# **Pastor's Ponderings**



November 1 is called "All Saints' Day," or "All Hallows Day", which is how Halloween got its name – "All Hallows Evening." Each year on the first Sunday in November, we remember all of those who have passed away in the last year, and we celebrate their salvation in Christ. We also think about how this "communion of saints" has shaped us and helped bring us to faith. This year's All Saints' Sunday, I'll be thinking of at least 2 special saints who have entered

God's eternal kingdom in the last year.

Terry Fretheim was my very favorite seminary professor. He taught Old Testament and really opened my mind, helping me to better understand God and how God has interacted with his people throughout the centuries. I was blessed to have Dr. Fretheim preach at my ordination in 2000, and I was fortunate to run into him several times after that. He was a giant of the faith and a true blessing to the church. From Dr. Fretheim I learned that what we do affects God, so although the things we do don't save us, what we do matters.

Walt Wangerin was famous in Christian circles for his many books and articles and for his Lutheran Vespers talks. But I knew him as a professor when I was in college. He taught a couple writing classes and the Gospel of John. My favorite memory is when he talked about the Mary who anointed Jesus' feet and dried them with her hair. He was trying to help us picture the scene describing the woman and her long hair. He said, "Now, her hair wasn't short or neat. It was long, full, and wild..." and his eyes quickly scanned the room and landed on me and he shouted, "Like hers!" It was an awkward, awesome moment. Walt could preach a 25-minute sermon that felt like no time at all. From Walt I learned the power of storytelling and how you can paint vivid pictures with words.

In the last two years in particular, it's seemed that death has felt closer than ever. It's been heavy and difficult. As a result, I've noticed that many people have tried to wave off their grief, to only remember happy things or to just move on as if nothing was lost. But grief is important. Grief is an expression of love, an acknowledgment that something was lost. Remembering our loved ones who are gone is important. It's so vital to honor our losses, for our own well-being and so we can support others in their loss. There are so many people who have shaped us into the people we are today, and taking some time to ponder what they taught us can be profoundly healing and inspiring. So this All Saints' Day, I encourage you to do just that. Light a candle, remember a loved one who helped make you who you are, and give thanks for that person's life and for their new life in Christ. And may God's Spirit bring you comfort, peace, and reassurance in the life-giving grace of God.








# **Monthly Treasurer's Report**

Based on the income and expenses reported in September, our church operated at a net loss of (\$2,737.18) last month. We have seen a decrease in General Giving the past two months, as well as a slowdown in contributions to the Renewing Grace campaign. As it stands, we have enough general cash-on-hand to make expenses, but may need to draw off our line of credit at Hometown Bank, if monthly shortfalls continue. We also have enough cash restricted to the Renewing Grace campaign to make 10 months of debt payments, but we are short of paying off

the principal balance of our loan by more than \$8,000 at this time. We are hopeful for a strong end to the fiscal year – as giving typically picks up around the holiday season – but it is never too early to fulfill annual pledges to help the church meet its ongoing obligations.

### **GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES**

October 12, 2021 Via Zoom from Home (Minutes below aren't approved until next month's meeting)

<u>Call to Order</u>. Meeting called to order by President Steve Geis at 7:30 p.m.

<u>Attendance</u>. Steve Geis, Amanda Kosanda, Tom Kosanda, , Mary Behling, Jennifer Hellberg, Shawn Whitman, Kris Tobias, Tim Neuenschwander, Ann Engelstad, and Pastor Jennifer Jelinek. In addition, Jean Scott appeared later in the meeting. **Devotions.** Pastor Jennifer offered a prayer to open the meeting.

**Approval of September Minutes.** Ann Engelstad moved to approve the Minutes, Jennifer Hellberg seconded the motion, and they were unanimously approved.

