From the Horticulture Team

The showy green and red Firestick succulents (*Euphorbia tirucalli*) are prevalent in Sun City West and PRIDES landscaping. While these plants are showy and easy to grow, they are also toxic. Firesticks produce a milky latex sap that is toxic to humans and pets. Getting the milky latex on your skin is an irritant. The real danger is getting this sap in your eyes. Getting the sap in your eyes is easier than you may think. If you get the sap on your glove and wipe your brow, a bead of sweat rolling down your brow can enter the eye. Getting sap in your eyes is an almost a guaranteed trip to the emergency room. It is very painful. Wear gloves and eye protection when trimming these plants. Cut the plant and immediately bag or set it aside and allow it to dry. Watch your pets. Dry sap is still toxic. Clean your tools after using them. Toxic milky sap is common in the plant family Euphorbiaceae which includes firesticks,

Get those carts spiffed-up! See the parade route on Page 3 Moroccan Mound and spurge (the weed). These plants are common in SCW homes and PRIDES landscaping. The same safety protocols for Firesticks are required for these other euphorbias as well. A good rule of thumb is if you see white milky latex sap, be careful. Friendly Reminders for Monitors, 1) We have new drivers for the water and weed spray cart. Thank you Jim Jones, Jr. and Ron Wilson for stepping up. A huge thank you to Tom Grilli for many dedicated years driving the cart. If you need your Section sprayed contact Tom Jones to schedule.

2) Pre-emmergent should be spread in your Section three times per year, March, June, and November. Granular Preen may be found in the garage. 3) No pruning should be happening in your section until late February when the risk of frost has past. 4) Now is the time to begin planning for spring planting. Plant request sheets are available in the garage. Be sure you have the correct amount of space for the mature size of the plant and working irrigation for the plant. Need help with selection?
