Episode Fourteen – Next Steps

This Series of Articles has been written in response to the **consensus that the delivery of the Transport Component of** *Net Zero* **in the UK by** *2050* will require more than simply a conversion of cars to *zero emission* – we also **require a material and permanent reduction in the level of car use.**

We now only have **25 years left to materially reverse seven consecutive decades of relentless growth in car use.**

The latest relevant actions by the UK Government have been to defer the last date for sale of petrol and diesel cars by 5 years and to publish Rishi Sunak's 'Plan for Drivers' rolling back car constraint measures!

The **Scottish Government have their heart in the right place** with a firm commitment to **reduce car use in Scotland by 20% by** *2030.*

However, only last month, they **decided to 'pause' all investment in bus priority measures as they haven't got the money** but they might revisit it when they do

Even the most cursory look at **their budget status**, gives the clear impression that it won't be flush with fresh Scottish notes any time soon!

The **lead times involved** in delivering the declared 'target' by **2030** make failure virtually inevitable.

These articles are a **constructive attempt to set out what it will take to deliver the Transport Component of** *Net Zero* **successfully and on time.**

The proposals are **bold but** they are also **structured and functional**.

'If **Net Zero** requires a material reduction in car use and **Net Zero** simply has to be delivered, what better plan is there on the table?'
