Pastor's Ponderings



Can I just tell you how much I'm looking forward to March this year? Because of how Easter falls (March 31), March is at the very center of the most powerful season of our faith experience. We get to experience nearly 4 weeks of Lent, then Holy Week, then Easter all in one month. It's like condensing most of the important events in Jesus' life all into one calendar month for us to experience as the

whirlwind journey that it really was.

Our Wednesday services will introduce us to people whose lives were profoundly changed by Jesus. On Sundays, we'll hear a parable prophesying Jesus' death, we'll learn about the Greatest Commandment (love God & love neighbor), we'll hear some of Jesus' prophecies about the future, and we'll journey with Jesus into Jerusalem, accompanied by palm fronds and shouts of "Hosanna!". During Holy Week, we'll follow Jesus to the upper room, where he shared the Last Supper with his disciples, we'll sit with him in the garden as he prays, we'll feel the shock and fear of the disciples as Jesus was arrested and taken away, and we'll find ourselves in increasing darkness as we grieve with the women who stood beneath Jesus' cross as he took his last breaths.

But that's not all. We'll also have the opportunity to wake early on March 31, to gather in a dark room, lit only by candles, waiting to hear the testimony of Mary Magdalene as she comes running from the tomb (Easter Sunrise Service at 7am). Then we'll gather a bit later to truly celebrate the joy of Jesus' resurrection (Easter Worship at 9 am). This month will be a truly powerful, beautiful way to experience the very core of our faith. I invite you to come be a part of it, and feel free to invite friends. This month is at the very center of our faith. Come and see.

2024 Lenten Challenge

This year's Lenten Challenge is the ELCA's AMMPARO project (Accompanying Migrants with Protection, Advocacy, Representation and Opportunities). Mary Campbell, AMMPARO's Program Director, spoke to us during and after our service on February 18th, explaining AMMPARO's mission. People coming to the United States are fleeing crime and violence, extreme poverty, environmental displacement, and lack of opportunities. More than half of them are now from countries outside of the Americas. AMMPARO assists new migrants arriving here, and also those who have been deported after years in the US, providing job training once back in their home country. Mary presented a lot of information, too much to share here. If you would like to learn more, we encourage you to visit the website: elca.org/AMMPARO.

GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

February 18, 2024

(Minutes will be reviewed & approved at next Council meeting)

Call to Order. President Kelly Witte called the meeting to order at 12:50 PM following the new 2024 council retreat.

Attendance. Present: Sandi Aston Hall, Pr. Jennifer Jelinek, John Jensen, Bob Koepp, Connie Kreuser, Charlene Luchterhand, April Mickelson, Peggy Punsel, Kristin Rue, Richard Scott, Amy Simdon, Shawn Whitman, Kelly Witte. **Absent:** None.

Devotions. Pastor Jennifer Jelinek led us in prayer.

Approval Minutes. Amy Simdon moved to approve the January meeting minutes. Bob Koepp seconded the motion. 7 approved and 4 new members abstained as they were not present in January. (Note: John Jensen and Richard Scott share a vote as Property Committee). Motion carried.

Approval of Agenda. Several people suggested additions or slight revisions: 1) Add Pr. Jennifer's sabbatical to Old Business. 2) Add the need for a change in signers on bank accounts and the ELCA Mission Investment Fund to New Business. 3) Move the topic of a pollinator garden earlier in the meeting to allow the participating non-Council member to leave after her presentation. Peggy Punsel moved and Sandi Aston Hall seconded a motion to approve the amended agenda. Motion unanimously approved.

Correspondence. None.

Treasurer's Report. Amy Simdon reported a positive start to 2024. We had net income of almost \$38,000 although \$30,950 is from recording the sabbatical grant received last year as income. January General Giving was 55.1% (\$10,886) higher than 2023 and \$7,654 over the January budget. Income tends to be higher in January related to members giving from their IRAs. Special Giving was almost \$1,500 less than last year and \$412 less than the monthly budget. January expenses were \$7,014.56 more than last year but \$2,121 under budget. The biggest jump in expenses was due to expenses that were paid for the upcoming Youth Gathering trip this summer (\$4,096). Net ordinary income is about \$2,831 more than last year in January without including the grant money. The checking balance increased by almost \$6,700 with the general fund balance increasing from \$29,050 to \$38,259. April Mickelson moved to approve this report and send it to audit. Sandi Aston Hall seconded the motion. Motion unanimously approved.

