One of the things I love most about being a pastor is the fact that I get to be a part of many families' milestone events. I've held babies in hospital rooms the very day

they've been born. I get to baptize children and welcome them into God's family. I get to see the wonder on the faces of our kids receiving communion for the first time. I spend substantial time with our middle schoolers in preparation for the day when I place my hand upon their head and bless them as they affirm their baptismal promises. I see the tears in the eyes of brides and grooms as they marry one another. I get to hold hands and say prayers with people in the hospital. And I get to help celebrate the lives of our dear ones who pass away, comforting their families and rejoicing in the promise of eternal life that means so much in those moments. What a blessing it is to be part of those milestones.


This month, we'll celebrate 2 milestones with our youth. We'll welcome five 5th graders to the table for the first time, and we'll see our 9th graders affirm their baptismal promises. This time, one of those confirmands will be my confirmand. It's one of the few times the roles of mother and pastor intersect in a beautiful and powerful way. I always teach that Confirmation Sunday isn't a graduation; it's a commitment to continue growing in faith and in relationship with God. That's why it's such a special day. It's a day when our young people are taking responsibility for their own faith and saying "Yes" to God as God said, "Yes" to them at their baptisms. Confirmation is really a new beginning, a milestone commemorating the start of Christian adulthood.

It seems like all the faith-related milestones are finished by the time we grow up. We rarely have faith-related milestones as adults, do we? But that doesn't mean that faith formation and faith development aren't just as important as adults. We all need God, and all relationships change and grow over time. What are you doing to grow in your relationship with God? What would you like to try? Maybe try attending a Bible study, join our e-mail prayer chain and pray for people, commit to reading a book of the Bible, keep a God journal, writing down ways you notice God active around you.

You may not have the opportunity to affirm your faith in front of the whole congregation, but you do have the opportunity to commit time to growing in faith and setting milestones for yourself. And please let me know how I can help.



Bishop Peter Rogness

Interim Bishop Named

The South-Central Synod of Wisconsin Council is pleased to announce that they have affirmed the appointment by Presiding Bishop Eaton of Peter Rogness as the Interim Bishop. Bishop Rogness will begin on September 26th and will serve until July 31, 2020.

Rogness is a graduate of Augustana College in Sioux Falls, SD, and Luther Seminary in St. Paul, MN. Upon graduation he served two Milwaukee parishes, the longest being ten years at Hephatha Lutheran Church. In 1985 he was elected bishop of the Southern Wisconsin District of the former America Lutheran Church, with offices in Madison. With the advent of the ELCA in 1988, he served as bishop of the Greater Milwaukee Synod for the maximum three terms, until 2002. That year he was elected bishop of the Saint Paul Area Synod, where he served until his retirement in 2014.

Since that time, he has served two interim positions in international English-speaking congregations related to the ELCA, first in Oslo, Norway, and most recently in Bratislava, Slovakia.

Peter and his wife Gerry have four adult children and four grandchildren. They reside in St. Paul, when they're not at their lake cabin in northern Minnesota.

"I look forward to being a part of the life of this synod for the next 10 months. I don't feel entirely a stranger, since I served this territory now over 30 years ago and served your neighboring synod for 14 years. But much has changed, and I've appreciated the conversations I've already had as we've talked about how my role here can help lay a good foundation for the next chapter in the life of this synod. I will meet many of you at the Bishop's Convocation in October and will also seek to be in the conferences of this synod for further conversations. I am both hopeful and confident that these next months will bring good movement of the Spirit in our midst. Thank you for the invitation to serve."

Please hold Bishop Rogness and the synod staff in your prayers during this time of transition.


ONE YEAR LATER

In September 2018, Hurricane Florence struck the Carolinas and surrounding states with dangerous winds, storm surge and extensive flooding. Many coastal cities experienced more than 20 inches of rain. The hurricane caused more than 50 deaths, displaced thousands of people from their homes and caused billions of dollars in damage.

Then, in October, Hurricane Michael made landfall as a powerful Category 5 hurricane with winds over 150 miles per hour, striking several states including Florida, Alabama, Georgia and South Carolina. More than 30 people died, and Mexico Beach and Panama City were devastated. The storm caused major damage from extreme winds and storm surge.

You responded to these disasters with generosity. Thanks to you and other Lutheran Disaster Response supporters, people whose lives were interrupted by these disasters have been connected with crucial support — from emergency relief supplies to emotional and spiritual care, as well as the repair and rebuilding of their damaged homes. Jail Ministry Chaplain Visiting Pastor- October 13

Chaplain Todd has been serving the Dane County Jail in a variety of ways for the last 4 years. He started out as a volunteer who came in once a month to lead chapel services and now is the full-time lead chaplain who oversees a team of 30 volunteers. When MAJM pioneered a program of using volunteer clergy to reach out to specific pods within the jail, Chaplain Todd was the first candidate to be approved in the program.

A desire to provide hope and encouragement to those experiencing the crisis of incarceration led Chaplain Todd into jail ministry. He brings a unique perspective from having had two adult children whose journey through addiction and mental health issues led them to their own encounters with the criminal justice system. Through a ministry of presence, Chaplain Todd hopes to help others find a spiritual pathway to freedom.

Emergency Beam Repair

Next time you enter or leave the church past the kitchen entrance, take a look outside and around either corner at the dark brown beams under the roof. There are two beams, one on each side of the fellowship hall that have serious issues with rotting wood. In the past we had issues with leaking eaves in those areas. Due to the leaks the wood has rotted and concerns over the future structural integrity of the beams have begun. We asked our roofing contractor to look at the problem and propose a fix. Following their recommendation, we have hired a contractor to remove the damaged portion of the rotting beams and surrounding soffit, attach new material, and paint to match the other beams to the best of their ability. These concerns with the structural integrity of the beams need to be addressed and can not be deferred as the problem will only grow more substantial over time.

Their estimate for the repair is \$8,500 but they warned us that the damage may be more extensive than what we can see from the exterior. Of course this unexpected expense is not in our budget, but hopefully we can finish the year with your strong financial support and avoid another fundraising campaign.


