
Now hear me out. I know Zoom sounds scary and unfamiliar to those of you who haven't tried it, but I've found it to be a fantastic, easy tool for having meetings, classes, and casual conversations. Some congregations even use Zoom for worship. Our Council has met on Zoom since April. This summer, we held our Synod Assembly and elected a bishop over Zoom. And if a synod Annual Meeting of over 400 people can succeed on Zoom, we can certainly have a successful Annual Meeting on Zoom, as well. It's really quite simple and effective.

Our Council passed a resolution that will allow us to meet over Zoom, as long as everyone has opportunity to participate and vote in real time. On January 10 and 17, we'll do a Zoom tutorial immediately after worship on the TV broadcast and on Facebook. If you've never used Zoom, we encourage you to watch. More information on Zoom is inside this newsletter, as well.

Even more so, we ask, hope, and strongly encourage you to be a part of **our Annual Meeting over Zoom on Sunday, January 24** as we reflect on this past year and elect leaders for the future. We need you! We look forward to being together with you as we plan and prepare for this coming year, doing God's work and sharing God's grace in this time and place.

What is Zoom?

Zoom is a way to do and video communi- real time, with every-

being able to participate. Even if you don't have a computer, you can use Zoom. There's a call-in feature where you can use your own phone to call, listen, and participate in the meeting. If you call in for Zoom, we'll ask you to identify yourself, because we'll only be able to see your phone number.

But Zoom works even better online, with a computer (with a web-cam) or smart phone, because you can both see and hear one another. If you've never used Zoom, try clicking on the Zoom link for the Annual Meeting, which will ask you to register, which costs you nothing. Then it will take you to the meeting.

The typical Zoom screen ends up looking a bit like the Brady bunch, with each participant having their own box. You can participate with your camera on or off. We'd love your camera to be on so we can see your beautiful faces! When you enter the meeting, you will be muted, but you can unmute when you vote or when you want to speak. We'll be able to take attendance on Zoom, record minutes, hear your input, and take votes. When one of the leaders is speaking, their picture will be larger, and we'll also be able to "Share Screen" so you can see financial sheets or any other documents we want to share with you.

We encourage you to practice getting on Zoom ahead of time so it works smoothly on January 24. You're always welcome to join us for Grace Gab or Monday night studies on Zoom, even just if you want to practice. Happy Zooming!





Advent Reflection

By our Missionaries: Rev. Rachel Esekse & Zachary Courter

Dorothy and I crafted an Advent calendar together with some finger paint, cardboard, masking tape and cotton balls. We hung it in the living room. Yesterday, Zach and I asked Dorothy “where’s the Advent Calendar?” *slowly repeating* “Advent, Aaadveennt.” Dorothy looked around the room, past the Advent Calendar, and gestured quizzically to the elephant pictured on the carpet.

Dorothy is increasingly good at “finding” things in the house. We have a “Merry Christmas” banner in the kitchen and whenever we say “Merry Christmas!” she points to it joyfully. Now, Advent said slowly DOES sound a little bit like “elephant.” Zach and I were impressed with this new insight. In some ways, **Advent is a chance to address ‘the elephants in the room,’** or at least, identify them.

For our family, the big elephant in the room is missing our families. I think something that many can relate to with ongoing Covid-19 impacts globally. Another elephant of Advent is the arrival of God in the most surprising form– a tiny baby born in less than ideal circumstances, according to the world. That can be where God shows up: where, when and with whom we least expect.

So, our family invites yours this year to look for the **elephants in your Advent.** To see how many ways the God of surprises is inviting us to look at the world in a new way. ■

GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

December 8, 2020 Via Zoom from Home during Pandemic

(Minutes below are not approved until next month's Council meeting)

Call to Order: Meeting called to order by President Steve Geis at 7:32 p.m.

Attendance: Steve Geis, Tim Neuenschwander, Amy Simdon, Amanda Kosanda, Mary Behling, Jean Scott, Kris Tobias, Ann Engelstad, Lori Jensen, and Pastor Jennifer. Erik Olsen and Tom Kosanda were excused.

Devotions: Lori Jensen presented devotions to begin the meeting.

Approval of November Minutes: Lori Jensen moved to approve the November Minutes. Amy Simdon seconded, and they were unanimously approved.

