From the Horticulture Team

Here are some tips on getting rid of PESTS on your plants. First of all let's start with the fuzzy white cotton looking stuff that attaches itself to your prickly pears and other cacti in the genus *Opuntia*. This is actually a cocoon of sorts for a future cochineal insect. They thrive on the moist pulp from the cactus and will eventually kill it if not eradicated. The formula you can spray on the affected area is insecticidal soap or a hard blast of water.

Another common pest is a tiny leaf skeletonizer caterpillar that comes up from the soil beneath plants in the genus *Tecoma*, including 'Yellow Bells', 'Orange Bells' and 'Sparky.'

From the Horticulture Team continued...

The sure-fire way to kill them is to spray the plant and the soil at the base of the plant with a product called "Thuricide BT." There is some of this in the shop for you to use. If it is gone let one of the Horticulture team members know and we will get more.

Another common pest are those bitey little ants that make nests in the soil. We have stocked an ant killing powder in the shop that seems to work quite well.

Finally, check the trunks of your palm trees. We have been seeing evidence of termites, i.e. termite tubes on some palms. Let a Horticulture Team member know so that they can be treated.

We know that there are other critters out there, some good, some not. Let us know if you need help identifying and treating insects in your Sections.
