

Clark County launches grant program to revitalize Las Vegas Chinatown businesses

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STORY OVERVIEW

WHAT THIS SAMPLE DEMONSTRATES

- Systems context: connected the grant to crime prevention, crosswalk improvements, pedestrian access, neighborhood growth, and cultural preservation.
- Accuracy mindset: the digital story clearly flags that program terms changed and directs readers to current official information.

WHY IT FITS GLOBAL ENERGY MONITOR
