Pastors' Ponderings



At our last Sabbatical Committee Meeting, Bob shared with us an article from Living Lutheran – Jan. 14, 2022. It spoke about the challenges we all face after Covid and how the church can especially be a spiritual community and resource to communities. Author Meghan Johnston-Aelabouni says, "Contemplative practices offer just such a resource for people who are weary, overwhelmed or simply searching for something more – a different way to encounter God in a

time when so much is suddenly different."

Those words speak eloquently to our Sabbatical theme for August – Reflection. And it offers us a pathway to contemplative practices that may deepen our faith and strengthen our outreach. Such practices include silent meditation, centering prayer, walking a labyrinth, or yoga.

You may be familiar with some of these practices. While we don't have space to go into all of them in detail, we certainly invite you to share your practices and learn about others.

Today we want to focus on just one of the practices – the Labyrinth. That is one that is very special to Loren and me. A good number of years ago, now, we served a congregation that caught a vision of how a labyrinth could enhance our faith journey. After months of study and planning, a group of parishioners met and built the labyrinth on a Sunday afternoon. Members from 3 years old to 70 joined together. Since then, a beautiful Prayer Garden has been added and the congregation welcomes the community to enjoy a "prayer walk."

The first thing to know about the labyrinth is that it definitely is not a maze. You can't get lost. Take a look at the labyrinth included in this newsletter. Use a pencil or your finger and follow the path. It leads into the center and back out again. This labyrinth and many Christian labyrinths are based on the one in the Chartes Cathedral in France. It consists of 11 concentric circles that wind their way to the center and back out.

To walk a labyrinth is to take a walk with God. Let me share some thoughts about the labyrinth from East Immanuel Lutheran Church's labyrinth brochure. "Walking the labyrinth can be an active way of praying. The walk involves our bodies as we physically move along the path, our minds as we meditate on scripture or prayers, and our spirits as we are led by God's Spirit. The path of the labyrinth is like our journey through life, with many twists, turns, and returns. We do not get lost on this path because it always leads to the center which brings us closer to a spiritual home – the heart of God."



Sabbatical at Grace—A Time of Renewal

The sabbatical theme for August—Reflection, Meditation, Contemplation--provides another opportunity for many of us to try something new. Have you ever walked a Labyrinth as a way of finding a quiet space and frame of mind for prayer or meditation or just for calmness and peace?

The Labyrinth looks like a maze, doesn't it—but it's actually very different from a maze in



consider the inner circle to be your quiet spot, away from all the noise and disruption of everyday life. Or think of your walking the Labyrinth as Christians of the Middle Ages thought of this exercise, as a symbolic pilgrimage to a holy place, a spiritual place where one might find a special opportunity to encounter God through prayerful reflection.

When Pastor Jennifer travels to the Scottish Isle of Iona for her time of retreat, she will find a Labyrinth outside the grounds of the Benedictine Abbey where she'll be staying, and chances are good she'll walk it. (See https://guideposts.org/positive-living/ entertainment/travel/12-prayer-labyrinths-from-around-the-world/) In mid-August a Labyrinth will come to Grace Lutheran for a few days, and we'll then have a chance to engage in 'walking meditation' in a similar way, following in our pastor's footsteps, in a sense. Some of us have done this walk before, or have used a similar 'tool' for meditation or prayer. We encourage you, as you learn more about Labyrinths in the month ahead, to take this walk too.

GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES June 18, 2024

(Minutes will be reviewed & approved at next Council meeting)

Call to Order. President Kelly Witte called the meeting to order at 7:02 PM.

Attendance. Present: John Jensen, Bob Koepp, Connie Kreuser, Charlene Luchterhand, April Mickelson, Peggy Punsel, Kristin Rue, Pr. Linda Schumacher, Pr. Loren Schumacher, Amy Simdon, Shawn Whitman, Kelly Witte. Absent: Sandi Aston Hall, Pr. Jennifer Jelinek, Richard Scott.

Devotions. Connie led devotions.

