KAROLYN LEE GHOLSTON has gained a stellar reputation in operatic and recital works in central Ohio. She is a native of Altoona,

Pennsylvania and received a BA from Slippery Rock University of Pennsylvania in music performance. She went on to earn her M.M in Performance/Pedagogy from Ohio University. She has won first place in the National Association for Teachers of Singing Competition, Chad Williamson Scholarship Competition and second place in the Leontyne Price Vocal Arts Competition in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania.

Recent engagements have included the role Kate Pinkerton in Opera Columbus' production of Madama Butterfly, Guest Artist in "I, Too Sing America", Columbus' Harlem Renaissance Celebration, Annie in Opera Columbus' world

premiere *The Flood* workshop, Anna (Donna Anna) in Opera Columbus' production of #UncleJohn, which is an adaptation of Mozart's Don Giovanni, and the Infirmary Nun in Opera Project Columbus' production of Suor Angelica. Karolyn will also be a quest artist in Opera Columbus' The Journey program in Jan. 2019. Other roles include Lucia in Nino Rota's I Due Timidi with Opera Project Columbus, Musetta in La Bohème with the first collaboration of Shadow Box and Opera Columbus "Opera on the Edge", Musetta in the Firewater Arts Festival, Fiordiligi in Così fan tutte in Firenze, Italy, with Florence Voice Seminar, Gretel in Hansel and Gretel, Minty Rabbit in Barefoot and Clorinda in La Cenerentola with the Opera Columbus Outreach and Education program.

Along with her concert and solo work she has done extensive chorus work in *Aida*, *Madama Butterfly*, *La Bohèmé*, *The Pearl Fishers* and *Turandot* all with Opera Columbus. Karolyn also teaches private voice in her studio in Dublin, Ohio.

Lyric Soprano, recently had the pleasure of singing Mozart's *Requiem*, as the soprano soloist, with Capriccio

Columbus and with the Westerville Symphony Orchestra. Last spring, Ms. Willis performed with the Mansfield Chorus as the soprano soloist singing Haydn's *Theresienne Mass*. Ms. Willis portrayed Mimi in Opera Columbus' *La Bohème* Opera on the Edge, and was in New York portraying Alice Ford in Verdi's *Falstaff* with Prelude to Performance. She helped premiere a new work, *The Ruby Elzy Story*, inspired by

David Weaver's book. Black Diva of the Thirties. In 2010. Ms. Willis won the Women in Music Competition. Other notable performances include: Donna Anna (Don Giovanni), Vitellia (La Clemenza di Tito), Aida (Elton John and Tim Rice's Aida), Adolfo (Faramondo). Juliette (Roméo et Juliette), Countess (Le nozze di Figaro), Polly (The Threepenny Opera), Susannah (Tintypes), Monica (The Medium), and Rosa Bud (The Mystery of Edwin Drood). Ms. Willis obtained her Bachelor of Music degree from Otterbein College and her Master of Music and Doctorate of Musical Arts degree from The Ohio State University, Ms. Willis is a proud member of the Actor's Equity Association and the National Association of Teachers Association.



JUSTIN T. SWAIN

(Fields) holds both the Master of Music in Vocal Performance and the Master of Arts in Vocal Pedagogy from The Ohio State

University, where he studied in the studios of both Dr. Scott McCoy and Dr. Robin Rice.

A Columbus native, Justin has been featured in the Columbus Italian Festival, in concert with Harmony Project Columbus, the New Albany Symphony Orchestra, and Opera Project Columbus, and has performed numerous times with Opera Columbus as a chorister, on the main stage, as a member of their touring Education Outreach program for two seasons, and in their popular Opera On The Edge production of *La Bohème*, in which he performed the role of Marcello.

On the stage, Justin recently

performed the roles of Maximilian and Ship Captain in Leonard Bernstein's Candide at The Ohio State University, debuted the role of Aedeta in the first public performance of Cadman's historic opera, Ramala: Land of Misty Water, the role of Maestro Spinelloccio with Opera Project Columbus, and also recently performed the role of Baron Duophol in Verdi's La Traviata with Opera Columbus, in which he was noted by Columbus Underground magazine to be "a promising young talent." Justin's next engagements include the New Albany Symphony Orchestra's Holiday Concert and the role of Cascada in Opera Project Columbus' production of *The Merry* Widow in January.



BARBARA BRENTON SAHR

is an international vocal coach, accompanist and pianist. Graduate of Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music and

Westminster Choir College. Barbara has taught at OSU School of Music, Westminster Summer Sessions, and currently teaches at Capital University School of Music. She is also the musical director for Opera Goes to School with Opera Columbus.



RICHARD CELESTINA,

originally from Cleveland, OH, holds a Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering

and a Bachelor of Music in Vocal Performance. He studied as a baritone with soprano Tamara Regensburger and mezzo-soprano Katherine Rohrer. During his time at Ohio State, he performed with the OSU Chorale, the OSU Men's Glee Club, and was involved in Ohio State's School of Music Opera Scenes. Outside of The Ohio State University, Richard is the Assistant Director of Music, a cantor, and the bass section leader at Our Lady of Peace Catholic Church in Columbus, OH, where he also served as the Interim Choir Director in 2015. Richard has also been a member of the Lancaster Chorale since 2016 and has sung in works including Saint-Saëns' Oratorio de Noel and Mozart's Requiem (collaborative works with ProMusica Chamber Orchestra). Expanding his involvement in the music world. Richard worked as an Assistant Stage Manager for Opera Columbus on Verdi's La Traviata during the 2015–16 season and as the Stage Manager for Opera Columbus' Opera on the Edge performances of Puccini's La Bohème during the 2016-17 season. In the fall of 2016. Richard began coursework and research toward a PhD in Mechanical Engineering at The Ohio State University, focusing on heat transfer and fluid dynamics for turbomachinery applications.



DESTINY COLEMAN is the Director of Education and Artistic Administration for

Administration for Opera Columbus, where she is planning and

responsible for planning and managing the company's education and engagement programs as well as administration. In this position, Ms. Coleman manages artists, coordinates all education and engagement programming serving over 13,000 students each spring,

oversees the Cooper-Bing Vocal Competition, and serves as lead administrator.

As a mezzo-soprano, Ms. Coleman has performed roles for several productions of The Ohio State University Lyric Opera Theatre Program, including *Side by Side* by Mozart and Sondheim, Verdi's *Falstaff*, Mozart's *Requiem*, Brahms' *Ein deutsches Requiem*, and a new work entitled, *The Ruby Elzy Story*, inspired by David Weaver's book, *Black Diva of the Thirties*. She has

also won many awards for her vocal abilities. In 2011, Ms. Coleman performed with Heather Headley and the world-renowned tenor Andrea Bocelli. She has also performed with the Columbus Symphony Orchestra for the Fantastique Finale. Ms. Coleman holds a Bachelor of Music in Vocal Performance from The Ohio State University and Master of Science in Management and Leadership from Western Governors University.

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




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
