Pastor's Ponderings

"For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience."

- Romans 8:24-25

What do you hope for? What hopes keep you going from day to day? What hopes have become reality in your life? How are you at waiting with patience for the things you hope for?

Advent is a time of hope, a time of waiting, a time of patience. Although we live 2,000 years after the birth of the Messiah, although we've received the blessings of Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, Advent is a time each year when we imagine and experience what it must've been like to wait hopefully for the Messiah's coming. What was it like to be exiled from your homeland, to live under occupation, constantly hoping that God would send someone to deliver you from your suffering?

Though we haven't experienced what the Jews did before Jesus' time, in our times of pain or darkness, hope is often what helps get us through. Hope comes from deep within us, the place of our deepest yearning for the "not yet." Hope isn't just blind optimism, it's confident expectation in a brighter future. In our case, hope is our confident expectation in the grace of God. God promised a Messiah to the Jews, and instead, God sent a Messiah for the whole world. God is greater than even our greatest hopes.

Advent is about hoping and waiting for the Messiah to return someday. And while we wait for that day, Advent is also about hoping and waiting to see signs of Jesus in our world every day. As you prepare for Christmas this year, look around you to see signs of Jesus. Listen for words of hope in the music around you. Notice the Christ-like actions of others and spread the hope of Christ in your words and your deeds. God has sent Jesus to be our hope. And as followers of Jesus, it's our joy to be hope-spreaders in the world around us.


May Christ's birth bring you hope, and may you share that hope with those who struggle and those who need the light and joy of God's grace.



Baby Kits and Fair Trade Items

This is a busy time of year for Outreach; one that definitely involves all of us. Last year we decided to follow the LWR (Lutheran World Relief) guidelines and spread out our kits throughout the year. What better time than the Advent/Christmas/Epiphany season to collect for the **baby care kits**. We will soon be celebrating the birth of a very special baby, and thus we ask for your support in completing kits for babies in developing countries. Due to donations that have come in throughout the year, we have partial kits ready, but need your help in completing them. We have a goal of 40 kits!

Beginning December 2nd, there will be a cradle in Fellowship Hall with a mobile above it that has tags attached showing what is needed. Please consider taking one or two, and returning your donation back to church before the end of January. Monetary donations are appreciated to help pay for cloth diapers. There will also be a list near the cradle of all the supplies that are needed, in case you feel moved to complete an entire kit.



You can help farmers in developing countries by purchasing **Fair Trade/Equal Exchange** coffee, tea, cocoa, and chocolate bars. Check out our table the first three Sundays in December. As many of you know, these make great gifts for yourself or others! (This is not a fund raiser.)

For that hard-to-shop-for person, consider one of the many items in the ELCA **Good Gifts catalog**, or check out the ornaments on the tree. Chicks, a pig, farming tools, vaccinations, or even a latrine could make a very unique gift for someone! Directions for ordering will be at the table with the catalogs.

Lastly, free **Advent calendars** from the ELCA will be available for you to take (no chocolate in them; sorry!) starting November 25th.

With new administration at the Dane County Jail, I want to update you on the changes as best as I can. Chaplain Todd Marcotte is the new part-time Chaplain. He is assisted by Jose Rodriguez, who is a part-time volunteer. There is a new list of items that the incarcerated folks are allowed to receive. It is not as comprehensive as it used to be, so please look at it carefully:

- *Bibles and other sacred texts (SOFT COVERS ONLY)
- *Reading glasses
- *Stamped envelopes
- *Composition notebooks (NOT SPIRAL BOUND)
- *Christmas and sympathy cards
- *Loose leaf paper

The Tutoring Program is ongoing. If you are interested in becoming a tutor, please let me know or send an e-mail from this website madisonjailministry.org. Bob Koepp has been a tutor for 2 years and can also give you more information. More than ever, your prayers are needed for everybody connected with this ministry. Changes are always stressful. You are the voice of comfort and compassion to folks in jail.

November 13, 2018

Meeting called to order by President Pat Hall at 7:02pm. Attendance: Pat Hall, Steve Geis, Mary Behling, Jean Scott, Lori Jensen, Janet Koepp, Bryan Holmen Excused: Tony Buonincontro, Amy Simdon and Shawn Koebke, . Pastor Jennifer Jelinek also present.

Action items: Motion by Mary Behling, seconded by Jean Scott to approve minutes of October 9, 2018 Council meeting. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Jean Scott, seconded by Mary Behling, to approve the Consent Agenda. MCU. Financial report: Pat passed around tentative budget requests for 2019 and asked each committee to verify the amount. Motion by Jean Scott, seconded by Mary Behling, to approve October financials. MCU.

Pastor's Report: The Confirmation class will be going to Edgerton to a Youth Rally. There will be a Healing Service on Sunday, Nov. 18. First communion will be on Nov. 25. The Advent Festival will be on Dec. 2 and will offer holiday crafts, church decorating and a chili dinner. New members will be welcomed on Dec 16. Hospitality Committee will discuss reviving the new member sponsorship plan.

Old Business: Sanctuary Remodeling Update – See written report from Michael Rehak. When it is necessary to order things on-line, and the church credit card does not have a big enough limit, Pastor Jennifer's credit card has been used and then she is reimbursed. Dan Korth has lost his work space so it may be as long as 6 months before he can complete the communion rail. Lori Jensen will give him a call to discuss options. Sanctuary Remodeling Fundraiser update – See written report from Tim Neuenschwander. 125th Anniversary at Grace – Lori Jensen -The commemorative book will hopefully be out by the end of the year. Roof beam repair - Pat Hall reported that GBR Corp is extremely busy so repair may have to wait until spring. Cutting trees – Trees have been cut down; stump removal will be done in spring. God's Work, Our Hands Thirty-three people participated; they did weeding, put railings up for a ramp, and many miscellaneous tasks; flyers were distributed around the community asking for jobs to be done; some people donated cash as a thank you for work done. Community Dinner- Thank you to Tony Buonincontro for preparing a delicious meal and to all who helped in any way.

New Business - Puerto Rico Mission trip –Sixteen people from Grace have signed up to go; they will be meeting to discuss fund raising ideas including Scrips gift card sales Mission Statement – a draft of a revised statement was presented; it will be discussed again in December. Grace Seminary Scholarship Fund – a member of the congregation is planning to begin a program and asked about the scholarship; Grace does not have a written policy concerning an application nor guidelines as to distribution; Lori, Pat and Pastor Jennifer will get information from other sources and will bring ideas to December meeting.

Discussion Items: Pat reminded all committee chairs Annual Committee reports need to be turned in to the Administrative Assistant before Thanksgiving. The Property Committee will look into the lack of heat in the sanctuary on Sunday mornings and the lack of lighting in the parking lot.

Operations Manual Updates – Pat again reminded Committee chairs to send in their updates and she will continue to update the manual.