Approval of Minutes. John moved to approve the May meeting minutes. Amy seconded the motion. Unanimously approved by those who attended the May meeting.

Approval of Agenda. The agenda was amended to remove the Correspondence section and two items from Old Business that have been completed. One item was added to Old Business and one to New Business. Peggy moved to approve the amended agenda. John seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Correspondence. None

Treasurer's Report. (Amy) We had a net loss of \$11,017.92 in May, however year-to-date (YTD) we still have a net income of \$7,154.73. Our YTD General Giving at the end of May was \$6,311 higher than 2023 and \$5,217 over the YTD budget. YTD Special Giving was \$4,280 more than last year and over \$5,850 more than budget. Our YTD expenses were \$45,593 more than last year. If we didn't include our one-time expenses of the sabbatical, Youth Gathering and the door project our expenses would be almost the same as last year. We are \$27,526 over our budget due to those same one-time expenses. YTD net ordinary income would be about -\$9,482 if the sabbatical grant and expenses are not included. This is about \$15,525 less than last year at the end of May. The checking balance decreased by about \$18,000 with the general fund balance decreasing by approximately \$4,675. The larger expenses in May were taken out of designated funds for the Building Fund, Sabbatical and Youth Gathering. We also have money invested in CDs that will mature soon and be deposited into the checking account (Building \$10,636.72 & Sabbatical \$7,500). Char moved to approve this treasurer's report and send it to audit. John seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Pastor's Report. (Prs. Linda & Loren) The Pastors' usual office hours will be Mondays 9 AM – 11 AM and Thursdays or Fridays 10 AM – noon. They are also available as needed by the congregation. They will be incorporating the three sabbatical themes into their sermons.

Committee Reports. (Provided in writing and/or discussed in the meeting as needed.) Education. (Kristin) Vacation Bible School planning is in progress.

Outreach & Social Justice. (April) Items are being collected by the congregation for Lutheran World Relief baby care kits.

Stewardship. (Connie) The pollinator garden has been planted. Project complete, except for watering as needed. See "Letter of Thanks" in New Business.

Sabbatical Team Report. (Bob) In July the congregation will focus on opportunities to engage. Vacation Bible School will be held July 15-18. It was suggested that we encourage adults in the congregation to come and observe. There will be a sending service on July 14 for individuals who will be attending the ELCA Youth and Young Adult Gathering in New Orleans. They will share their thoughts and experiences during the service on July 28. It was suggested that those going be paired with adults from the congregation as prayer partners during this time. This month is also an ideal time to prayerfully think about our roles at church. What might we do to contribute? We will add Pr. Jennifer to our prayer list.

The theme for August will be reflection. Planning is underway and will focus on contemplation and meditation. There may be an introduction to labyrinth walking. The team is considering another music-focused worship service on August 18.

Old Business. Church Picnic. The potluck picnic will be held on Sunday, June 23. Worship will be indoors. Andrew Punsel will grill brats and hotdogs. Volunteers were recruited to help set up tables and chairs outdoors.

Retirement Party. As previously approved by our council, Pr. Jennifer will host her husband Erik's retirement party at our church on the afternoon of Saturday, June 29. The Jelinek family will take care of everything. Nothing is required of us.

New Business. Letter of Thanks. Kelly was asked to sign a letter written by the Stewardship Committee thanking community member Georgia Gomez-Ibanez for her expertise and generous time commitment in helping to establish the pollinator garden.

Ideas for Realigning Duties. Ideas were shared for possibly lightening Pr. Jennifer's workload by congregation members assuming some activities that she typically handles. The topic was tabled until a future meeting when we can learn her preferences.

Adjournment. Amy moved to adjourn the meeting. Kristin seconded the motion. Unanimously approved. Meeting adjourned at 8:30 PM. We ended with the Lord's Prayer.

Next Meeting. We will not hold a meeting in July. Our next meeting will be held on Tuesday, August 13 at 7:00 PM. Shawn is scheduled to present devotions.