Consent Agenda. Reports were submitted for Stewardship, Hospitality and Worship committees and reviewed by Council. In addition, Jennifer Hellberg reported that Venmo seems to be up and running. There appears to be a little confusion about Venmo vs. Vanco, so they will work on an explanatory flyer and some upgrades to the pew placards. The Sunday School giving program is going well. Bill Becker will be doing an upcoming Temple Talk instead of Janet Koeppel. Ann Engelstad reported that there had been a very good Worship committee meeting last Sunday and fall and winter plans are progressing well.

<u>Property Report.</u> Tommy Kosanda reported that the new garbage disposal has been installed and all planned painting has been completed. Pastor Jennifer reported that the thermostat still isn't turning the air conditioning or heat on by itself. She has been setting it manually basically since it was installed. With the return to in-person worship, we should really contact Richter so she doesn't have to go into church early just for that purpose during the winter. Finally, Pira and Michael have completed redoing the Little Library.

Treasurer's Report. Tim Neuenschwander provided his reports and summary. He noted that September revenue was down month over month again, mainly due to a significant decline in special giving in September. That was somewhat offset by decreased expenses for special giving. Regardless, there was a net loss for the month. We have cash, but only \$3,000 is undesignated. It is not critical yet, but if it continues, we may have to draw on the Line of Credit for daily expenses. He indicated that the Renewing Grace campaign time period has ended and we did not reach the goal. We have designated funds on hand to make ten more payments, but if we use all of the funds we have on hand, we will still be \$8,000 short. We also need to start raising funds for Pastor's future sabbatical. We could need as much as \$30,000 for her expenses and guest pastors during that time, although we should be able to count on giving continuing during her absence to offset some of that. Currently, we have less than \$1,000 set aside for this purpose. We agreed to have Diane Russo put something simple together regarding income and expenses for us to review and then put in the monthly newsletter or post in the church somewhere so people are aware that giving is down. Tim further reported that he will get budget request forms out to the committees and start working on the 2022 budget in early November. Lastly, it is time to renew Pastor's health insurance plan. She is happy to stay on the Gold Plan. We split the cost thereof with Erik's congregation. Jennifer Hellberg moved to approve the Gold Plan, Ann Engelstad seconded it, and it was unanimously approved.

<u>Pastor's Report.</u> October 16 is First Communion Sunday for the fifth graders. They and their families will receive communion at the rail. On October 24, 4 students will be confirmed. Kosandas offered to bring in some canopies to be set up in case of bad weather for the cake and coffee thereafter. On October 31, Pastor will be on vacation. Instead of a guest pastor, she is writing a monologue that Virginia will read as Martin Luther's wife. She reported that Sunday School has been switched to 10:00 since church is generally completed by 9:45 now. Everyone is invited to send in pictures of family or friends who died last year for the Remembrance Sunday service in November. She also noted that the community dinner for November, which Grace was to host, has been cancelled due to Covid. Lastly, she mentioned that we are losing the good weather for having outdoor coffee hour after church. Discussion was held regarding future plans and it was decided to continue with outside coffee hour for one more month if possible.

New Business. Ann Engelstad reported that they are discussing starting up choir towards Advent. She is looking into some special masks developed for singers by the UW and is looking into a variety of special music presenters, CDs, etc. Shawn Whitman reported that Virginia was approached by a representative for Cambridge County Christmas to see if Grace would be interested in presenting a live nativity. It would involve two-hour shifts for the performers and an 8-minute script to perform several times during each shift. Virginia is willing to coordinate the costumes and Shawn is willing to coordinate the volunteers, flyers, etc. He feels this will be a good project for the Evangelism committee and Council agreed. We have also been approached about donating items or cash to the Food Pantry for holiday baskets as we have done in the past. It was agreed that Virginia should let them know that we are willing to participate this year as well.

Old Business. None. Adjournment. There being no further business, a motion was made to adjourn the meeting, was seconded, and was unanimously approved. Next meeting will be November 9, 2021, at 7:30 p.m., via Zoom unless decided otherwise. Amanda Kosanda will provide devotions. The meeting was adjourned, followed by the Lord's Prayer. Report submitted by Mary Behling, Council Secretary.


