Pastor's Ponderings



Dear Friends,

Just over a year ago, when COVID quarantine began, I boldly (and foolishly) declared that whenever we were all able to regather for worship again, we'd celebrate Easter. I envisioned a June 2020 Easter celebration with a couple hundred people. **But...** here we are, a year later, still unable to all gather together in 1 place to celebrate Jesus' resurrection.

This year has been filled with things like, "**But...**" We'd planned that vacation for a year, **but...** we had to cancel it. Couples had dreamed and planned weddings, **but...** many had to postpone. Businesses tried to be resilient, **but...** many ended up closing. Many people were careful and wore masks, **but...** they got COVID anyway. Throughout COVID, that "**but...**" has been a pain in the... neck.

But... That word is especially appropriate during Holy Week. Just think about it. On Sunday, Jesus was welcomed into Jerusalem with palms and shouts of "Hosanna!" **but...** by Thursday, the authorities were out to get him. At the Last Supper, Jesus gave his body and blood to all 12 of his disciples, **but...** Judas still betrayed him, Peter still denied him, and the others still abandoned him. Jesus was innocent of all the charges against him, **but...** he was crucified anyway.

But... that's not the end of the story. There's 1 more **but...** that brings us hope in our hopelessness, light in our darkness, life amid death. Jesus was crucified, died, and was buried, **BUT...** he rose from the dead that Easter morning, victoriously defeating the power of sin and the power of death.

Yes, we've lived a year filled with words like, "Quarantine," "No," and "But..." We've had to postpone, sacrifice, and let go of things and even people who have meant a lot to us. We haven't been able to gather by the hundreds to celebrate Easter in the Sanctuary, nor will we this Easter. **But...** none of that can diminish the joy, the hope, the new life that Easter brings us, regardless of where we celebrate it. Jesus was crucified, **but...** he rose from the dead for us. Nothing can change that. We will always have reason to rejoice. COVID has been a challenge, **but...** it hasn't defeated us. We have a God who defeated death for us and has strengthened us through our struggles. We are Easter people, my friends. And just like we've found creative ways to worship, learn, socialize, and celebrate together, we'll keep doing that, no "Ifs, Ands, or **Buts**".

In-Person Worship open to 50 people

Because COVID numbers continue to decline while vaccinations increase, Grace's Church Council has now opened in-person worship to up to 50 people per service. To worship at any indoor service at Grace, you must sign up ahead of time.

How do I sign up to attend worship in-person?

All sign-ups are due by Noon 2 days before the worship service.

Masks are required, and there will be no congregational singing.

Maundy Thursday – April 1

On “the night in which he was betrayed,” we will take time to remember Jesus’ Last Supper with his disciples, as well as sharing that meal. There will be a **Maundy Thursday Worship** service at **7:00 p.m.** (broadcast and limited in-person attendance). If you want to worship in person, you must sign up on Sign-Up Genius or by calling Virginia Becker by March

30. If you’re not comfortable coming to in-person worship but would like some reflection time in the Sanctuary, we’ll have **Holy Week Reflection Time** between **4:00-6:30 p.m.** There will be prayer stations, contemplative music, and the opportunity to receive communion (to take there or to save to commune during the broadcast at 7:00 p.m.)



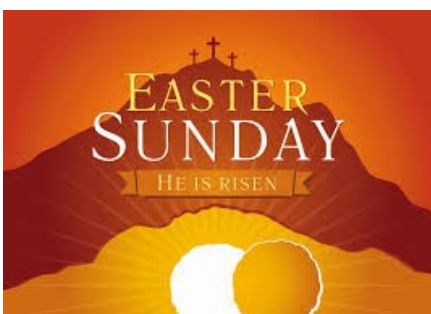
Good Friday – April 2

*The **Community Good Friday Service** will be held at **Noon** in **Veterans’ Park** and is open to everyone. This year’s service will be stay in 1 place, so feel free to bring a lawn chair or even stay in your car and listen to the service on your radio.

*Our **Good Friday Tenebrae Service** will be held at Grace at **7:00 p.m.** (broadcast & limited in-person attendance). If you want to worship in person, you must sign up on Sign-Up Genius or by calling Virginia Becker by March 31.

