Pastor's Ponderings

Happy New Year! As we enter 2025, we pray that God may bless us with faith, health, and joy. In worship this winter and spring, our readings will come from Luke's Gospel. So I thought it might be helpful to share some things that make Luke's Gospel unique.

"Luke" wasn't a first-hand witness of Jesus' ministry. He was a physician who was connected to Jesus' apostles, particularly Paul. He knew others had written about Jesus' life, but his goal was to share "an orderly account" of Jesus' life, putting the events of Jesus' life in order. Where other Gospel-writers were obviously from Jewish backgrounds, it's believed that Luke was a Gentile. He writes not only to Jewish Christians, but to Gentile Christians, who aren't aware of Jewish traditions and promise of the Messiah.

It's only in Luke where we hear the Christmas story, with Mary and Joseph's travels to Bethlehem, where there was no room in the inn, so baby Jesus was born and laid in a manger. Luke's Gospel contains many parables, including the most famous Parables of the Good Samaritan and the Prodigal Son. Clearly, Luke saw the importance of people learning through the power of story. It seems that Luke also saw the importance of Jesus' ministry surrounding food and feasts. He included several parables about banquets, and he wrote about no less than 19 meals Jesus shared with people, often people others objected to.

Those people others objected to are also a focus of Luke's Gospel. Luke focuses deeply on Jesus' ministry to the excluded, the outcast, and the marginalized. Jesus is often seen reaching out to society's rejects, like tax collectors, Gentiles, the poor, and women. And Jesus talks more frequently about salvation in Luke's Gospel. Several times, Jesus tells people that their faith has saved them.

In Luke, there's an emphasis on the work of the Holy Spirit – in Jesus' conception, at Jesus' baptism, in Jesus' ministry, as well as Jesus offering the Holy Spirit to those who asked for it. So it makes sense that it's Luke who wrote a sequel to his Gospel – the Acts of the Apostles, which speaks of the coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost, and follows the Apostles as they share the Gospel across the known world, led by the Holy Spirit.

In this New Year, we invite you to join us in worship as we journey through Luke's Gospel, experiencing the welcome and celebrations, the stories of salvation, and the wonders of the Holy Spirit together.

Help Fill Our Blue Jay Backpacks!

Our local Food Pantry has reached out to area churches to help provide snacks for K-5 children in the Cambridge School District. We will be attempting to fill 30 "backpacks" with 16+ snacks in the month of January. This program aims to ensure that students who may be experiencing food insecurity have access to meals during weekends and holidays when school is closed. Ideally each backpack should include 8 meal items, 8 breakfast items, and 8 snack items. Food items that are GREAT for the Blue Jay Backpack Program include:

- Individual Fruit Cups
- Ramen Noodles
- Microwavable soups
- Microwavable pasta meals i.e. Ravioli/spaghettios
- Individual Grits or Oatmeal Packets
- Granola Bars
- Small Boxes of Cereal (individual servings)
- Mac-n-Cheese (microwavable, individual servings)
- Individually wrapped snacks (peanut butter crackers, cheez-its, pudding cups, cookies, etc.

Our Sundays for collecting food items will include January 5, 12, and the 19 so we can assemble the backpacks for pick up by January 22.

If you cannot get out and shop, we will do the shopping for you. Just write a check, make a Venmo or Vanco donation and we will do the rest. Please be sure to write Blue Jay Backpack in the memo line so it goes to the right place! We need all donations in by January 19.

GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

December 10, 2024

(Minutes below not approved until next Council meeting)

Call to Order. President Kelly Witte called the meeting to order at 7:06 p.m.

Attendance. Present: Sandi Aston Hall, Pr. Jennifer Jelinek, John Jensen, Bob Koepp, Connie Kreuser, Charlene Luchterhand, April Mickelson, Peggy Punsel, Richard Scott, Amy Simdon, Shawn Whitman, Kelly Witte. **Absent:** Kristin Rue.

Devotions. John and Richard shared devotions.

Approval of November Minutes. Amy moved to approve the November minutes as written, Sandi seconded the motion, and the minutes were unanimously approved by those who attended the November meeting.

