

Pastor's Ponderings



"Why do you look for the living among the dead?" That was the question the women were asked at the tomb that first Easter morning. They were then told that Jesus was alive, risen from the dead. There was no reason to linger in a place of death, because Jesus had risen to give them new life. And with that new life, the women ran off to tell the others that Jesus had risen, bringing life out of death for all.


This Easter, we talked about how easy it is for us to settle for things that don't give us life. We get tired, we get discouraged or overwhelmed, and we settle for what's easy and familiar, rather than looking for what gives us life. It's like knowing that we need healthy food to sustain us but feeling too tired and too overwhelmed to bother. So instead of eating food that fuels your body, we settle for what you can find – stale chips with cheez whiz, a squashed Twinkie you don't remember buying, or something unidentifiable that's been in the back of your fridge for a month. Will that food fill you up? Sure. Is it healthy? Will it give us life? Not so much.

Easter, reminds us that we worship a God who sent his Son to bring light into our darkness, forgiveness in a world of brokenness, life – eternal life – when it seems like death will have the last word. Easter reminds us that we don't have to settle for death, for things that have no life to give us. Easter reminds us that life is so abundant all around us if we just take a peek out of the darkness of our old tombs to see it. What gives you life? Just looking outside, venturing outside, you can't help but see life bursting into bloom this spring. New life is found in the kindness we can share with others. New life is in the Word of God, the stories of joy we share. New life is in our gratitude and thankfulness for what God has given us. New life is found every time we show love in our actions. New life is found when we create beauty – art, crafts, music, and food and share with others. New life blooms brilliantly when we live with thoughtfulness and compassion for others. New life is abundant as we connect with others in kindness and love. New life eclipses the darkness of the tomb every time.





GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

April 8, 2025

(Minutes below not approved until next Council meeting)

Call to Order. President Kelly Witte called the meeting to order at 7:01 pm.

Attendance. Present: Sandi Aston Hall, Steve Bielefeldt, Pr. Jennifer Jelinek, John Jensen, Marcia Klemp, Connie Kreuser, Charlene Luchterhand, April Mickelson, Peggy Punsel, Kristin Rue, Richard Scott, Amy Simdon, Kelly Witte. **Absent:** None

Devotions. Connie shared her faith journey, and Sandi led us in prayer.

Approval of Minutes. Peggy moved to approve the March minutes. Kristin seconded the motion. Unanimously approved by those who attended the March meeting.

Approval of Agenda. John moved to approve the agenda. Marcia seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Correspondence. Pastor read a summary of the annual meeting from Skaalen Retirement Services—a continuum of care community—prepared by Chris Watson, our liaison to this community. Skaalen is nationally recognized for their services and has lengthy waiting lists.

Treasurer's Report. (Amy) We had a net gain of \$4,299 in March, giving us a total gain of \$1,031 for the year. Our General Giving through March was \$20,840 less than 2024 and \$9,682 less than the 2025 budget. The Special Giving through March was \$1,490 less than last year and \$931 less than budget. Our expenses through March were \$9,558.41 less than last year although most of the difference was due to the sabbatical expenses last year. We were \$11,634 under budget. The checking balance was \$4,296 more than at the end of February with the general fund balance approximately \$2,031 more. Sandi moved to approve this treasurer's report and send it to audit. John seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Pastor's Report. Wednesday night Lenten services and soup suppers have gone smoothly. Everything is set for decorating on the Saturday prior to Easter. Holy week schedule: Palm Sunday-9:00 AM, Maundy Thursday-7:00 PM, Good Friday community service at Veterans Park-noon (one location only this year); Good Friday at our church-7:00 PM, Easter-7:00 AM & 9:00 AM. Special music for the 9:00 AM Easter service will include members of all ages and ability levels who play an instrument joining in on the hymn, Jesus Christ Has Risen Today. We will enjoy Holy Humor Sunday the week after Easter. Kelly Witte and Tami Collin will represent our church at Synod Assembly on May 16-17. Erik Jelinek update: doing OK and still in the research study. He can now travel to Detroit alternate weeks rather than weekly.

Committee Reports. (Provided in writing and/or discussed in the meeting as needed.)

- **Education.** (Kristen). Sunday School will have its Easter celebration, RISEN, this Sunday from 10:15 AM--noon.
- Hospitality. (Peggy) Cake will be provided on Sunday in honor of a special birthday.

- Outreach & Social Justice. (April) Working on making the Lenten Challenge more visible.
 Chris and Tom Watson were contacted about the Lutheran Social Services (LSS) refugee
 program they are involved with. Pastor invited them to share during a Sunday worship service how they have been involved and to speak about the needs and/or benefits of donating to LSS. We hope this will encourage our congregation to help meet our Lenten
 Challenge of \$2000 for LSS.
- Stewardship. (Connie) See "New Business."

Old Business.

Church Preservation Projects/Bids. The office will be carpeted the Monday and Tuesday after Easter. Cost will be about \$1475. An estimate to carpet the large room in the basement is \$1500. Right now there are more urgent property priorities, e.g., fixing outdoor lighting, which is a safety issue. A bid for a new thermostat for the sanctuary is \$800. Jim Jermain is investigating a lower cost option.

Personal Safety Task Force. Will meet after Easter.

Pictorial Directory. Breah Klemp finished the draft and obtained a quote of \$300-\$400 for 100 copies. We may want to purchase 200 copies. Other options may be investigated.

New Business.

• "Save the Bees. (Stewardship Committee) We previewed a lovely power point presentation prepared by Mary Bielefeldt and Breah Klemp geared for Sunday School children. The vision is to involve the children and their parents in the pollinator garden project. These families will also be invited to participate in a fundraiser to "save the bees" through the organization Earthjustice because bees are so critical in pollinating many types of plants and have been dying off in record numbers. Earthjustice's work has stellar reviews that the committee would like to support.

Adjournment. April moved to adjourn the meeting. Amy seconded the motion. Unanimously approved. Meeting adjourned at 7:47 PM. We ended with the Lord's Prayer.

Next Meeting. Our next meeting will be held on Tuesday, May 13 at 7:00 PM. April is scheduled to present devotions.


