Pastor's Ponderings



"Unraveled"

Have you ever felt like your life was unraveling? This last year has been a time when it's felt like everything was changing, disappearing, and falling apart. All sorts of people watched their "normal" lives unraveling. People lost jobs, businesses, and loved ones. Many had to figure out new ways to do what they needed to do, including teachers and students, health care workers, restaurant workers, people in retail, and

so many others. Nearly everyone has had moments of loneliness and isolation, grief, and frustration.

I can relate. Seminary prepares pastors for lots of things, but never was there a class on ministering during a pandemic. But suddenly pastors and church leaders everywhere had to make decisions about how to care for the physical and spiritual health of their congregations. While it felt like the church "closed," the ministry had to continue, amid challenges we'd never dreamed of. We had to find ways to connect with and care for members that we couldn't see in person. We had to navigate technology and social media in ways we never had before. We had to find ways to stay hopeful and to spread the hope and faith during what felt like a dark time. And during all of this, we dealt with a wide variety of attitudes about the pandemic and what we should be doing, in addition with all the other divisive things happening in our world. Have I felt unraveled? Yes indeed.

So when I came upon a sermon series called, "Unraveled: Seeking God when Our Plans Fall Apart," I laughed, realizing how fitting it felt right now. Though it feels like we're living through unprecedented times, experiencing "unraveling" like no one ever has before, there are dozens of stories in the Bible about people whose lives have felt similarly "unraveled." And since we look to the Bible to help us live our lives of faith, this summer we're going to do just that. Starting June 20, we'll explore "stories of unraveling" throughout scripture. This series comes with art for each week, as well as a devotional journal for each Sunday's theme. Feel free to pick up an "Unraveled" Journal, available at worship and outside, in our Little Library all summer. Hopefully, looking at how God helped others persevere through their "unraveling" will help us to seek God in our own times of "unraveling" as well.

Not comfortable worshiping in the Sanctuary yet? Enjoy worshiping outdoors? Then join us for Outdoor Worship in Grace's parking lot every other Sunday at 10:00 a.m. (June 6 and 20). Come and worship from your car or bring lawn chairs to sit outside. Bulletins

and communion kits will be provided for you. If the weather looks iffy, an announcement will be made at the 9:00 broadcast and on Facebook about whether the outdoor service will happen. Note: There will not be an outdoor service on July 4.

Communion Practices

During the pandemic, we've had to figure out new ways to safely share communion. In the last 6 months, we've experimented with several pre-packaged communion kits, that include both bread and grape juice. The problem with them is that they can be challenging to open. Our newest kits are a different style – chalice-shaped, with bread sealed at the bottom and grape juice sealed at the top. They don't fit in our communion trays, but we're hoping they help make



communion consumption a little easier for you. During indoor and worship, we're now passing out communion kits as worshipers enter, so you can consume them during worship at the same time.

July 4 - Peter Sinks in the Water: Unraveled by Uncertainty


Opportunities to Serve



Worship Updates from Grace Council

With many of us now vaccinated, we are finally seeing improving conditions and fewer Covid infections. At the Council meeting this month, we discussed how we might make changes to in-person worship to slowly move in a direction of 'back-to-normal'.

Here are the things we decided effective immediately:

- We will all be able to sing together during the closing hymn.
- Bread/grape juice will be handed out as we enter the sanctuary so that we can commune together during the service.
- We will move a few more pews into the sanctuary and increase our capacity to 75. Sign-up will still be required for now, however.
- Outdoor services will be mask-optional and no limits on singing.

We will likely make more changes each month assuming conditions continue to improve. It will be important for all of us to know the procedures and be flexible and patient as these changes take place. We will likely print some of these procedures in the weekly bulletin to make them easy to find. No one wants to be the rules enforcer, so please take the time to read and follow these instructions.

As we welcome more of our members back to worship, it's important that they know what to expect. Our goal has always been to protect our members and our neighbors. I think we can all respect the fact that each of us has a different level of risk tolerance and we all realize that some people cannot be vaccinated for medical reasons.

Your Council is trying hard to find the right balance that works for most members. By the way, if you were waiting on your vaccine to avoid the rush, now is the time! There are plenty of shots available and I hear that some places don't even require an appointment.

Your input is always welcome. Thank you all, and stay tuned.

Greetings from the Grace Evangelism Committee!
Pastor Jennifer recommended I read Michael Frost's book
<u>Surprise the World! The Five Habits of Highly Missional People</u>. Think of the subtitle as lessons from the field that we can apply in our lives, whether we travel and minister around the world, or we just want to know how to better share the good news of Jesus with those in our own community.

He summarizes the habits in the acronym "BELLS" – Bless, Eat, Listen, Learn, Sent. These actions are positive in others' lives, and in our own. Mindfully incorporating these habits into our lives lets us evangelize to all those we encounter by our example of Christ-like living. Most of the BELLS are ones we already "ring" in some way, if you will, but the author provides practical insight, amplifies the Christian values associated with each habit, and he writes of the experience of others, as illustrative examples.

We all receive blessings, and we have the power to give them with our kindness, compliments and gifts; accepting a dinner

invitation or offering one, quietly and actively listening for the Holy Spirit; learning about Jesus in the Word, and journaling the ways we see the Lord working in and through us, all to discover that maybe we have already been sent to share the good news! We can find inspiration in books like this, and all around us, as we seek to keep our faith strong, growing, and flourishing!

<u>Urgent need for Personal Care Kits</u>

Lutheran Worlds Relief has sent out an urgent request for Personal Care Kits. They meet peoples' most basic needs. Imagine your life without soap, a toothbrush, a towel, a comb.