Pastor's Report. 1) Pastor Jennifer noted that this year students' spring break falls at the same time as Holy Week. 2) She has offered our church as a location for a Deerfield music instructor to meet with his brass and string students once a month or so. 3) She shared an update on the health of her husband, Pr. Erik Jelinek. While he did not qualify for the hoped-for clinical trial in Detroit, he received radiation to his hip and is on a new medication with minimal side effects. The terrible pain he experienced in his hip the past few months is gone.

Committee Reports.

• Outreach & Social Justice. April Mickelson noted that our Blue Jay backpacks were well received. This year's Lenten challenge goal of \$2000 will be given to the ELCA's AMMPARO initiative, which provides a caring presence and assistance to migrants. Mary Campbell from AMMPARO shared information following our worship service today.

- **Property.** See "Front Door" under Old Business. Also, a future project will be to replace the stained green front entryway outdoor carpeting.
- **Stewardship.** See "Pollinator Garden" in Old Business. Also, Connie Kreuser gave a summary of members' time and talent interests to committee chairs.
- Worship. Sandi Aston Hall shared a price list for Easter plants from Burdick's Greenhouse in Fort Atkinson.

Old Business.

- Front Door John Jensen and Richard Scott provided an update on their research regarding new automatic front doors for the main entrance. Cost is likely to be around \$6000. Plan is for one of the outside and one of the inside double doors to be automatic. Outside doors will be metal for ease of maintenance and will look like the back door. Current width span is 32 inches. Legal size is 36 inches. They will go back for bids for the larger size. Timeline is 3 months from contract signing to completion.
- Pollinator Garden. Connie Kreuser introduced Stewardship Committee member Mary Bielefeldt, who described progress. The committee met with Cambridge resident, Georgia Gomez-Ibanez, who has a degree in restoration ecology. They identified 2 potential locations for the garden: 1) on the north side of the church on the side where the large windows are located and 2) on the strip of land between the front parking area and the road. No cost and lower cost sources of plants have been identified. Issues to consider: 1) which location is best (considering placement of underground utility lines, access to the front of the church through the doors on either end, ease of lawn maintenance and possible effects of winter road salt), 2) type of garden edging (from mulch to something more substantial), 3) additional costs (hoses, edging). Stewardship Committee will stake out the two areas for Diggers Hotline inspection and meet with the Property Committee. Council does not need to be involved with plant selection but noted to avoid plants that create problems though unwanted spread.
- **Pastor's Sabbatical.** Bob Koepp and Pr. Jennifer noted the plan for the congregation to have parallel experiences within the themes she has chosen for her focus. Pr. Jennifer suggested that the current Sabbatical Committee of Bob Koepp, Kris Tobias, and Marcia Sivesind be expanded. Worship Committee and youth will become involved.

New Business.

- New Signers for Bank Accounts. Amy Simdon moved that outgoing council members Mary Behling and Ann Engelstad be removed as signers on the checking and money market accounts at Bank First and be replaced by John Jensen and Richard Scott. April Mickelson seconded the motion. Motion unanimously approved. Amy also moved that Kelly Witte replace Ann Engelstad as a signer on the ELCA Mission Investment Fund. Sandi Aston Hall seconded the motion. Motion unanimously approved.
- **Sabbatical Fund.** Amy noted that unused funds could be put into a CD to earn more interest. Richard Scott moved that \$7500 be placed into a 7-month CD at Bank First. Peggy Punsel seconded the motion. Motion unanimously approved.

Adjournment. Sandi Aston Hall moved to adjourn the meeting. John Jensen seconded the motion. Motion unanimously approved. The meeting was adjourned at 1:55 PM. We ended with the Lord's Prayer.




