Pastor's Ponderings

Unmasking God's Gifts

Dear Friends,

The last 8 months have been filled with fear, cancellations, and disappointments. 2020 has been the year we'd love to forget. But amid the challenges, there have been unexpected blessings for many of us. I mentioned in a letter to you how Martin Luther wrote about how God often comes to us in "masks," meaning God works through other people and situations, when we might not even see God's hand at work. That (coupled with our recent familiarity with masks) is what inspired our stewardship theme "Unmasking God's Gifts." For the last few weeks, we've been inviting folks to share their stories of blessing during this pandemic. God has truly been active bringing blessings, sometimes behind "masks" like family and friends, kind strangers, good news, and unexpected opportunities.

I've heard how families have been able to spend more time together – eating at a dinner table together more regularly. Families have spent more time outdoors together – hiking, camping, boating, and birdwatching. I've heard stories of online "Happy Hours" with faraway friends and family who we might never have connected with if COVID hadn't left us feeling disconnected and stuck at home.

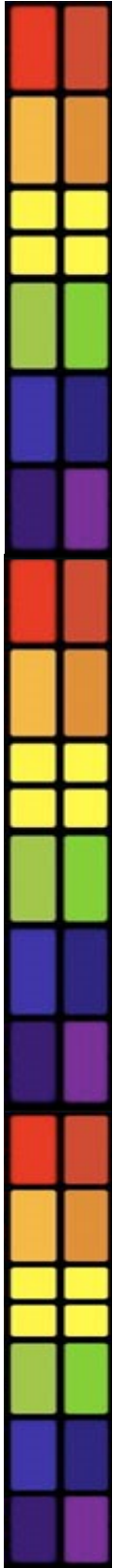
I've had similar blessings. I've enjoyed more time with my family too. Our new ping pong table supplied much-needed entertainment and plentiful laughs during quarantine. I've been able to see my children take responsibility for their online schooling, and I've been available to help when help is needed. I've enjoyed walking more and appreciating God's creation in new ways. A different rhythm to church life gave me opportunity to be creative and to collaborate with my husband's congregation, as well.

Another great blessing has been increased connection with my colleagues. In any given week, I typically spend about 3 hours in Zoom meetings with Lutheran colleagues and with our local ministerial group, which has grown to 10 of us from various Christian traditions – Lutheran, Moravian, Methodist, Presbyterian, and Catholic. We used to meet once a month in person, but we'd have maybe 4-6 people attending. Meeting via Zoom isn't the same as meeting in person, but it's much easier for us to all get together. We've gotten to know one another well. We come from different traditions and have different views on many things, but we spend time each week supporting one another, sharing ideas, learning from one another, praying and laughing together. It's truly been an oasis in the desert of this time. I've been delighted to be able to collaborate with my colleagues for several projects during the pandemic. **Our next project will be a Thanksgiving Eve service** that we'll share with you online and on local cable on November 25th at 7:00 p.m. Spending time with these Christian leaders has reassured me that the spiritual care of Cambridge and Deerfield is in great hands.

In this month of gratitude, I encourage you to look past the challenges and to try to get a glimpse of God behind the masks of those he sends into your life. God is here, God is active, God is walking beside you every day.

