Last week I lost a friend. Polly was on staff of the last congregation Erik and I served, and she became a good friend to both of us. Erik and her husband became close friends as well, sharing bad jokes and declaring that they were “brothers from another mother,” despite the 20 years between them. In spite of the fact that they lived across town from us, we’d always take our daughters trick-or-treating at their house, because they wanted to see the girls, and they always had a special bag of goodies for them. We had a lot of good times together over the last 15 years, as co-workers and friends. She was fun, vibrant, generous, and loving. After a wonderful girls’ trip to Mexico and a few days back home, Polly died peacefully, and totally unexpectedly, at 63-years-old. So many of my experiences and memories of the last 15 years include Polly. While I’ve lost all my grandparents and my father-in-law, never before have I lost someone who was in my life nearly every day for such a long period of time.

I’m grateful for our friendship and for all the things I learned from Polly. When I think of Polly, I think of hospitality. Polly was the consummate hostess. If you were invited to her house, you knew you’d be taken care of. She was able to anticipate her guests’ needs before they even realized them. Nobody ever wanted for anything at her house. She made sure her guests had everything they needed to be comfortable. Her hospitality seemed to be so effortless, though I’m sure she spent hours preparing. But it was all worthwhile, because it meant that she showed her guests how special they were. For Polly, hospitality was never about her, it was about serving the needs of others. What a gift.


From Polly, I learned that showing hospitality in our homes translates easily into showing hospitality in the church. Everybody wants to feel welcome and comfortable. Everybody wants to know that there’s a place for them. Everybody wants to be valued and appreciated. As the church, we’re called to show such hospitality to others. Because as Christ’s Church, we don’t exist for ourselves. Sure, we receive blessings from being part of the church. But ideally, we exist for “the other.” We exist for those who aren’t here yet. We exist for those who need to feel God’s love. The church’s purpose is to reach out to those who need to get to know Jesus.

We’re all hosts of Grace. We’re all ministers of hospitality. We’re all called to welcome others, to talk with people we don’t know, to notice the needs of others and do what we can to meet those needs. We follow a Lord who welcomed the stranger, ate with the outcasts, and befriended the lonely. Hospitality is a holy calling. I’ll forever be grateful to my friend Polly for helping me to see how hospitality is one way that we can share Jesus.



Please note that the Sanctuary Renovation Project is called “Renewing Grace,” a separate fundraising project from our regular invitation to generosity to support Grace.

Have you ever read Shel Silverstein's book, “The Giving Tree”? It's the beautiful story of a boy and his beloved tree. Throughout the boy's life, the tree gives him limbs to climb, as well as shade, apples, and eventually wood to build with, and finally, a stump to rest on. The tree constantly blesses the boy throughout all stages of his life. When I look at this year's stewardship logo, our “Growing in Grace” tree, it reminds me of this book. Like the tree in the book, our Tree of Grace has abundant gifts to share.

The Tree of Grace represents our congregation – our past, our present, and our future.

As we've celebrated our past 125 years during this anniversary year, we also do ministry in the present and plan for a fruitful future. Our roots will nourish us as we grow stronger and branch out, bearing fruit through faith, generosity, and acts of service. You are an important part of the Tree of Grace, and we invite you to consider how you will reach out your branches, sharing your gifts and bearing fruits from your faith.

Sanctuary Renovations Update

RENEWING GRACE!

On Sunday, October 14th, it was indeed brighter in worship! We looked past the scaffolding to see the blue sky and neighbors' trees. The new windows has been installed and on Thursday, October 18th, the drywall work began. Ryan Ellickson is scheduled to begin painting that wall on October 25th. We have not heard back on an installation date for the carpet, nor a delivery date for the pews. Tentatively, we are planning for electrical work to begin on November 19th, followed by the carpet and the pews later in that same week. Oh, to be such an optimist.

See you on Sundays to witness the transformation of our sanctuary and to track my optimism.

What became of the Sanctuary Wall Cross?

When our church was first built, the cross in the sanctuary, fashioned from six inch square beams, was nine feet tall and six feet across. It was suspended over the altar by a single rod from the ceiling's apex and tended to sway with movement of the building. This was unsettling, and fear mounted that one day it would fall and hit the pastor. Discussion immediately began to replace it, and the 18 foot black cross that has been mounted on our sanctuary wall was proposed. On November 6, 1965, Jane Hommen, a 12 year old member of Grace, died. A year or so later, when the congregation was seeking to replace the hanging cross, Bud and Betty Hommen, desiring to memorialize their daughter Jane, stepped forward and purchased the black cross for the sanctuary wall. As *Renewing Grace*, our current 125th anniversary renovation, moved forward, a decision was made to replace the black cross on the wall with one the size of the original design. Like the original, it will be suspended—however, from two points rather than one. The church council took up the question of what to do with the black cross that has been on the wall. Linda (Hommen) Mathison, older sister to Jane, expressed a desire to have the cross. The cross now resides with Linda and Arvid Mathison, Cambridge, as they continue to remember Jane (February 13, 1953 - November 6, 1965).

