From Amy Day of Piggly Wiggly:

It has been an interesting couple of weeks.; things have settled down somewhat from that 1st crazy week. We'd like to say it is a new normal, but things are still constantly changing and we are constantly adapting to another new normal. We keep informed of new rules and regulations from the Wisconsin Grocer's Association and our warehouse. We have had to apply many new practices and procedures. We have added new services like curbside pickup. Some of it can be challenging. Sometimes just getting from the front of the store to the back can be a challenge because you are respecting the social distancing guidelines. And all of this, while we have been busier than normal. We have been short staffed because many of our employees have chosen to stay home and self quarantine, but blessed to have been able to hire a few new people, and most of the employees that we have left have really stepped up. We have a wonderful staff! It is a difficult time to be an essential worker. You are grateful to still have a job, while at the same time, you are worried that you could become exposed while working with the public. There is also concern that if too many people get sick, that we may not be able to stay open. While right now things are going well, it would not take much for that to quickly change. It really helps to have a wonderful, supportive community. While we have seen some negativity, for the most part customers have been patient, kind and understanding. The community has really stepped up, too. For example, we have had customers buy over 400 gallons of milk to be given to those in need. We have had many in the community volunteer to stock shelves for us, or to deliver groceries to the elderly and at-risk. One customer gave our full-time employees gift cards & the Cambridge Market brought soup in for the employees one day. Grace Quilters sewed masks so we have them available for customers & employees and Dancing Goat Distillery brought us a 5 gallon jug of hand sanitizer. One customer cut out paper hearts with all the employees' names. To see the community come together like this is really heartwarming! I guess if there is anything that we want people to know, it is how much we appreciate kindness, understanding and prayers for the continued health of our staff and community!

A request from the frontline...Please, please do your part! Stay home. Avoid unnecessary trips out of the home and stay away from those outside of your immediate family. You CAN have Covid and spread the virus even without symptoms! If you do have any sort of cold/flu symptoms, you should quarantine yourself at home for at least two weeks. No exceptions. Have others grocery shop for you and drop off at front door. Wipe groceries/packages down. When you absolutely must leave the home when healthy, wear a mask, don't touch your face (eyes, mouth, nose) and wash/use hand sanitizer frequently.

"Due to the highly contagious nature of this disease, it is not advised that you seek care at a hospital emergency department, unless you are advised to do so by your healthcare provider."

*Or, call the Covid triage hotline: 920-648-7696 and they can provide guidance on testing.

*"Drive through" Covid testing at Fort Hospital (order has to be placed by the primary doctor or through the Covid hotline prior. You cannot just show up to get tested)

*Temporary urgent care at 1520 Madison Ave Monday-Friday 8a-5pm. This allows people to avoid coming to the hospital for urgent care needs.



GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES April 14, 2020 Via Zoom from Home during Quarantine

Meeting called to order by President Steve Geis at 7:30 p.m.

Attendees: Steve Geis, Kris Tobias, Tim Neuenschwander, Lori Jensen, Amy Simdon, Amanda Kosanda, Tom Kosanda, Jean Scott, Mary Behling, Ann Engelstad, and Jennifer Jelinek. Erik Olson was absent.

Devotions:

Amanda Kosanda presented devotions.

Consent Agenda:

Jean Scott reported that the Lenten Challenge had raised enough money to buy 43 goats. Pastor Jennifer stated that another donation had just been made that would bring it to 44. There were no other committee reports. Tim Neuenschwander moved to approve all committee reports. Jean Scott seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.

Property Report:

Tom Kosanda stated he did not have anything new to report, but he will be putting something together soon to get volunteers lined up for lawn mowing. He noted that one of the temperature/humidity sensors went off this afternoon, but when he checked the church, everything seemed to be fine. He asked if we want to do mulch this year like we usually do this time of year. Under the quarantine circumstances, we agreed to do nothing yet and revisit the question in the next couple of weeks or so.

Treasurer's Report:

Tim Neuenschwander presented the Treasurer's Report. (a) General giving was down over January and February, but still shows a positive trend in 2020. Expenses were down, too, partly because we weren't in church most of the month. (b) The application for a PPP loan was approved in the amount of \$35,000. Tim explained the basis for the program and stated they had made a conservative request so that most, if not all, of the loan would be forgiven. Mary Behling moved to accept the loan and get documents signed as quickly as necessary. Ann Engelstad seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously. (c) Tim reported that he had talked to Church Mutual and received a letter discussing different uses of the church property and how each category would affect our insurance rates. It was not clear exactly where the adult respite program would fall, but, as there is no rush at this time, Lori Jensen moved to table this issue for a month.

Ann Engelstad seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved. (d) The loan principal for Renewing Grace is currently \$98,405.86. Tim indicated he and Diane are working on reconciling all donations to make sure the coding was correctly entered for all. Jean Scott moved to approve the Treasurer's Report. Amy Simdon seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

Pastor's Report:

Lew Behn died this past week. Plans for any services are on hold due to the quarantine restrictions. Next Sunday will be Holy Humor Sunday and she is looking for any humorous input. Confirmation class is resuming through the use of Zoom tomorrow. She is moving Bible Study from Monday to Wednesday for scheduling reasons. The feedback she has received regarding services online and on the TV broadcast has been mainly positive. We all agreed that that has worked well under the circumstances.

Old Business: None.

New Business:

The only new business was COVID-19 planning and we felt that we had discussed that in other parts of the meeting so nothing further needed to be discussed at this point.

Adjournment:

Next meeting will be May 12 at 7:30 p.m. at Grace if possible and, if not, by Zoom again.

There being no further business, Lori Jensen moved to adjourn. Amy Simdon seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously, followed by the Lord's Prayer.
