and he that gathereth not with me scattereth abroad." (Matthew 12:30) My brethren, please restrain from all evil. (1Thessalonians 5:22) Remember, the man who God corrects is happy. So do not refuse correction (Job 5:17) If God loves you he will correct you when you stray. (Proverbs 3:12)

My beloved, after knowing all of this, I hope you will please God rather than man. "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge: but fools despise wisdom and instructions." (Proverbs 1:7) If you chose to be obedient to your Creator, you are most blessed. Give thanks and praises to God alone. If you think those important missing verses do not have a place in the Bible *maybe* you are just merely persuaded and perhaps you are not committed or convicted by His Holy Spirit, because, "His Holy Spirit will guide you into all truth:" (John 16:13). The very purpose of this tract is for your edification and "the unity of the spirit" (Eph. 4:3) and in doing so, I hope I am not your enemy because I tell you the truth. (Galatians 4:16) Brethren, God sent us out by two or more like the pattern the Apostles - so we can lift up one another when we fall.

My hope, prayer, and intention is that the tract will be helpful to the reader and others. May our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, cause you to accept edification. And may He continue to be merciful upon our souls.



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As I visited many Reformed churches, I felt uncomfortable with the different versions of the Bible they used. What surprised me most is that some of these churches use the New International Version (NIV) which bothers me, and I was never at rest knowing some of its inaccurateness.

As I kept pondering upon this, one question kept coming back to me: "Why aren't they using some of the most accurate and available Bibles, like the Geneva Bible, or the King James Version, which have only a few poorly translated words that can be corrected with the help of Strong's Concordance (a Hebrew and Greek dictionary) that is available in most Christian bookstores and also easy to access with today's technology?" By God's love, mercy, and providence, He caused me to come upon this topic. It has become my priority to make known to His people the sadness I discovered. Over 40 clear instances of changes and omission of *whole* and *important* verses with their numbers from the Bible, which *weakens* the deity of Christ and His doctrinal teachings.

If there were a need for another translation, I would assume that translation should have been much more accurate than those mentioned. I would expect the translators would have corrected those few poorly translated words, and make it better, only then it would have been for edification.

I strongly recommend you get one of the Geneva or King James Bibles and an NIV Bible and compare the verses below, as this is a serious matter. God is very serious with worship. Remember Nadab and Abihu (Leviticus 10:1-2) "who offered strange fire before God, and the Lord devoured them both with fire." Beloved, these translators are very cunning in the way they translate the Bible, making it very difficult for you, to realize

the numbers of the verses that are missing. They are camouflaged .

Here are some of the important *whole* missing verses and their numbers:

Some of those missing verses are direct quotes from the Old Testament.

In the NIV Bible Proverbs 25:23 says, "As a north wind brings rain..." In the KJV Bible Proverbs 25:23

says, "The north wind driveth away rain:.." The NIV and KJV versions are totally opposite in this verse. In the NIV Bible, there is a note under Mark 16:9 that says "The earliest manuscripts and some other ancient witnesses do not have Mark 16:9-20." At John 7:53 is another note that says, "The earliest manuscripts and some other ancient witnesses do not have John 7:53—8:11."

My Brethren, why would any one of God's children want to tamper with the Bible like this? I wonder which spirit are these men of. "Beloved, believe not every spirit, but try the spirits whether they are of God: because many false prophets are gone out into the world." (1 John 4:1) "For if he that cometh preacheth another Jesus, whom we have not preached, or if ye receive another spirit, which ye have not received, or another gospel, which ye have not accepted, ye might well bear with him." (2 Cor. 11:4) "Now I beseech you, brethren, mark them which cause divisions and offences contrary to the doctrine which ye have learned: and avoid them." (Romans 16:17) If their intention was to make the NIV Bible easy to read and understand, that was certainly not accomplished. They only made it worse.

Some people say they like a particular version because they say it's more readable. Now, readable is one thing, but does the readability conform to what's in the original Greek and Hebrew language? You can have a lot of readability, but if it does not match up with what God has said, it's of no profit. You may say it is difficult to read, but study it out. It's hard in Hebrew and Greek and, perhaps, even in English. But to change it around just to make it simple, or interpreting it, instead of translating it, is wrong. You've got lots of interpretations, but we don't want that in a translation. We want exactly what God said in the Hebrew and Greek brought over into English.

Were they trying to be God by striving to open someone's understanding? Luke 24:45 says, "Then opened He their understanding, that they might understand the Scriptures." 1Corinthians 2:14 says, "But the natural man receiveth not the things of the spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned." Proverbs 8:9 says: "They are all plain to him that understandeth..." Surely, only God can make the Bible easy for someone to read and understand, not man. Jesus said, "... He that is not with me is against me;
