Pastor's Ponderings



Back in October, we started talking about the acronym GIFTs – Growing in Faith Together. This theme shaped our Stewardship campaign, and now it also shapes our Advent and Christmas seasons as well. Just in the last 2 months, many of you have shared abundant gifts. You donated over 90 jars of gravy, 90 boxes of stuffing, and over \$100 to the Cambridge Food Pantry, to be distributed to those in need. Many of you pledged to share gifts of time, talent, and treasure by completing pledge cards and time & talent sheets as a commitment for this coming year. You donated

t-shirts and toiletry items for our Sunday School service projects. Thank you, thank you, thank you!

I've appreciated thinking more broadly about gifts this year. In case you didn't hear Tami Collin share her experience with the church rummage sale in worship in October – while we thought the rummage sale was simply a way to get rid of some unwanted things and to make a little money, it was so much more. It turned out to be an unexpected gift. The rummage sale was a gift to avid thrifters, and also to people who might not have the money to buy things new. It was a gift to people who were hungry for social interaction and a cool place to spend a hot August day. It was a gift for us to share graciousness and our space with people who may not have many positive experiences in a church. And it was a gift for those who worked at the rummage sale, to meet new people, to help others, and to see blessings where they never expected to. I don't think any of us expected these gifts, but what a blessing they were to so many.

Sharing gifts and being generous are big parts of "Growing in Faith Together." Because having faith in God helps us see beyond ourselves, to notice the needs of others and our ability to share our gifts. Teaching generosity to our young people is so important as well.

The Advent and Christmas seasons give us plenty of opportunities for generosity and gift-giving. And I'm not just talking about presents that you wrap and put under a tree. Our holiday lights and decorations can be a gift of joy to our neighbors and those who drive by. Taking time to call a loved one or send a note or have coffee with someone who needs a listening ear can be a greater gift than you might imagine. Sharing appreciation for someone's special abilities, for the time they spend on others, for their achievements or performances is always a welcome gift. Your kindness and thoughtfulness can be one of the most important things during this busy season.

This month, take some time to think about how you can be a gift or share a gift with others, gifts that don't necessarily need to be wrapped, but may be as meaningful as any wrapped gift.

Happy Advent and Merry Christmas, my friends. You are truly a gift to me. Thank you for who you are and what you do!

Upcoming Sabbatical Conversation


This summer, Grace's Church Council approved a pastoral Sabbatical policy, which would allow a pastor to take a Sabbatical after serving at Grace for at least 6 years. A Sabbatical is an extended time away from congregational responsibilities (typically 3 months) to allow the pastor to be renewed, refreshed, to study, and to return to ministry newly energized to serve. In January, we'll be talking more about what a Sabbatical is and what it might mean for us, in preparation for a conversation at our Annual Meeting on Sunday, January 29, 2023.

Holiday Bake Sale


The Youth will be holding a Bake Sale on Sunday, December 18 after worship. Come pick up some cute and tasty goodies for your Christmas table!


very Tuesday afternoon, the people of Augsburg Lutheran Church in Winston-Salem, North Carolina, gather for a Bible study led by their pastor the Rev. Paul Wollner. The theme changes monthly and, during the pandemic, Pastor Paul conducted the Bible study via Zoom.

Last November, as the busy season of Advent was approaching, Pastor Paul received an email from Lutheran World Relief about Advent resources for congregations.

"Admittedly, I had just skimmed the email when I first received it, but when it was time to pick a topic for December's Bible study, this instantly came to mind," he said. "The videos produced by LWR perfectly captured the theme of Advent hope and helped us to see the great work that LWR does around the world."

Many of those who attended the Bible study knew they were a congregational partner through financial support and donating School Kits. But few knew the extent of the partnerships in places like Honduras, Uganda, Nepal and Lebanon, as featured in the weekly videos.

"I've always appreciated LWR's work, but I did not realize the impact that they made on individual households, especially lifting up women" said Martha Clark, a class participant.

GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

November 8, 2022, partially via zoom and partially at church (Minutes below not approved until next Council meeting)

Call to Order. Meeting called to order by President Kris Tobias at 7:00 p.m.

Attendance. Present: Kris Tobias, Mary Behling, Amy Simdon, April Mickelson, Bill Reay, Pastor Jennifer Jelinek, Ann Engelstad, Kelly Witte, Jennifer Hellberg, Shawn Whitman, and Jim Jermain. **Absent:** Bill Becker.

