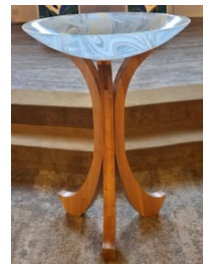

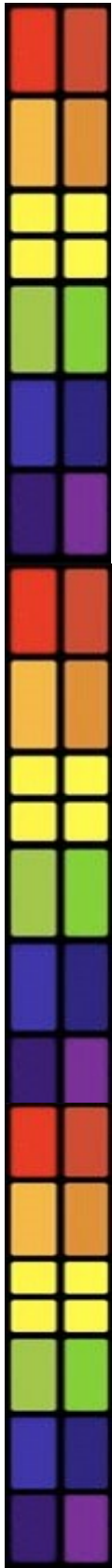

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## Monday Night Adult Study

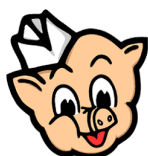
In 2025, the ELCA put out a social statement called, "Faith and Civic Life: Seeking the Well-being of All." The statement invites us to consider how our faith intersects with our lives as citizens in this country. As you may know, this summer we've been fostering monarch caterpillars at Grace. To date, we've released 12 monarch butterflies! The season is drawing to a close, and the last 5+ butterflies we'll release will be "super generation" of monarchs that fly all the way to Mexico to reproduce, ensuring that future generations will return here next spring. These super monarchs live 8 times longer than their ancestors, and they fly about 50 miles a day until they reach their winter breeding grounds. We wish our monarchs well and look forward to meeting their descendants next spring.

**COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES**  
**August 11, 2026**

*(Minutes will be reviewed & approved at next Council meeting)*

**Call to Order.** President Kris Tobias called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM following a potluck dinner hosted by Pastor Jennifer.

**Attendance. Present:** Steve Bielefeldt, Pr. Jennifer Jelinek, Marcia Klemp, Connie Kreuser, Julie Leser, Amy Simdon, Richard Scott, John Jensen, Judy Heidebrecht, Janet Koepp, Kris Tobias.

**Absent:** Peggy Punsel, Kristin Rue.

**Devotions.** Janet presented a personal faith statement written for her granddaughter's confirmation, including selected verses from Psalm 27.

**Approval of Minutes.** John moved to approve the July meeting minutes. Amy seconded the motion. Unanimously approved by those who attended the July meeting.

**Approval of Agenda.** Judy moved to approve the agenda. John seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

**Correspondence.** None.

**Treasurer's Report.** (Amy) Our financial trends continue to follow the usual pattern. General giving, special giving, and expenses are all more than last year. We continue to be close to budgeted numbers. General giving through July was \$160,385; YTD special giving is \$15,229. Our YTD expenses through July of \$184,515 were \$6,154 more than last year and \$8,521 under budget. Julie moved to approve this report and send it to audit. John seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

**Pastor's Report.** The security breach of our directory information is an ongoing issue. Scam emails are being sent from a false account in Pastor's name, asking for gift cards or help with confidential problems. The congregation has been notified about this several times, with a caution to delete the emails and not respond in any way. On Aug. 16 Marian Korth will present a program on worship music, and we will dedicate the new baptismal font. There will be a healing service on Aug. 30 along with the blessing of quilts and kits. Confirmation and Sunday School will start in September.

**Committee Reports.** (Provided in writing and/or discussed in the meeting as needed.)

- Stewardship. The Edgerton newspaper recently featured an interview with Pr. Jennifer about the monarch butterfly project. Connie reported that St. Vinny's picked up most of the leftover items from the rummage sale on Aug. 10.

## Old Business.

- **Compliance & Security Task Force.** The committee has not met. Pastor addressed the data breach in her report above.
- **Wi-Fi Upgrade Project.** Kris reported on the completion of the project by GEEK POWERED. They did a nice job in one full day, tested everything, and the system is working well at good speed.
- **Eagle Scout project.** Sam Grender is awaiting further approval from the Boy Scout organization.
- **Rummage Sale.** Judy provided a summary of the sale organization and volunteer efforts. We accomplished significant community outreach by providing free shopping to food pantry and/or CART clients at the conclusion of the sale. The "Opportunities Closet" in Fort Atkinson received a generous donation of clothes and shoes. St. Mark's in Jefferson was given fabric and a box of boys' t-shirts and shorts. The total proceeds are \$2,000; and these are earmarked for local use. We discussed a distribution suggestion: \$650 for the food pantry, \$650 for CART, and \$700 for a Grace Lutheran mission project to be determined. John moved to approve this distribution. Amy seconded the motion. Unanimously approved. We also discussed inviting food pantry and CART representatives to come to church to discuss what they do and answer questions at the time we present them with checks. Until then the funds will be held in the special giving budget account.

## New Business.

**Oakland drainage plans.** Pastor received a phone call today from the Village of Oakland to notify us about planned work along Potter's Road and Grace Lane to improve drainage. It's unclear what the scope of the work will be, whether it involves grading, culverts, or other issues. Will the church be charged for anything? Will the parking lot continue to be accessible? Pastor will obtain a contact name and number to forward to the Property committee so that we can get more details and clarification.

**Adjournment.** Julie moved to adjourn the meeting. Amy seconded the motion. Unanimously approved. Meeting adjourned 7:45 PM, closing with the Lord's Prayer.

**Next Meeting.** Our next meeting will be Tuesday, September 8 at 7:00 PM (the day after Labor Day) and Kristin will present devotion.

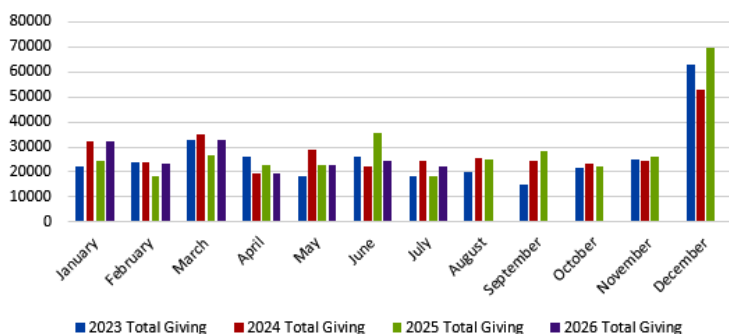

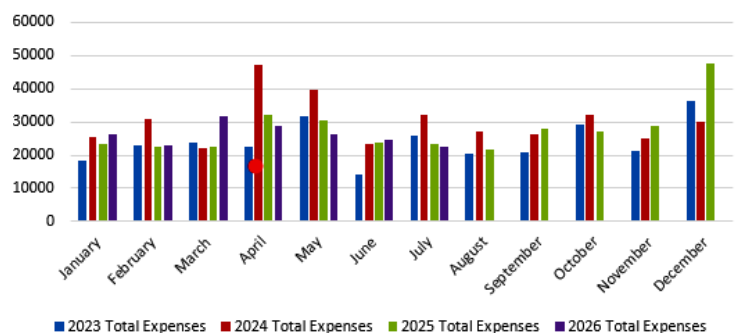
