Shamrocks

St. Patrick's day is March 17th. While many of us may be familiar with the story of St. Patrick and how he rid Ireland of snakes you may not know that he was born in Britain, kidnapped as a child and taken to Ireland where he was enslaved. He became a shepherd and after six years he escaped and fled home. Upon his return he dreamed that God was calling him to ministry. He answered the call and headed back to Ireland to spread Christ's message. He is credited with bringing Christianity to Ireland. The Catholic Church honored his passing on March 17th by declaring a feast day.



Today St. Patrick's day is celebrated in Ireland by attending church services in the morning, wearing green of course, eating traditional Irish fare, dancing, and wearing shamrocks.