Devotions. Jennifer Hellberg shared her faith story.

Approval of October Minutes. Kelly Witte moved to approve the Minutes, Jim Jermain seconded the motion, and the Minutes were unanimously approved.

Approval of Agenda. Kris Tobias asked to add a discussion of 2023 budget matters to the Agenda. Ann Engelstad moved to approve the revised agenda, Jennifer Hellberg seconded the motion, and it was unanimously approved.

Correspondence. None to report.

Treasurer's Report. Amy Simdon presented the financial reports for last month. She indicated the financial picture remains stable and little changed from September. There was a small net loss of about \$650 for October – about the same as October 2021. Both income and expenses were down slightly from October. Giving for the entire years is similar to last year, but expenses are down, so the year-to-date picture is a bit better than last year at this time. Amy further noted that the Food Pantry balance in the accounts is for the Thanksgiving baskets and that there will be one more Sunday for collections. April Mickelson moved to accept the Treasurer's report, Ann Engelstad seconded the motion, and it was unanimously approved.

Pastor's Report. Pastor Jennifer reported that the community dinner went very well with over 200 people served and many compliments received regarding the food and the service. The community-wide Thanksgiving service will be held at St. Pius this year on November 20th at 7 p.m. and all are welcome. Pastor Jennifer will be gone Thanksgiving weekend and Brenda Lovick will be filling in. Pastor has been working on the Christmas program quite a bit. It will be held December 18th and will be a little different this year. Instead of a play, the children will be presenting the gifts they will have gathered based on their service projects. Breah Klemp will be starting as the Christian Education Coordinator this week. Catherine Elliot will be off November 17 and through the following week. Pastor Jennifer will be seeking a few volunteers to staff the office during her absence.

Committee Reports. Bill Reay (Property) reported that the floors were completed and look great. A new humidifier has been purchased and is ready to be set up. Fall leaf work needs to be done and he will reach out for volunteers. Ann Engelstad raised the issue of the front lights not turning on at the proper times making exits very dark after practices. It is a continuing problem that needs to be resolved. Shawn Whitman indicated that he purchased a new timer, but needs assistance with installing it. Shawn and Bill will co-ordinate with John Adsit on the timer issue and also discuss the need for some new lights.

Ann Engelstad (Worship) reported that they are working on the Christmas services and she has finally found a place that will deliver poinsettias on December 22. She needs all orders by Dec. 1. Jennifer Hellberg (Stewardship) reported that the committee continues to meet regularly to work on the fall stewardship campaign. Time and Talent Sheets were sent out recently and are due November 13th. She noted a special thanks to Jill Jensen for designing this year's logo. April Mickelson (Outreach) noted that they have met several times and are collecting food for the Food Pantry Thanksgiving baskets with a goal of 100 items. They are also looking into the possibility of accepting the donation of numerous world-wide Christmas ornaments from the Carolyn Scholten estate and then selling those to raise funds. Jim Jermain (Hospitality) reported that the confirmation brunch went very well. Pastor Appreciation was observed and they are working on staff gifts to be made in December. They are also working on the Blue Jay backpack project for next spring. Kris Tobias (Technology) indicated there have been problems with Charter lately that have resulted in the loss of internet service for the church for as long as 2 days. It is Charter's problem and they keep coming back to work on it. It is not fully resolved, but was better this week.

Old Business. (a) Reconciling in Christ. Pastor Jennifer indicated that the committee has not yet met. Erik Olson and Tami Collin have been added to the committee. **(b) Community Café.** This was discussed under the Pastor's Report.

New Business. (a) 2023 Budget. Amy Simdon noted that she has received budget requests from most committees and there have been no requested increases. Insurance and office equipment expenses are up a little, but not significantly. Debt retirement is decreased. Pastor Jennifer will be looking at wages shortly and getting the information to Amy. Amy indicated we need to include an amount in the budget for the sabbatical fund. Pastor Jennifer will not know if she receives a sabbatical grant until next October. Discussion was held regarding the date for the Annual Meeting and it was set for January 29th, 2023.

Adjournment. There being no further business, Mary Behling moved to adjourn the meeting, Jennifer Hellberg seconded the motion, and it was unanimously approved. Next meeting will be December 13th, 2022, at 7:00 p.m. at church and via Zoom for anyone who can't or doesn't wish to attend in person. Bill Reay will share his faith story with us at that meeting. The meeting was adjourned, followed by the Lord's Prayer.