<u>Un-</u>imaginable, right? If you can help, please consider putting a kit together, or two or three. Cost per kit is \$8-\$10. The fastest way to help, would be to make a financial gift; please make checks out to Grace Lutheran Church and write

"Personal Care Kits" in the memo line.

The **final collection will be June 30th.** You can bring your gift to outdoor worship or bring it to Grace during office hours (Mon-Fri 9am-noon). There is a collection bin in the narthex.

Your generosity is always so very much appreciated!

Include the following in each Personal Care Kit

ONE light-weight bath-size towel - dark color recommended (min 20" x 40" and max 52" \times 27")

TWO or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz, any brand, in original wrapping

ONE adult-size toothbrush in it's original packaging*

ONE sturdy comb, remove packaging

ONE metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging

* Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a businesssize envelope; no plastic bags or wrap

Some important guidelines to remember

• Be sure to shop for **light- or medium-weight** towels, which are easier for Kit recipients to hand wash and air dry, take up less storage space and are considerably less expensive than the fluffier towels we may prefer to use.

Please give **new items** only.

Please **do not** donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.

Please **do not** donate any items decorated with a U.S.flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.

Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.

P.S.: A big **Thank You** to folks who have donated to the Baby Care Kits. If that is your particular passion, donations are welcome year-round, but we will focus on these kits during Advent. Please be aware that we have an **overabundance of hats.** Most years, we end up shy of T-shirts (not Onsies!), so maybe you can concentrate on those for now. We can only use sizes 6-24 months. We also need more hand-towels and **4-oz** bars of mild soap, as well as \$\$ for diapers. (Note "Baby Care Kits" in the memo line of your check).

GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

May 11, 2021 Via Zoom from Home (Minutes below aren't approved until next month's meeting)

Call to Order. Meeting called to order by President Steve Geis at 7:35 p.m.

<u>Attendance.</u> Steve Geis, Amanda Kosanda, Tom Kosanda, Jean Scott, Mary Behling, Jennifer Hellberg, Shawn Whitman, Kris Tobias, Tim Neuenschwander, Ann Engelstad, Kari Jermain and Pastor Jennifer Jelinek. Absent: None. Devotions. Jennifer Hellberg offered devotions to open the meeting.

<u>Approval of April Minutes.</u> Jean Scott moved to approve the Minutes, Jennifer Hellberg seconded the motion, and they were unanimously approved.

<u>Consent Agenda.</u> Jean Scott (Outreach) indicated that they have completed the Lenten Challenge and exceeded the goal by over \$600. They are now working on personal care kits through June 30 and donations of supplies or funds are welcome. Kris Tobias (Tech) reported that they met recently to discuss next steps and discuss budgets and funding. They are having some issues with live streaming the service on Facebook but are getting close to completing that with instructions for all users. Jennifer Hellberg (Stewardship) reported that she and Ben Becker have been working on ways for visitors to give online (similar to Venmo but for non-profits). No other committee reports.

<u>Property Report.</u> Tommy Kosanda reported that the committee met in April and scheduled a church clean-up day for this Sunday, May 16, after service. Jennifer Hellberg suggested we could try tapping into the High School's Silver Cord program and get some additional volunteers that way. Tommy fixed the hole by the Little Library and did some other general clean-up already. The dishwasher and the garbage disposal are both having some issues. It was agreed the committee should go ahead with replacing the garbage disposal but should hold off on looking into a new dishwasher for the time being.

<u>Treasurer's Report.</u> Tim Neuenschwander presented the financial reports and summary. Total income was down a little in April month-over-month, although general giving was a bit up. The trend has been slightly downward since February. In "normal" years, this would be a big time of the year due to Easter. Expenditures were up a little, but profit/loss is still positive for the year (including the PPP loan funds). After tax season ends, Tim and Diane will review the Renewing Grace pledges. He believes most of them have been fulfilled, however, and we are about \$13,000 short of the loan payoff amount so discussion may need to be held as to how to complete repayment. Jean Scott moved to approve the Treasurer's Report, Kris Tobias seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

Pastor's Report. Pastor Jennifer reported that she is 4 weeks into the Revelation study. She obtained a variety of glasses from a church that has closed to help reduce our use of paper cups. She will be gone June 9-18 for vacation. For the summer, she is looking at a new sermon series called "Unraveled". It has visual components as well as spoken and should be interesting. Drive-thru Communion is ending and Outdoor Services will be starting every other weekend. The Deerfield vicar's internship has started and she will be meeting with her as supervisor weekly. It is an 18-month internship ending August of 2022. Pastor reported that she will be unavailable to lead the service on July 4, and different options were discussed. It was agreed that she should try to arrange for a lay-person to lead that service. Pastor will be working with Diane Russo to move some files and/or destroy old records to free up space in the office file cabinet. The 2021 graduates will be recognized at the June 6th in-person service and there will be a table outside with cupcakes for them and other attendees to enjoy.

New Business. None.

Old Business.

Music Director Update. No update. The Personnel Committee is continuing to work on job descriptions and the organist job is listed on a website for church musicians. Personnel is meeting again on Thursday.

Return to Worship Planning: Much discussion was held and the following decisions were made: Singing of the last hymn will now be allowed. Masks will still be required. Communion will be handed out as people enter the sanctuary so that they can commune together in the pews during service. Capacity will be increased to 75 people/service. Sign-up will remain in place for the time being to allow pews to be appropriately placed. Cindy Hartman will be asked to schedule 2 ushers/service.

<u>Adjournment.</u> There being no further business, a motion was made and seconded to adjourn the meeting and it was approved. Next meeting will be June 8, 2021, at 7:30 p.m., via Zoom. Ann Engelstad volunteered for devotions. The meeting was adjourned, followed by the Lord's Prayer.