Approval of Agenda. We added the topic of our annual congregational meeting to New Business. Peggy moved to approve the amended agenda. John seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Correspondence. We received a letter of thanks from Lutheran World Relief for funds donated by our members.

Treasurer's Report. (Amy) We had a net loss of \$392.60 in November and a net loss of \$13,584.75 for the year. Our year-to-date (YTD) General Giving at the end of November was \$15,560 higher than 2023 and \$3,644 under the YTD budget. YTD Special Giving was \$9,177 more than last year and \$7,784 more than budget. Our YTD expenses were \$78,976 more than last year. If we didn't include our one-time expenses of the sabbatical, Youth Gathering and the door project, our expenses would be \$9,350 more than last year. We are \$27,912 over our budget due to those same one-time expenses. The checking balance was \$665 less than at the end of October with the general fund balance approximately \$2,157 more. John moved to approve this treasurer's report and send it to audit. Peggy seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Pastor's Report. The children's Christmas program will be held this coming Sunday during the worship service. Also the Ruth Circle and the youth will be holding a bake sale including Scandinavian treats that day. Most of the proceeds will be sent to Lutheran World Relief to aid those affected by hurricanes. The church will be open Wednesday, December 18, from 3:00 – 8:00 PM for anyone who would like to stop in for prayer, meditation, or to talk. Christmas season services include: Christmas Eve worship at both 3 PM and 5 PM, Tuesday, December 24; Christmas Day worship at 10 AM on Wednesday, December 25; and lessons and carols at 9 AM on Sunday, December 29. Pastor will be on vacation from December 27 through January 5. Brenda Lovick will preside over the worship service on January 5. Pastor Jennifer will give Catherine the name of an area pastor who will be oncall in the event of an emergency during her absence.

Pastor commended our congregation for being a welcoming one to all and solicited the council's thoughts on this. We agreed that if a visitor were to ask for money, members need not feel obligated to help personally. A visitor can be directed to the Cambridge Area Resource Team (CART). If someone wants to sell something for personal gain, they will be told that this is not allowed at our church.

Committee Reports. (Provided in writing and/or discussed in the meeting as needed.)

- **Education.** (Kristin) The children's Christmas program will be held this coming Sunday during the worship service.
- **Hospitality.** (Peggy) The committee met with new members. They discussed and agreed to buy items in bulk to save money because of increases in coffee hour expenditures.
- Outreach & Social Justice. (April) On Sundays, the committee is selling Equal Exchange Fairly Traded products at cost and encourages members to purchase ELCA Good Gifts items to support churchwide ministries across the globe. The next project will be to collect snack items to include in Blue Jay backpacks in January.

Sabbatical Team Report. (Bob) Bob received feedback from five people for the congregational portion of the report to Lilly Endowment Inc., the foundation that supported Pastor's sabbatical. He welcomes feedback from others yet. The goal is to complete the report by the end of 2024.

- Old Business.
 - **2025 Budget.** Amy shared the revised budget, focusing especially on Pastor's compensation package. John moved that we accept the proposed budget. Sandi seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.
- **Church Bell.** Karen Johnson explored the availability of refurbished bells. We should be able to purchase one for roughly \$700. Char moved that we authorize Karen to spend up to \$1000 for a bell and postage to deliver it and to use memorial funds for this purpose. Shawn seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.
- **Communion Rail Cushions.** Pastor Jennifer learned from Michael Rehak that the company that made the cushions for our pews is no longer in business. A task force of Char, Connie, John, and Peggy will explore options for sources for these cushions.

New Business.

• Congregational Annual Meeting. We set the date for Sunday, January 26. Each committee will need to submit a report to Catherine by the end of 2024. Hospitality will take care of gifts for staff.

Adjournment. April moved to adjourn the meeting. Amy seconded the motion. Unanimously approved. Meeting adjourned at 8:08 PM. We ended with the Lord's Prayer.

Next Meeting. Our next meeting will be held on Tuesday, January 14 at 7:00 PM. Sandi is scheduled to present devotions.




From the Treasurer