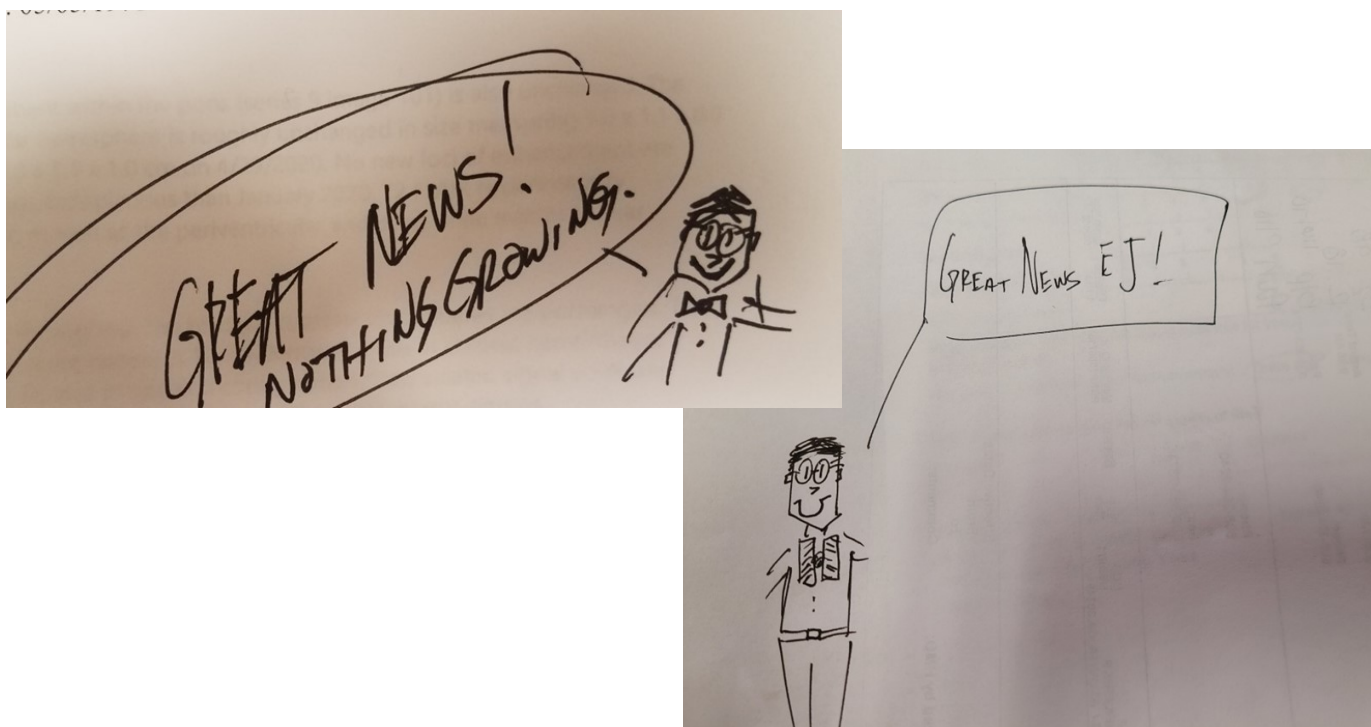
COVID Blessings by Pastor Jennifer

As you may know, my husband Erik has had cancer (originally lung, with metastasis to bones and brain) for over 10 years now. It sounds strange to find God amid a cancer diagnosis at age 38, but all along the journey, we've seen God at work in what I like to call "a Spirit thing." The fact that he was diagnosed was a blessing in itself. It was caught very much by accident, which is why he's still alive and well today. That's a Spirit thing. His surgery, chemo, and radiation in 2010 were successful. When the cancer returned in 2012, his oral chemo was effective for more than twice as long as for most people. That's a Spirit thing.

Since we've lived in Cambridge, the main treatments have been less effective, so in 2018, he went through whole brain radiation, which often comes with life-changing complications. We've seen no such complications. That's a Spirit thing.

We hoped that the next chemotherapy would be effective for a year. It's been almost 2 years, longer than any patient his doctor has known. That's a Spirit thing.

During COVID, I haven't been allowed to go to Erik's oncology appointments, which has been hard for both of us. But the news has always been good – that his cancer is "Stable." His awesome oncologist can't spend much time with him in the exam room, so he's found a fun way to tell him what his scans showed. He draws a picture of himself (complete with his typical bow tie) with the news. It's been a humorous blessing during a difficult time in a difficult situation, reminding us that God really is at work here. It's a Spirit thing.





God's Gift, Unmasked During the Pandemic

(read by Pastor Jennifer during worship, November 1st)

I worked for a UW clinic in Madison for 5 years in the Call Center. On average, we would take about 500 calls a day. We had 4 Reps in the call center, because there was always a big turnover at our clinic. Most of the clinics were going through budget cuts, and not able to hire extra staff, so we were always short-staffed. The stress level was always high and it was really challenging, both physically and mentally.

When Covid had started, patients were not able to schedule routine appointments. Our call volume dropped drastically. They weren't able to come to the clinic now, so that cut our work down tremendously. They were moving us to different locations and closing some of the clinics to consolidate others. Things started to get scary. Then, we were told we were going to have our hours cut. We knew this was likely going to happen, and I thought maybe one day, at most, a week. But, as it turned out, it was twodays a week. I now knew I would have to look for something else because I figured this may go on for some time.

I applied for several jobs, worried that I might have to take a big pay cut, the health insurance might be bad, or maybe I wouldn't even get an offer! I asked God to help me get one of those jobs. I would pray, "God, if this is the best opportunity and the right place for me to be, please open that door. If not, don't open that door, and I'll keep looking. I didn't really know what I wanted or needed, but God did. Even so, I prayed for something,

God gave me far better than I could have imagined! I did receive a phone call from another care facility in Madison, and not in a Call Center. This place is amazing! The people are great, the stress is gone, and I feel amazing! God brought me to Agrace Hospice Care.

All we really need is to trust in the Lord with all our heart, acknowledge him in all our ways, rest in peace, wait for him patiently, & rejoice in Him always. He will bring you the desires of your heart.

