Pastor's Ponderings



Last week, I found myself at 2 funerals in 2 days – the funeral of a beloved Grace member and the father of a family friend. Both services were inspiring celebrations of the people we lost. Growing up with lots of extended family, I had many opportunities to go to weddings and funerals. I remember being shocked in seminary when I heard that some of my fellow

students had never attended a funeral. Imagine learning how to preside at a funeral when you'd never been to one before! And honestly, my kids haven't been to many funerals, and they assume funerals are awful to attend – someone has died, after all. But I've found that funerals, memorial services, and celebrations of life can be some of the most powerful, uplifting experiences. Those events give the opportunity for sharing memories and story-telling, which can be incredibly healing and inspiring for family, friends, and acquaintances. It's the perfect time for people to support one another, to celebrate, to cry together, and to laugh together more than you'd imagine. The warmth and hope you find at most funerals is amazing and profoundly faithaffirming.

Most of us don't want to be reminded of our mortality, but as Christians, we know that what awaits us after this life is even better than this one. So funerals are a time to help us remember and say goodbye, but even more importantly, they're a time to celebrate the person and to rejoice in the new life they've finally received. The promise and joy of resurrection and eternal life through Jesus' death and resurrection are most powerful to us as we say farewell to a loved one, knowing that they're now experiencing God's promises fulfilled.

If you've attended a lot of funerals, you know that often people give "memorials" for the deceased. If this is a new practice to you – families will often suggest a church, an organization, or a cause that was meaningful to the person who has died. And people will give money to that cause, to celebrate the memory of that person, to keep their memory alive. At Grace, we sometimes receive memorial donations for specific ministries – music, Sunday School, building improvement. And sometimes we're given the freedom to choose how to use memorial donations. Last month, we used Memorial funds to purchase a new bell that signals the beginning and end of worship. We also have an Endowment Fund, which invests other memorial funds over many years, These are just a few ways to remember and celebrate people who meant a lot to us. These are some of the many blessings we have as Christian community, walking together through the joys and sorrows of life, supporting one another, and celebrating the gift of new life when someone's earthly journey is over. May God continue to bless us as we strive to live faithfully in this life, reassured by the promise of the next.

GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

January 14, 2025

(Minutes below not approved until next Council meeting)

Call to Order. President Kelly Witte called the meeting to order at 7:05 p.m.

Attendance. Present: Sandi Aston Hall, Pr. Jennifer Jelinek, Charlene Luchterhand, April

Mickelson, Peggy Punsel, Kristin Rue, Amy Simdon, Shawn Whitman, Kelly Witte.

Absent: John Jensen, Bob Koepp, Connie Kreuser, Richard Scott

Devotions. Sandi shared devotions.

Approval of November Minutes. Sandi moved to approve the December minutes as written, Amy seconded the motion, and the minutes were unanimously approved by those who attended the December meeting.

Approval of Agenda. We added the topic of new carpet to New Business. Char moved to approve the amended agenda. Peggy seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Correspondence. We received a letter of thanks from Madison Area Jail Ministry for the Christmas cards that congregation members wrote.

Treasurer's Report. (Amy) We had a net gain of \$35,493.55 in December, giving us a total gain of \$21,939.65 for the year. \$10,992 of that gain was from unrealized gain on the endowment fund. God is so good! Our General Giving for 2024 was \$12,327 higher than 2023 and \$14,990 over the 2024 budget. The 2024 Special Giving was \$2,117 more than last year and \$17,416 more than budget. Our year-to-date expenses were \$72,806 more than last year and \$30,5689 over budget due to the one-time expenses of the sabbatical, Youth Gathering and the door project. The checking balance was \$22,360 more than at the end of November with the general fund balance approximately \$19,101 more. Sandi moved to approve this treasurer's report and send it to audit. April seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Pastor's Report. Pastor thanked committee chairs who completed their annual reports. She will remind chairs earlier next year about this task, as these reports need to be included in the congregational annual report, which is distributed to members a week prior to the annual meeting. Lois Everson's funeral will be held this coming Saturday. A number of new students have joined Sunday School this year. Their parents will be invited to learn more about our church while the students are in class. Our synod's annual LEAD conference this year will be held on Saturday, February 22 at New Heights Lutheran Church facility, The Grove, in Mazomanie. The event is for rostered and lay leaders of the church to gather for worship, fellowship, and learning. [Sandi and Shawn expressed interest in attending.] An update regarding Erik Jelinek's health: a new phase of a clinical trial, which he had hoped to participate in last year, has opened up, and he appears eligible. The medication is promising with few side effects. This will require frequent trips to Detroit. Various family members and friends will accompany him to Detroit, with Pr. Jennifer doing so occasionally.

Committee Reports. (Provided in writing and/or discussed in the meeting as needed.)

- Education. (Kristin) The children's Christmas program was wonderful. We heard lots
 of great comments. Sunday School started back up this past Sunday after our holiday break.
- Property. (Peggy for John & Richard) Property Committee has explored reasons for the chilly temperatures in the sanctuary on some Sundays. The bottom line is that we need a new thermostat. They are in the process of obtaining estimates for a smart thermostat, which would allow Pr. Jennifer to turn on the heat from her phone at home.
- Outreach & Social Justice. (April) We are currently collecting snack items to include in Blue Jay backpacks, which will be distributed the end of this month.

Old Business.

- Communion Rail Cushions. Two sources were explored. 1) Connie contacted St. Olaf Church to learn about their cushions. They suggested she contact carpet stores, and she has calls in to three local stores. 2) Richard contacted Pete Zehren of Heirloom Furniture Repair in Jefferson at Peggy's recommendation. Char, John, and Richard met with Pete in the church sanctuary. He appears knowledgeable and personable. A rough estimate would be around \$321.50 \$452.50 per completed cushion, depending on firmness of foam and cost of fabric chosen. We would have 10 cushions. During our council meeting, we tested a number of foam samples for firmness and agreed on the \$108 option. We will continue to pursue working with Pete. The next step is to select a number of fabric samples to see in person. Char is heading up this process.
- **Update on Personal Safety Task Force.** A couple people have agreed to be on this task force. Additional members are being identified. An initial meeting will be held soon.

New Business.

- Agenda for the Congregational Annual Meeting. Pastor shared a typical agenda. We discussed items to include. Sandi moved to approve the agenda as presented by Pastor and discussed. Shawn seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.
- **New Carpet for the Basement**. Now that the basement has been painted and the leak issue resolved, new carpet is needed. Kristin will reach out to John and Richard about this.

Adjournment. Shawn moved to adjourn the meeting. Sandi seconded the motion. Unanimously approved. Meeting adjourned at 8:22 PM. We ended with the Lord's Prayer.

Next Meeting. Our next meeting will be in February at a date and time to be determined.




From the Treasurer
