How was your holiday season? Were you able to spend time with family and friends? Was there any stress or tension around the dinner table? Any topics or conversations you chose to avoid? Did you leave, wishing there was something you could do to reduce the tension and improve those relationships? Then you're not alone.

There are so many things in our world that divide us from one another – politics, religion, distance, values, beliefs, and more. Sometimes it's a matter of different life experiences, different cultural backgrounds, different education, different dreams and goals. Sometimes it seems easiest to stick with people who have similar beliefs, rather than deal with those who we disagree with. But if we only hang around people who are similar to us, we miss the richness of diversity others bring. But how do we engage with people who have such different views and lives? How do we relate to people and work for healing in this time of difference and division? How can we make a difference in the world when we don't know where to start?

On Monday nights this month, we're going to explore those questions in a study called "The Difference Course." This course encourages us to "Be Curious, Be Present, and Reimagine" so we can cross divides, navigate disagreements, and pursue a just and flourishing world. This course includes video clips, activities, Bible study, and discussions so we can learn and practice what we learn together.

Even if you've never come to a Monday night study, we invite you to come check out "The Difference" this month, and feel free to bring a friend. The Difference Course will be held on Monday nights from 6:45-8:15 p.m., starting January 14.

GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES December 9, 2025

(Minutes will be reviewed & approved at next Council meeting)

Call to Order. President Kelly Witte called the meeting to order at 7:04 PM.

Attendance. Present: Steve Bielefeldt, Pr. Jennifer Jelinek, John Jensen, Marcia Klemp, Charlene Luchterhand, April Mickelson, Peggy Punsel, Kristin Rue, Richard Scott, Amy Simdon, Kelly Witte. **Absent:** Sandi Aston Hall, Connie Kreuser

Devotions. Peggy shared her faith journey and Kelly led us in prayer.

Approval of Minutes. Kristin moved to approve the November meeting minutes. John seconded the motion. Unanimously approved by those who attended the November meeting.

Approval of Agenda. Peggy moved to add Funeral Discussion to New Business. Marcia seconded the motion. Char moved to postpone the topic of Council Review of Committee Roles to January, when we can meet in person. John seconded the motion. Char moved to amend the agenda as proposed. Kristin seconded the motion. All three motions were unanimously approved.

Correspondence. None.

Treasurer's Report. (Amy) We had a net loss of \$2,577 in November, giving us a total loss of \$11,301 for the year. Our General Giving through November was \$20 more than 2024 and \$14,186 under the 2025 budget. The Special Giving through November was \$5,215 less than last year and \$6,598 less than budget. If the sabbatical and Youth Gathering expenses are not included, the expenses through November were \$546 more than last year and we were \$10,092 under budget. The checking balance was \$11,647 less than the beginning of 2025 with the general fund balance approximately \$16,353 less. Peggy moved to approve the treasurer's report and send it to audit. Marcia seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

• Pastor's Report. All are invited to a festive Diner's Delight potluck dinner at church on Friday, December 12 at 6:00 PM. During the worship service on Sunday, December 14, the children will present their Christmas program and new members will be received. Education. (Kristin) Still having issues with Wi-Fi in the basement. Back and side entrance doors are locked between 10:15 AM—11:00 AM during Sunday School hours. On Tuesday, December 16, our church will host a community event, Beer and Carols, from 6:30-8:30 PM at the Cambridge Taphouse.

Christmas worship service times will be the same as last year: Christmas Eve 3:00 and 5:00 PM and Christmas Day 10:00 AM. Pastor will be leaving on vacation right after that and returning on January 3. December 28 will be our annual Christmas carols/lessons and cookies Sunday. Brenda Lovick will fill in for Pr. Jennifer on January 4.

Committee Reports. (Provided in writing and/or discussed in the meeting as needed.)

- **Education.** (Kristin) Still struggling to get good Wi-Fi reception in the basement. Wondering if we have a floor cleaner that we can use to clean the water stain on the carpet in the basement? The Sunday School kids have been working hard on their Christmas program. Rehearsal will be this Saturday, December 13, from 4:00 7:00 PM. The program will be presented during worship service this Sunday, December 14.
- **Evangelism.** (Marcia) Last month Marcia and Pr. Jennifer met with five potential new members. Neil Johnson has created Grace Lutheran logo ornaments intended for new members. Peggy and Marcia are collaborating to integrate Hospitality with Evangelism initiatives.
- Outreach & Social Justice. (April) Pat Northey, Judy Heidebrecht and Jenny Horgan-Geis sorted, bagged, and delivered all the clothing, shoes and personal items donated for the Madison Area Jail Ministry-about 20 large bags. We received a very gracious thank you letter from Paul Hundt, Committee Chair, Madison Area Jail Ministry Friends.
- **Stewardship.** (Connie) Time/talents/treasure reports will be reviewed in January. Then committee chairs will receive names of people that show a possible interest in joining their committee.

Old Business.

- **Church Property.** (John & Richard)) We now have new lights in the parking lot. Outdoor trees have been trimmed and one cut down. An outdated sign was removed.
- Council Review of Committee Roles. Postponed until we can meet in person.
- **Budget**. John moved to approve the proposed 2026 budget and submit it to the congregation at the annual meeting in January. Peggy seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.
- **Memorials.** Kelly shared two options (glass and pottery) for a baptismal font bowl to replace the non-functional prototype currently in use. To be discussed in the future.

New Business.

• Funeral Discussion. Received a request from the funeral committee to purchase new salad/dessert forks. We will explore this request further.

Adjournment. Amy moved to adjourn the meeting. John seconded the motion. Unanimously approved. Meeting adjourned 7:45 PM. We ended with the Lord's Prayer.

Next Meeting. Our next meeting will be held on Tuesday, January 13, at 7:00 PM. John and Richard are scheduled to present devotions.