October 13, 2020 Via Zoom from Home during Pandemic

(Minutes below are not approved until next month's Council meeting)

Meeting called to order 7:31 p.m. by President, Steve Geis **Attendees:** Steve Geis, Tim Neuenschwander, Amy Simdon, Tom Kosanda, Mary Behling, Jean Scott, Kris Tobias, Ann Engelstad, Pastor Jennifer, Lori Jensen. Excused. Erik Olson & Amanda Kosanda.

Devotions: Kris Tobias offered devotions.

Approval of September Minutes: Lori Jensen moved to approve the September Minutes. Jean Scott seconded; they were unanimously approved.

Consent Agenda- Jean Scott thanked Lori and John Jensen for transporting 45 boxes of quilts, school kits and other projects to the train station last month. Amy Simdon noted that the stewardship campaign has begun with the slogan "Unmasking God's Gifts". They are looking for stories and/or videos of positive things people have learned or gained through the pandemic. Lori Jensen noted that it is Pastor Appreciation Month and thanked Pastor Jennifer for all she does. She also noted that Hospitality is putting together 3 gifts for the Confirmands. No other committees met last month.

Property Report- Tom Kosanda stated that the sensors from Church Mutual aren't connecting to the public Wi-Fi and go off frequently, for no reason. Pastor Jennifer will get him the password for the private Wi-Fi. The Little Library repair is progressing.

Treasurer's Report- Tim Neuenschwander reported that income in September was in line with July levels. We had a net income of just over \$1200 for September and still have net income for the year. He talked to Hometown Bank, but there is no procedure for applying for loan forgiveness yet. A couple of coverage values were increased in the new insurance policy, but they seem reasonable to all. Amy Simdon moved to approve the Treasurer's Report. Kris Tobias seconded the motion; it was unanimously approved.

Pastor's Report-

Three confirmands will be taking part in the upcoming Confirmation Service. The in-church baptism went well. Pastor will be gone October 29th-Nov. 1, but will record worship early. The office is collecting names and photos for All Saints' Day. The pastor is also scheduling new member "classes" online for those persons willing to partake in a Zoom meeting and is attempting to talk with those persons who aren't able or willing to do so. They will be received online when approved by Council. Some area churches have started reporting member deaths from Covid-19. No spreads have been reported from services. Pastor is still meeting with the Confirmation students in person, for now.

New Business:

Worship-

Outdoor Worship: It was agreed that we should continue to offer outdoor worship every other week, as long as possible. It has gotten too cold for Judy Brandt to continue providing music for the outdoor service, but Ann Engelstad volunteered to take her place, starting this Sunday. It will be up to Ann & Pastor to determine how long such services can continue.

Thanksgiving service: Pastor is talking to other local clergy about offering a joint Thanksgiving service that could be broadcast to the general public. Grace would probably be in the best position to host this.

Advent/Christmas thoughts: Pastor indicated she will be putting together a committee to discuss how to handle Advent and Christmas services. Anyone with ideas is encouraged to bring them up. Punsels have advised that they will not be able to supply a Christmas tree this year, so other ideas are being sought, as well. It was also requested that we not yet entirely give up on the possibility of holding in-church services in December.

Confirmation- Three confirmands will be participating in the in-church confirmation service. After some discussion, we agreed that each confirmand will be limited to 10 guests.

Sanitation Supplies Warning- We have received a warning from Church Mutual regarding some reports of volunteers having accidents and being injured using cleaning supplies due to not following product instructions.

Employee Insurance- It is time for the renewal of Pastor Jennifer's health insurance. She would like to continue with the current plan, the Gold Plus Package. Amy Simdon moved to approve such insurance package. Ann Engelstad seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved.

2021 Committee Budgets- Budget requests should be in by next month's meeting. Tim will ask Diane to provide information to the committee chairs regarding the budgets for the last two years and the amount remaining in each budget for planning purposes.

Collaboration- Discussion was held regarding how to get and keep people involved, and what more could be done.

Old Business: None

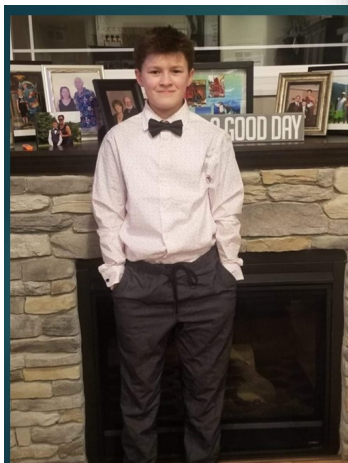
Adjournment: Next meeting will be November 10 at 7:30 p.m. at Grace if possible and, if not, by Zoom again.

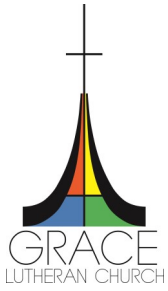
