Legislation we have been watching in Sacramento:

All of these bills were signed into law by Governor Newsom on September 28.

- Senator Connie Leyva SB 869, as amended, will require require the Department of Housing and Community Development, by May 1, 2025, to adopt regulations to require at least one person per mobilehome park or recreational vehicle park employed or acting under contract as an onsite manager or assistant manager, ... to receive training, as specified. The bill would require the training to be at least 6 hours, and no more than 8 hours, during the initial year and would require an online end-of-year examination to occur. The bill will require, every 2 years thereafter, a training of at least 2 hours, and no more than 4 hours, on Provisions of MRL, rights and responsibilities of homeowners and management, rules and regulations for the park, among other matters.
- Assembly Member Alex Lee AB 2031 which will allow representatives (such as an attorney, mobilehome advocate, or translator) of mobilehome residents to also attend a meeting between residents and park management for the purpose of resolving problems.
- Senator John Laird SB 940 to amend California Civil Code which had prohibited local rent stabilization ordinances from governing newly constructed mobilehome spaces first offered for rent after January 1, 1990. SB 940 will allow local rent regulations to govern a new mobilehome space in an existing park regardless of when it was initially offered for rent.

How to File a MRL Complaint:

We constantly get requests for information on how to file a complaint pursuant to the Mobilehome Residency Law Protection Program administered by California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD). This program offers help for mobilehome/manufactured homeowners to resolve complaints for certain violations. Here are some FAQs to assist you:

- Who can submit a complaint? Any mobilehome/manufactured homeowner who lives in a mobilehome park. It is often beneficial if more than one homeowner in the park signs on to the filing.
- What types of complaints can be submitted? Any complaints for issues within mobilehome
 parks related to Mobilehome Residency Law (MRL) violations. Common violations include
 illegal grounds for eviction, failure to provide proper notice of rent increases, failure to
 maintain common areas, or no written rental agreement between the park and mobilehome
 owner.
- How does a mobilehome/manufactured homeowner submit their complaint? Complaints must be submitted to HCD who will provide help to resolve and coordinate resolutions of <u>the most severe alleged violations</u> of the MRL.
