From the YMRA Chair - Shirley Dalton

A reminder, in November 2022 we will be holding our biennial election for Chairman and members of the Executive Committee. It will be for a 2-year term beginning in January 2023. if you are interested in volunteering or know someone who might be, please give us your name. We need to get the proposed slate in place by September.

The YMRA meeting on Saturday, July 9, was well received. We had a lively discussion on problems with mobilehome parks and management. Resident Rights and Responsibilities were discussed and common issues with park management. Packets were passed out that included copies of Rights and Responsibilities, procedures for registering complaints, and the appropriate people or organizations with whom to file problems. Sample logs and letters were included in the packet. If you were not able to be at the meeting and would like a packet, let me know.

Changes to the Yucaipa Rent Stabilization Ordinance by the City Council at their special meeting were minor. The only change affecting current mobilehome park residents is the formula for calculating annual space rent increases. The formula had used 80% of Consumer Price Index (CPI) or 4% of current space rent, whichever is lower. This changed to 100% of CPI or 4% of current space rent, whichever is lower. Since inflation is running so high right now, over 9%, space rent increase will be limited to 4% of this years rent. We won't see much difference in our rent increases until inflation rate drops below 4%.

I want to stress one point: please make sure of your facts before posting any information or opinions on social media, such as Facebook. In the run up to the Mobilehome Rent Review Commission meeting in May and the Special City Council meeting on July 11 on rent stabilization, someone posted online that the Commission and then City Council were going to be voting to eliminate rent control in Yucaipa. This was totally wrong and only succeeded in scaring many mobilehome park residents. The Commission meets every two years to review the ordinance and determine if any changes are needed. It has never, and will never, recommend eliminating rent control in Yucaipa.

Heat Causing Problems for Some Residents

High temperatures this spring and summer are causing many mobilehome park residents problems, from inadequate cooling and higher utility bills to our friends at Southern California Edison (SCE) turning off the power. Along with many other Yucaipa city residents, I've received notice from SCE that the electricity will be off for a few hours on an upcoming date for equipment upgrades. With the temps at 90° or higher, this is concerning to many mobilehome park residents, especially seniors and disabled who depend on medical equipment, oxygen, etc. There are steps you can take to stay cool.

- Visit a Cooling Center in Yucaipa, there are several available:

 - Have a Backup Plan
- Check with your medical equipment supplier to see if they can provide backup or emergency assistance.
- Get on "Special Needs" Lists: Contact your local fire department to learn whether they maintain a list
 of people with special medical needs. Being on this list may help them better respond during
 emergencies.

Inflation is hitting Seniors and mobilehome park residents

With the prices going up on everything from food to gasoline, it can be hard to make ends meet. The 2022 California State Budget just signed by Gov. Newsom will give a little relief to individuals who had income less than \$75,000/year. Individuals will receive a one-time payment of \$350 in October for a single filer, \$700 for those filing jointly. Lesser amounts will be paid to those who had income over \$75,000.

It does appear we have moved from extremely cold weather to hot summer temperatures. This can lead to higher cooling costs in the Yucaipa area. If you need assistance in meeting your utility bills, HEAP assistance is available. You can apply for Emergency Utility Bill Assistance if you have received a disconnect notice for utility accounts. Non-Emergency Utility Bill Assistance may provide an annual HEAP credit to qualifying clients. Legislation we are watching in Sacramento:

- Senator Connie Leyva has introduced SB 869 which would require any person responsible for managing a mobilehome park to complete 16 hours of initial training and at least 6 hours of followup training annually, including an annual end of year online examination. Passed Senate Appropriations Committee and cleared the Senate on 25 May 2022. Bill in Assembly Fiscal Committee.
- Assembly Member Alex Lee introduced AB 2031 which would allow representatives (such as an attorney, mobilehome advocate, or translator) of mobilehome residents to also attend a meeting between residents and park management for the purpose of resolving problems. On the California Senate floor for final vote.
- Senator John Laird introduced SB 940 to amend California Civil Code which currently prohibits local rent stabilization ordinances from governing newly constructed mobilehome spaces first offered for rent after January 1, 1990. SB 940 would allow local rent regulations to govern a new mobilehome space in an existing park regardless of when it was initially offered for rent. On Assembly Floor for final vote.
