

2) Goals for the Next 5 Years

4) Strategies or Ideas That Excite the Church About Being Missional

Current missional engagement is centered on established local outreach ministries, including Starfish, Good News Home for Women, Family Promise, and Reformed Church Home. These efforts provide meaningful, hands-on opportunities to serve the community and reflect a focused and sustained commitment to mission.

While resources and energy are limited, there is openness to renewed vision and leadership that can introduce fresh, achievable opportunities for outreach. Clear, tangible goals are especially effective in fostering engagement and shared purpose.