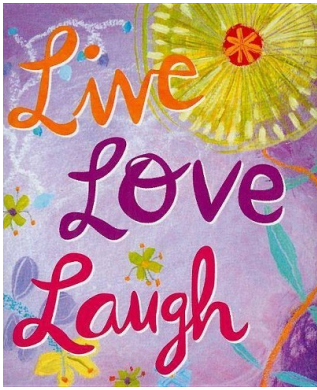
Easter Sunday Worship—April 4th



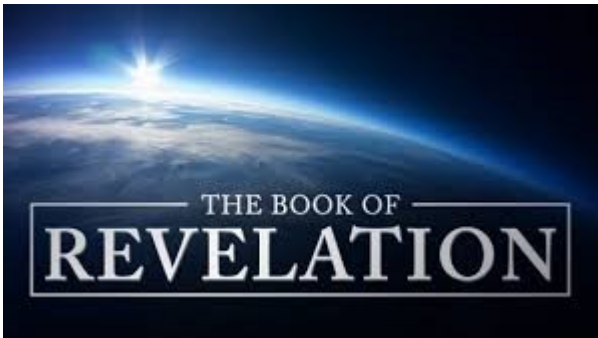

Communion will be served at the end of the service.

In addition, we’re offering an **Easter Parking Lot Service** at **10:00 a.m.** Join us in your car, listen on your car radio (or through our outdoor speakers) as we celebrate Jesus’ resurrection.

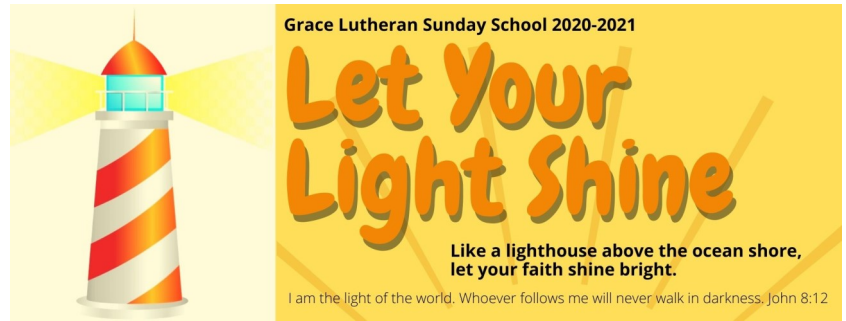

Grace Lutheran's Lenten Challenge 2021

Our focus this year is on Hunger in the world. There are always hungry people in the world, but with the worldwide COVID crises the situation has gotten dramatically worse for many.



"Around the world, 690 million people regularly go to bed hungry, according to a report from the United Nations food agencies. Estimates suggest that an additional 83 million to 132 million more people will be chronically hungry due to the pandemic." *(World Vision)*

"Every year, 2.6 million children die as a result of hunger-related causes. In the U.S., nearly 16 million children — one in five — live in households that struggle to put food on the table." *(Bread for the World)*

What can your dollars do for the Hungry? *(examples from: ELCA Good Gifts Catalog)*

- \$ 25 can provide nutritious food for an orphan for one month
- \$ 50 can feed a refugee family for one week
- \$ 250 can establish a community fish farm
- \$ 10 can fill a backpack for a food-insecure child in the US
- \$ 20 can provide 10 hot meals at a US soup kitchen

Here's a challenge:

- *choose any day during Lent to have a "rice bowl dinner"
- *cook 1/2 cup of rice with 1 cup of water and a little salt
- *let this be your food for the day in solidarity with those who don't have anything else to eat
- *pray for the hungry and consider giving to alleviate their suffering

MEETING MINUTES

March 9, 2021 Via Zoom from Home

(Minutes below aren't approved until next month's meeting)

Call to Order: Meeting called to order by President Steve Geis at 7:32 p.m.

Attendance: Steve Geis, Tim Neuenschwander, Amanda Kosanda, Tom Kosanda, Jean Scott, Mary Behling, Ann Engelstad, Kari Jermain, Jennifer Hellberg, Shawn Whitman, Kris Tobias, and Pastor Jennifer Jelinek.

Devotions: Shawn Whitman offered devotions and Pastor Jennifer offered a prayer to open the meeting.

Approval of February Minutes: Jean Scott moved to approve the Minutes for the regular February meeting as written, Tim Neuenschwander seconded and they were unanimously approved.

Consent Agenda: Jean Scott noted that the Outreach Committee met and sent out envelopes for the Lenten Challenge which is focused on world hunger. They are continuing to work on Jail Ministry, as well.

Kris Tobias reported that the Technology Committee has not formally met yet, but they are working on an inventory of the equipment at church and have identified some issues and solved some problems. No other committee reports.

Jen Hellberg reported on the Lutherdale Annual Meeting. They are gearing up for this summer and have many volunteer opportunities. Steve Geis reported that thank you cards were received from Lutherdale and CART as well as from Virginia Becker for her Christmas gift.

