# GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES November 12, 2024

(Minutes will be reviewed & approved at next Council meeting)

Call to Order. President Kelly Witte called the meeting to order at 7:03 PM.

**Attendance. Present:** Pr. Jennifer Jelinek, Bob Koepp, Connie Kreuser, Charlene Luchterhand, April Mickelson, Kristin Rue, Richard Scott, Amy Simdon, Shawn Whitman, Kelly Witte. **Absent:** Sandi Aston Hall, John Jensen, Pegay Punsel.

**Devotions.** Char shared devotions.

**Approval of Minutes.** Amy moved to approve the October meeting minutes. Kristin seconded the motion. Unanimously approved by those who attended the October meeting.

**Approval of Agenda**. Amy moved to approve the agenda. Char seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

**Correspondence.** We received a letter inviting us to apply for a grant from our synod's Endowment Fund. The purpose of the fund is to "foster innovation that leads to creative, financially sustainable ministries that enhance God's mission" in our area.

**Treasurer's Report.** (Amy) Both giving and expenses were higher, with three payrolls this month. We had a net loss of \$8,668.58 in October and a net loss of \$13,103.85 for the year. Our year-to-date (YTD) General Giving at the end of October was \$15,652 higher than 2023 and \$4,378 under the YTD budget. YTD Special Giving was \$9,504 more than last year and \$8,724 more than budget. Our YTD expenses were \$75,427 more than last year. If we didn't include our one-time expenses of the sabbatical, Youth Gathering and the door project our expenses would be \$5,800 more than last year. We are \$30,492 over our budget due to those same one-time expenses. The checking balance was \$678 less than at the end of September with the general fund balance approximately \$9,174 less. Historically our congregation has been generous at the end of the year. We are optimistic this trend will continue. At this time there is no need to do anything more regarding church finances. Char moved to approve this treasurer's report and send it to audit. Richard seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Pastor's Report. Thanks to the Property Committee for installing motion-sensored lights in the lower level. Despite Pr. Jennifer's urging, an ecumenical Thanksgiving service will not be held. Possibly a summer ecumenical event will be held this summer at Lake Ripley Park. Willerup Church is again offering the Bethlehem Experience December 21 and 22. Our congregation is invited to help with this immersive experience. Peggy Punsel is our church's liaison. One of our confirmation students will be baptized the night before Thanksgiving. About a dozen people came to the church on election day. This prompted a discussion about opening the church building at other times of the year for prayer and meditation.

#### **Baptism**

Committee Reports. (Provided in writing and/or discussed in the meeting as needed.)

**Education.** (Kristin) Committee is identifying meaningful options for the use of children's Sunday School offerings. Children's Christmas program will be Sunday December 15 during church service. Some confirmation students and mentors will help finish painting downstairs for their confirmation service projects. Workdays are November 16 and 17.

**Outreach & Social Justice.** (April) Our congregation donated over 200 cans of green beans for the Food Pantry Thanksgiving dinners and is currently collecting cream of mushroom soup for the Food Pantry holiday dinners. Any additional funds donated will be used to purchase paper items needed by the Food Pantry.

**Stewardship.** (Connie) After three consecutive weeks of "temple talks", the pledge drive wrapped up on November 10, with the congregation bringing in pledge cards and time/talent sheets. Ideas to promote during Advent to help Cambridge area residents: 1) Donating dish and laundry soaps, canned goods, pasta and rice as well as paper products to the Food Pantry; 2) Asking for Piggly Wiggly receipts when shopping; 3) Providing a handout for family activities during Advent season.

**Sabbatical Team Report.** (Bob) Bob handed out a list of questions to solicit council feedback for the congregational portion of the report to Lilly Endowment Inc, the foundation that supported Pastor's sabbatical. The goal is to complete the report by the end of 2024.

#### Old Business.

**Doors**. Fund-raising closure. \$10,713, more than anticipated, was donated for the front door project. We will close fund-raising and thank members for their generosity.

**2025 Budget.** Amy handed out a draft 2025 budget proposal. Details were reviewed and discussed. She will obtain the cost of Pastor's health insurance and continue to tweak the budget. We will review the revised version at our December meeting.

#### New Business.

**Communion Rail Cushions.** Char suggested we consider purchasing kneeling cushions for around the communion rail. This would be easier on knees and Pastor's back as she would not need to bend down so far. There was general agreement. We will explore possible sources and costs and discuss further when we have more information.

**Church Bell.** The church bell has been sounding "off." Karen Johnson found a crack in it. A new one would cost a minimum of \$600. Richard moved that we authorize Karen to find a new bell and let us know the cost. April seconded the motion. Unanimously approved. We plan to use memorial funds to purchase it.

**Sunday School Offerings.** Brainstormed options for the use of Sunday School offerings that would have meaning to the students.

**Adjournment.** Richard moved to adjourn the meeting. Amy seconded the motion. Unanimously approved. Meeting adjourned at 8:47 PM. We ended with the Lord's Prayer.

**Next Meeting.** Our next meeting will be held on Tuesday, December 10 at 7:00 PM. John and Richard are scheduled to present devotions.