October 9, 2018

Meeting called to order by President Pat Hall at 7:07pm. Attendance: Pat Hall, Steve Geis, Mary Behling, Amy Simdon, Jean Scott, Lori Jensen, Janet Koepp. Excused: Tony Buonincontro, Shawn Koebke, and Bryan Holmen. Pastor Jennifer Jelinek also present.

Action items: Motion by Amy Simdon, seconded by Lori Jensen to approve corrected minutes: addition of Janet Koepp and Lisa Sperle to attendance, of September 11, 2018 Council meeting. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Jean Scott, seconded by Mary Behling, to approve the Consent Agenda. MCU. Financial report: Tony was unable to attend, but sent in his report. Motion by Amy Simdon, seconded by Janet Koepp, to approve September financials. MCU.

Pastor's Report: Pastor attended the Bishop's Convention. She will be attending the "Change or Die Conference" on Thursday. The devotional study called **Nooma** will continue on Monday evenings at 7:00 and at noon on Wednesdays. The Edvard Grieg Chorus will perform on Wednesday, Oct. 17. Everyone is encouraged to attend. Posters will be put up in stores and banks and information will be put in the newspaper and on Facebook. The deadline to sign up for the Intergenerational Lutheran mission trip to Puerto Rico, June 17-24, 2019, is October 21. A \$100 deposit is needed to reserve a place. So far, 5 people have committed to the trip. Edgerton has 60 already signed up. Stewardship Pledge Sunday will be on Nov. 11. Pastor will be on vacation from Oct. 24 – 29. Rev Emily Tveite, Lutheran Campus Minister, will lead worship on October 28.

Old Business: Sanctuary Remodeling Update – The new windows are being installed this week. The pews and carpet will be installed in November but not in time for 125th Anniversary Celebration. Sanctuary Remodeling Fundraiser update – Pat Hall. The Renewing Grace fund drive has been very successful. About \$194,701 has been pledged so far with 53 family units committed. Of the pledges, \$45,000 has already been donated in cash. The committee will continue to encourage more members to join in pledging. 125th Anniversary at Grace – Lori Jensen –The Edvard Grieg Chorus will perform on Wednesday, Oct. 17, as part of the celebration week. The commemorative book will be out by the end of the year. Several members are writing about their memories of the earlier years. Decorations will be put up before Sunday event. There will be a potluck lunch after worship. Roof beam repair - Pat Hall reported that GBR Corp has contacted a carpenter who is familiar with building repairs. They will work together to fix the problem as soon as they have time. Both are extremely busy due to weather delays this summer and fall. Cutting trees - It was determined that only 2 trees should be cut down. People contacted about doing the work have not responded. God's Work, Our Hands – now have more projects than workers so looking for more volunteers. Most projects will take less than 2 hours. Water and snack bars will be distributed as people leave to work right after worship. Community Dinner- Scheduled for Nov. 1. Tony will again be the chef. Many volunteers have already signed up. Quilters Auction - Postponed until 2019. **New Business:** Portico Insurance Motion made "to approve the Gold Plus Plan for Pastor Jennifer for 2019." Jean Scott/Mary Behling MCU A motion "to open a Money Market account at United Community Bank to use for the cash from the Renewing Grace Campaign". Lori Jensen/Amy Simdon – MCU Monthly payments to MIF for our loan will be made from the Money Market acct. This will ensure that general funds and Renewing Grace funds will be kept separate. A motion "to give the Renewing Grace Capital Fund Committee authorization to make decisions as to if and when additional money will be used to make additional payments on the principal." Mary Behling/Amy Simdon – MCU A motion was made "to accept the resignation of Lisa Sperle from the Church Council effective immediately." Lori Jensen/Jean Scott - MCU

Discussion Items: Pat reminded all committee chairs that the Budget requests for 2019 need to be turned in to Tami this month and Annual Committee reports need to be turned in to Virginia before Thanksgiving. Operations Manual Updates – Pat again reminded Committee chairs to send in their updates. Next Council Meeting – November 13 at GLC, 7:00 p.m. Devotions & snacks - Tony

Motion by Amy Simdon/Janet Koepp to adjourn. MCU. Adjournment time 8:04 p.m. followed by the Lord's Prayer.

This celebration of 125 years, the Renewing Grace sanctuary renovations, and the fellowship we all share are just a few of the reminders of God's grace.






