunteer any day Wednesday through Sunday at the QGGH Learn-To-Quilt Booth, you get to ride free. If you're not volunteering at the LTQ Booth, then it's only \$3 round trip. You don't have to be a QGGH member to ride the bus, but **you do have to be 50 years old or older (Harris County rule)**. This is a great deal because you don't have to fight the downtown traffic and the bus will drop you off and pick you up across the street at the hotel. Take the elevator, stairs, or escalator up to Convention Center. **IF YOU LEAVE EARLY PLEASES TEXT ME (713-885-1887), so we don't worry about you.**

Bus sign-up sheets will be available at the September and October morning and night meetings at the LTQ volunteer sign-up table. If you sign up for the bus, then have to cancel, please let me know.

I love the creativity of coming up with new designs and delight in all aspects of the patterning process, from the cutting to the stitching, to the print layout for production.

In 2010, in addition to designing traditional pieced patterns, I began designing quilts using all of the scraps from the numerous projects I had made over the years. At the beginning of 2011, I published my first book on the subject, *All Scrapped Out!: A guide to making a masterpiece from your unruly collection of scraps* (©2011). The book was designed to teach quilters how to sit and sew their scraps with no pre-cutting or pre-pressing of scrap fabrics.

It was a complete success and led to the publishing of two more scrap quilting books: *Still All Scrapped Out!* (©2012) and *What A Load of Scraps!* (©2014).
