The Outreach Committee has some special things planned for the Advent season: We will once again be selling Equal Exchange Fairly Traded chocolate, coffee, and tea in support of small farmers. This is a great opportunity to buy stocking stuffers, or a special treat for yourself.

We will also have our tree of Good Gifts with items ranging from chicks and goats to water filters and school uniforms. These will be given to people in faraway lands who need them.

And lastly, the ELCA has printed an interactive Advent calendar "A Stable Lamp is Lighted". It includes a prayer, hymn, or Scripture as well as a coloring activity for children to decorate a stable and add a character each day in December.

All of these things will be available in Fellowship Hall beginning November 30th.

GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES November 11, 2025

Call to Order. President Kelly Witte called the meeting to order at 7:02 PM.

Attendance. Present: Steve Bielefeldt, Pr. Jennifer Jelinek, John Jensen, Marcia Klemp, Connie Kreuser, Charlene Luchterhand, April Mickelson, Peggy Punsel, Kristin Rue, Richard Scott, Amy Simdon, Kelly Witte. **Absent:** Sandi Aston Hall.

Devotions. Marcia shared his faith journey and led us in prayer.

Approval of Minutes. John moved to approve the October meeting minutes. Peggy seconded the motion. Unanimously approved by those who attended the October meeting.

Approval of Agenda. John moved to approve the agenda. Amy seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Correspondence. None.

Treasurer's Report. (Amy) We had a net loss of \$4,769 in October, giving us a total loss of \$8,724 for the year. Our General Giving through October was \$197 less than 2024 and \$14,159 less than the 2025 budget. The Special Giving through October was \$6,757 less than last year and \$6,366 less than budget. If the sabbatical and Youth Gathering expenses are not included, the expenses through October were \$2,623 more than last year and we were \$12,149 under budget. The checking balance was \$9,067 less than the beginning of 2025 with the general fund balance approximately \$16,533 less. April moved to approve the treasurer's report and send it to audit. John seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Pastor's Report. We will be participating in the Community Thanksgiving Eve Service at 6:30 PM on Wednesday, November 26, at the Deerfield Lutheran Church. Worship will be followed by pie and fellowship. All are welcome. New congregation members will be received early in December. Committees are encouraged to start working on their annual reports, which need to be sent to Catherine by December 31.

Committee Reports. (Provided in writing and/or discussed in the meeting as needed.)

• **Education.** (Kristin) Still having issues with Wi-Fi in the basement. Back and side entrance doors are locked between 10:15 AM—11:00 AM during Sunday School hours.

- Outreach & Social Justice. (April) Clothing collection for the Madison Area Jail Ministry will begin immediately; collection deadline is November 23. 111 boxes of stuffing, 100 gravy packets and 2 jars of gravy have been donated for the food pantry. We may have a Fair Trade coffee/chocolate sale again. If so, an announcement will be made in the newsletter. Good Gifts catalogs are available near the mailboxes. Stewardship Committee has offered help wherever they are needed.
- **Stewardship.** (Connie) We are wrapping up the annual Stewardship appeal. Once the Time & Talent forms are returned, council members will be notified of anyone who has expressed an interest in their committee. Likewise, monetary commitments pledged will be reported for budget purposes.

Old Business.

• Church Property. (John & Richard)) Bank First has donated a table and filing cabinet for the conference room. They will donate 2 desks in the future. The heat (lack of) has now been fixed in the sanctuary. A bird's nest was removed from the exhaust fan. Tree trimmer has not come yet. Seeking bids for a different electrician to work on the lights in the parking lot.

New Business.

- Council Review of Committee Roles. Noted that the Operations Manual is from 2016 and in need of revision. Catherine will send an electronic version to all council members, who will suggest edits for their respective areas. In December, we will determine in what order we will review them for 2026.
- Lutheran Campus Ministry at UW-Madison. Received a request for financial support. Support in the amount of \$750 is already in our budget.
- **Use of Memorials.** Two outdoor benches are being considered for spring. We are also in need of a different basin for the baptismal font. The current basin is a prototype and not fully functional.
- **Budget.** Reviewed the 2026 draft budget that Amy prepared. Will look at it again for December's meeting.
- **Annual Meeting.** John moved that we hold our annual meeting on Sunday, January 25, 2026, after the worship service. Marcia seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.
- **Bake Sale**. (Connie) Ruth Circle will hold a Norwegian bake sale on December 7 before and after the worship service and before and after the Bell Crazy Handbell Performance. Proceeds will benefit the food pantry.

Adjournment. Amy moved to adjourn the meeting. Arilp seconded the motion. Unanimously approved. Meeting adjourned 8:01 PM. We ended with the Lord's Prayer.

Next Meeting. Our next meeting will be held on Tuesday, December 9, at 7:00 PM. Peggy is scheduled to present devotions.