Consent Agenda: Outreach Committee-Jean Scott noted that the quilting group has begun meeting at home instead of at church. They still have "Good Gifts" for sale for Christmas this year, but they must be ordered online. Hospitality-Lori Jensen noted that they will be sending Christmas cards to new members. Also, they have ordered blankets for Spring graduation gifts. Stewardship-Amy Simdon noted that pledges so far have amounted to \$152,500, down about \$20,000 from previous years, at this time. Discussion was then held on various ideas for ways to use the gift from Phil Vasby. Tim will take our ideas to him to see if he would like to have some input.

Property Report: Tommy Kosanda was not able to attend, but Pastor reported that they have not yet received an estimate on the cost of replacing the boilers. Virginia to follow up.

Treasurer's Report: Tim Neuenschwander reported that we had the highest month this year for General Giving in November, with an overall net profit of over \$6,800 for the month. We have an overall profit for the year of almost \$20,000 even deducting the large individual gift and the PPP loan. Members have been very supportive! Tom Jensen and Mike Day have agreed to do the audit again this year. Diane Russo has prepared all of the information for applying for PPP loan forgiveness. The MIF loan is at \$87,856. Taking into consideration all funds currently segregated for repayment, there is less than \$25,000 left to pay. The fund-raising program is now in its third and final year. Tim then presented the proposed 2021 budget. He indicated that he feels very good about the numbers at this time, but no one knows what 2021 will actually be like so it is a little difficult to predict some expenses and income. Council members had reviewed it and had some questions and comments, but felt it looked good, overall. Accordingly, Amy Simdon moved to approve the budget. Jean Scott seconded, and it was unanimously approved. Finally, Tim noted that the scholarship CD is up for renewal, but has old names on the account. Ann Engelstad moved to update the names to Steve Geis, Tim Neuenschwander, and Diane Russo and renew the CD for another year. Jean Scott seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved. Lori Jensen then moved to approve the Treasurer's Report. Kris Tobias seconded the motion, and it was unanimously approved.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Jennifer reported that the committee working on Advent and Christmas planning has been excellent and has come up with many good ideas. Starting December 9, there will be "Advent Wednesdays" for three weeks where the sanctuary will be open from 3-8 p.m. for people to come reflect, pray, bring a family ornament to hang on the Church tree, and to take a Grace ornament home. Social distancing and masks will be required. There will be a 5:00 p.m. online service on Christmas Eve. It will be broadcast on cable and Facebook. There will then be a 7:00 p.m. parking lot service with communion and the singing of "Silent Night" with candles. The church has purchased an FM transmitter so that people can hear this short service over their car radios no matter where they are in the parking lot. On December 20, the High School Youth will hold their annual bake sale fundraiser in the garage from 9:45-10:30 a.m. The children's Christmas program will be broadcast that same day at the 9:00 service. On Christmas Day, there will be a 10:00 a.m. online service followed by drive-thru communion. Pastor Jennifer will be on vacation the week after Christmas, but Erik Olsen and Andrya Coutts will lead an online service on December 27th at 9:00 a.m. which will be broadcast on Facebook and cable, provided we can find a volunteer to stream the Facebook, video since Scarlett and Sierra generally do that. She also noted that she is working with people to try to make the video transmission more reliable for the Christmas program. It was difficult to understand the Bishop through the video feed and it went in and out intermittently a week ago.

New Business: Committee reports for the annual meeting are due before Christmas. Pastor will ask Virginia to send out an email with sample reports to work from. Pastor reported that the nominating committee has been able to fill all open positions as follows: Jen Hellberg for Stewardship, Shawn Whitman for Evangelism, and Kari Jermain for Hospitality. We might still need a couple to attend the Synod Assembly, but that may be held online.

Old Business: a) Advent/Christmas Planning. Kris Tobias' family has painted the outline of pictures on the west windows and people are invited to come finish filling them in. b) Music Director Position. Personnel Committee has met a couple of times. They have received a few calls through word of mouth, but have also advertised in the Synod newsletter and are considering advertising with some organists' guilds. They would like to have resumes by January 1. c) Return to Worship Planning. Steve presented the latest positivity rate for Wisconsin, which has dropped in the last couple of weeks, but is still well above the 5% rate where we would recommend returning to in-person worship. He will provide that report on a weekly basis to the Council members. Garage Insurance. Tim needs square footage, estimated value of contents, etc., from Tommy and will then talk to the insurance company.

Adjournment: Next meeting will be January 12, 2021 at 7:30 p.m. by Zoom. There being no further business, Amy Simdon moved to adjourn. Ann Engelstad seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously, followed by the Lord's Prayer.