Property Report: Pastor Jennifer reported that the heat issue has been improved some by Richter moving the thermostat to a different location. She is still turning it up on Saturday for Sunday services. Richter also fixed a hot water issue recently. Tom Kosanda advised that the cost of replacing the shed has been estimated at \$15-20,000. He will work on getting an estimate of the value of the contents which are insured separately. He also presented an inventory of light bulbs in the church compiled by Dale Klemp and Michael Rehak together with some suggestions and costs for immediate replacements. Pastor Jennifer said the amount was within the property budget and did not require Council approval.

Treasurer's Report.: Tim Neuenschwander presented the treasurer's report. Total giving for February was basically flat month-over-month with January, but was comprised almost entirely of general giving in Feb. Expenses for February were also basically flat month-over-month with January if the expenses for the boilers is ignored. We are basically even for net income this year, even with absorbing the cost of the boilers. The MIF loan balance is just over \$35,000 with \$20,000 set aside in earmarked funds. After tax season, Tim intends to focus on which pledges are not yet paid and encourage payment in full this year. The signers on the Hometown Bank checking accounts need to be updated. It is best to have people who are regularly in town and Jean Scott and Ann Engelstad volunteered. Tim moved to name them as the new signers, Jen Hellberg seconded the motion, and it was approved with Ann and Jean abstaining. Ann Engelstad moved to approve the Treasurer's Report, Jean Scott seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved. Tim will coordinate the process. It was then noted that there is nothing new yet on the organist salary budget item. Final discussion was then had on the distribution of gifts from the member's gift to the church. Tim moved to donate \$7,500 to CART, \$3,750 to the Blue Jay Backpack program, and \$3,750 to the Everybody Eats program. Amanda Kosanda seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved. Tim will draft a note to each entity to send with their check.

March 9, 2021 Council MINUTES continued

Pastor's Report: Pastor Jennifer reported that First Communion classes have started and March 21 has been set for First Communion. It will be held in person with only the class members and 4 guests each allowed to attend that day. Bibles will be presented to the third graders on April 25 at a regular service. Lenten services have begun. Computer problems prevented the tv broadcast of the Ash Wednesday service, but the other pre-recorded services have been going well among the 5 churches. She will be gone on vacation the week after Easter.

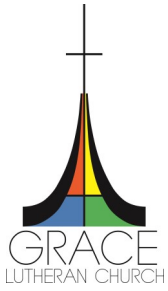
New Business. Pastor reported that each confirmation student is expected to choose a service project with his or her mentor. One person would like to help the homeless and is putting together a list of items that can be donated or purchased with cash donations over a three Sunday period of time. She has chosen The Road Home as the recipient of the contributions. We agreed that she could go ahead with this and use the church for the donation site.

Old Business.: a) Review of Holy Week and Easter Planning. Pastor reported that the committee is looking at a regular worship service in church at 9 a.m. and a parking lot service thereafter on Palm Sunday. The parking lot service would offer palms, communion, and soup. She would like to offer an Open House type of situation like during Advent for Maundy Thursday where people could come in anytime during a couple of hours to visit some stations set up in the sanctuary, pray, and take communion. On Good Friday, something will probably be offered in Veteran's Park together with other churches, but not the Cross Walk. For Easter, the committee is looking again at a regular in church service at 9 and a parking lot service probably at 10 with communion. (b) Return to Worship Planning. So far, the maximum number of in-church attendees has been no more than 14 and there have been some issues of failing to honor the guidelines, mainly related to social distancing and singing. However, Covid numbers continue to decline, vaccination numbers continue to climb, and guidelines regarding indoor gathering have increased the number of people allowed recently, so after much discussion, Steve Geis made a motion to increase the allowed attendance to 50 people per service (plus the staff and volunteers) starting with Palm Sunday. Ann Engelstad seconded the motion and it was passed. It was agreed that at least two ushers should be present and that the guidelines for attendance will be reiterated and better enforced. Talking during the prelude and postlude will specifically be discouraged. (c) Music Director Update. The candidate who was going to play for the January 31 service had to cancel again due to an injury, but still wishes to reschedule. The 3 people who are handling music right now are doing a great job, however, and Ann Engelstad reported it has been going very smoothly. Jean Scott brought up the problems they are having with mice in the kitchen. Dale Klemp has been working on this and Virginia will notify him that we'd like to increase the efforts.

Adjournment: There being no further business, Jean Scott moved to adjourn the meeting. Tim Neuenschwander seconded the motion and it was approved. Next meeting will be April 13, 2021, at 7:30 p.m., via Zoom. A volunteer sheet will be circulated for devotions. The meeting was adjourned, followed by the Lord's Prayer.
