




strawberries to corn to sweetgrass. And when they receive gifts from the land, there's a strong call to give back, by giving to others and by caring for the earth. It's not about taking or buying, it's about relationship – receiving gifts given, and giving back in gratitude, sharing the blessing.

It struck me how similar this is to how we think about generosity in the church. God has given us so much that we are called to give back in gratitude. Our generosity may be in sharing the time we have, giving our hours to be helpful, to serve, to listen, to simply be present for others. Our generosity may include sharing our talents – maybe musical or artistic talents, maybe talents for fixing, baking, listening, sewing, reading, teaching, leading, planning, or any number of other abilities. Our generosity also includes sharing our treasures – the monetary and tangible items that can help support missions and ministries. Our treasures help spread out blessings so that we can give to others as God has given to us. All of life is a gift, given freely to us, so we're free to give as well.

COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

October 10, 2023, partially via zoom and partially at church

(Minutes below not approved until next Council meeting)

Call to Order. Meeting called to order by President Kelly Witte at 7:05 p.m.

Attendance. Present: Kelly Witte, Peggy Punsel, Connie Kreuser, Ann Engelstad, Mary Behling, April Mickelson, Bill Reay, Shawn Whitman, Amy Simdon, and Pastor Jennifer Jelinek **Absent:** Bill Becker and Bob Koepp.

Devotions. Ann Engelstad presented devotions.

Approval of September Minutes. Peggy Punsel moved to approve the September minutes as written, Amy Simdon seconded the motion, and the minutes were unanimously approved.

Approval of Agenda. Connie Kreuser asked to have "Consideration of Environmental Initiatives" added to New Business. April Mickelson moved to approve the Agenda as amended, Ann Engelstad seconded the Motion, and it was unanimously approved.

Correspondence. Pastor Jennifer noted that she received an email Kerry Marren of the Cambridge Food Pantry advising that another group had asked to be on the schedule for the community meal in November, so we won't be sponsoring a meal this year.

Treasurer's Report. (a) Amy Simdon presented the September reports and her financial narrative for all to review. Highlights included that we had a net loss of about \$5,200 in September, so year-to-date net income is down just over \$5,300. As of September 30, the year-todate General Giving is approximately \$4,000 less than this time last year and we are about \$14,000 below budget. Special Giving is about \$2,750 below last year's year-to-date figures and \$6,800 under budget for the year. Total year-to-date giving is approximately \$6,400 lower than last year and \$20,000 under budget. Total year-to-date expenses are \$4,500 more than last year as of September 30, but \$25,000 under budget. The end result through September 30 is that year-to-date net income is about \$11,000 less than 2022. Finally, the checking account balance is approximately \$5,500 less than at the end of August with most of that decrease in general funds. Amy noted in summary that while there is still a positive year -to-date income, that is mainly due to lower expenses than anticipated. The decrease in giving is not yet a problem, but the trend is a bit of a concern. Some of the decrease in net income can be attributed to the purchase of a used riding mower last month, but even without that, the net income was negative for September. Catherine has been asked to mention the availability of online giving in the next newsletter. (b) Amy noted that Diane Russo will be sending out budget sheets to each of the committee chairs shortly to be returned in November. Ann Engelstad moved to approve the treasurer's report and send it to audit, Bill Reay seconded the motion, and it was unanimously approved.

Pastor's Report. Pastor Jennifer reported that she will be contacting the nominating committee shortly to start working on nominations for next year's openings. Three boys will be receiving First Communion this coming Sunday and four youth will be confirmed on October 22. There will be a Dessert Night held the Wednesday before confirmation to celebrate and practice. She thanked Richard Scott for filling the pothole in the side parking lot area. She also reported that she will be having some follow-up surgery on October 31 and will be out a couple of weeks. She plans to be back November 12 and then be gone again on November 19th. Brenda Lovick will lead service on the 19th. Finally, the Food Pantry is putting holiday baskets together again and Grace has been asked to donate premade pie crusts and mixes and pie fillings.

Committee Reports. April Mickelson (Outreach) reported that they are currently working with Bob Koepp on a cook-out fund raiser for the Madison Area Jail Ministry, to be held on October 21 at the Piggly Wiggly. Volunteers are needed. As Pastor noted, they are helping to complete 100 holiday baskets with pre-made pie crusts and mixes and pie fillings. Donations should be made in October as the baskets will be distributed Nov. 8 and 15th. They are discussing selling Good Gift merchandise in December for Advent. Connie Kreuser (Stewardship) reported that the annual stewardship activities will kick off on Oct. 15. The theme is "We are Called", based on the hymn of the same name and God's call throughout the Bible for ordinary people to share the gifts given to us. Various presentations are planned. She also noted that they are starting to discuss a possible environmental initiative, discussed further under New Business. Peggy Punsel (Hospitality) noted that they are just getting started for the year. Bill Reay (Property) noted that his report falls under Old Business this month. No other reports this month.

Old Business. (a) Front Door Opening Details. Bill Reay presented the bid he received for installing automatic door openers for the front doors in the amount of \$5,310. In addition, we would need an electrician to run the wiring. Discussion was then held regarding the possibility of renovating the entire front foyer area specifically because the current doors are old and not energy efficient as well as being non-ADA compliant. It was agreed to let the congregation know that we are working on this and will keep it on the agenda as we gather more information. Bill will look into the cost of new doors and/or complete remodeling and Connie Kreuser agreed to look into energy audits and ADA funding assistance possibilities, and they will bring information back to the council. **(b) Lawnmower.** Bill Reay also reported the purchase of a used mower last month, which is working well. One of our older mower still works okay and Dale Klemp will use the other one for parts unless a member wants it. It does still run. We agreed to table any further discussion of purchasing lawn care services for now.

New Business. Consideration of Environmental Initiatives. Connie Kreuser reported that she had attended an environmental initiative at Hartford Church last week and the stewardship committee will be talking about this and discussing whether to add this to their list of goals for the future. A number of people have expressed interest and have ideas. An energy audit for the foyer could also be extended to the entire church to give ideas. For now it's a work in progress.

Adjournment. There being no further business, Bill Reay moved to adjourn the meeting, Amy Simdon seconded the motion, and it was unanimously approved.

The next meeting date will be November 14, 2023, at 7:00 p.m. at Grace and via Zoom. Amy Simdon will lead devotions. The meeting was adjourned, followed by the Lord's Prayer.




