Pastor's Ponderings



What is a Sabbatical? I think most of us have heard the word "sabbatical," usually referring to substantial paid time off taken by professors and others in academia. But did you know that "Sabbatical" is based in the Bible? The root word of Sabbatical is "sabbath," literally "seventh," referring to the seventh day of the week when God rested from his labors in creating the universe. In the

3rd commandment, God commanded his people to "honor the Sabbath to keep it holy." In other words, God calls us to weekly take time of rest and renewal, time to focus on our families and our relationships with God.

But also in Scripture, there's a sabbath for the land. Every seven years, God's people were called to observe a sabbath for the land, to let their fields lay fallow, to let the land rest for a year. You might imagine the people would be concerned that they'd not have enough food, but after God provided in the wilderness for 40 years, they'd come to trust him. And to their delight, the Israelites learned that leaving their fields fallow for a year, to leave their orchards and vineyards unharvested, helped improve their soil and future crops greatly. Even the land benefits from a time of rest and renewal.

And that's where the concept of "Sabbatical" comes from. In the last 30 years, it's become much more common to offer sabbaticals to pastors about every 7 years, just as many college professors are offered sabbaticals every 7 years. This sabbatical time can be spent in various ways, but it usually includes substantial time for rest and reflection, in addition to study and experiences we might not have otherwise. It's a time when the pastor takes time away from the congregation, usually for about 3 months, in hopes of returning recharged and ready for continued ministry together.

Believe it or not, this month marks my 7th year at Grace. Time flies when we're having fun! At Grace's Annual Meeting in January, you approved a Sabbatical Policy, and the Church Council has affirmed and supported plans for me to take a 3-month Sabbatical next summer. I applied for a Sabbatical Grant from the Lilly Foundation to help support my sabbatical and Grace's ministries, and I should be hearing whether or not I've received the grant in the very near future.

We'll be talking more about this sabbatical in the coming months. I'm grateful and excited for this opportunity, not just for me to have some time for renewal, but for Grace to have renewal opportunities as well. We've got a wonderful Sabbatical Team that will help to guide us so this can be a fruitful experience of growth for all of us.




Office Hours



COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

August 10, 2023, at Pastor Jennifer's home

(Minutes below not approved until next Council meeting)

Call to Order. Meeting called to order by President Kelly Witte at 7:00 p.m.

Attendance. Present: Kelly Witte, Bob Koepp, Connie Kreuser, Ann Engelstad, Mary Behling, April Mickelson, Bill Reay, Bill Becker, Peggy Punsel, Shawn Whitman and Pastor Jennifer Jelinek Absent: Amy Simdon.

Devotions. Bill Becker presented devotions.

Approval of July Minutes. Bill Becker moved to approve the July minutes as written, Ann Engelstad seconded the motion, and the minutes were unanimously approved.

Approval of Agenda. Peggy Punsel moved to approve the Agenda as presented, Mary Behling seconded the Motion, and it was unanimously approved.

Correspondence. No new correspondence.

Treasurer's Report. (a) Financial Report. Amy Simdon was not present but provided the reports and her financial narrative for all to review. Highlights included that we had a net loss of \$7,308.27 in July due mainly to the synod offering for May and June and the June benefits all being paid in July. As of July 31, the year-to-date General Giving is almost \$1,000 more than this time last year, but we are about \$1,400 below budget. Special Giving is about \$3,800 below last year's year-to-date figures and \$5,000 under budget for the year. The result is that total giving is \$2,800 less than last year as of July 31 and \$16,000 under budget. Year-to-date income through the end of July is about \$4,000 less than 2023, mostly due to lower Special Giving. Finally, the checking account balance decreased by over \$7,000 compared to the end of June and the general funds in that account (those not designated for a special purpose) decreased by \$8,000. Bill Becker moved to approve the treasurer's report and send it to audit, Kelly Witte seconded the motion, and it was unanimously approved.

Pastor's Report. Surgery went well and she has returned to work. Next July there will be a Youth Gathering in New Orleans. This is for 8th graders through high school. In addition, there will be a Young Adult Gathering at the same time for 18-35 year old persons. Pastor will be sending out specific invites to the young adults who didn't get to attend a Youth Gathering due to covid. They will all be flying instead of going on buses this time. Fundraising will start soon. Confirmation will be starting in September as will Sunday School. Breah Klemp has a new curriculum and is looking for only one more teacher (for 3rd and 4th graders). Lastly, monthly staff meetings have started again after the covid hiatus.

Committee Reports. Bill Reay (Property) reported that he is still looking for more volunteers to mow the church lawn. A sign-up sheet is in the narthex. One mower is out of commission at this time. Connie Kreuser (Stewardship) reported that the rummage sale held last weekend went very well. They had a lot of good help and good promotional activity and it was well attended. They raised almost \$1,400, 1/2 of which will be donated to CART and 1/2 of which will be given to the Youth Group.

St. Vincent took away all of the left-overs and the committee felt they learned some good things for next year's sale. Bill Becker (Education) reported that we have about 30 students signed up for Sunday School. April Mickelson (Outreach) reported that they are continuing to promote the baby care kits and school kits with the goal of having them assembled and ready to ship in September. They are considering Good Gifts for our holiday giving. They have committed to the local Blue Jay Backpack project in January. The Cambridge Food Pantry partners with the Cambridge School District to provide backpacks with healthy snacks and easily prepared meals for weekends and holidays when school is not in session. Additional churches in the area are also committing to a month to assist. Shawn Whitman (Evangelism) reported that a group has been formed to schedule taking communion to shut-ins. He thanked Pastor Jennifer for leading the group in starting this service again.

Old Business. (a) Breeze (Church Records Software). Catherine met with representatives from Breeze to sign up for September as approved by the council last month. Instead, they offered us three free months, so she signed up immediately. They will start transferring church records immediately.

New Business. (a) Sunday School Event Requests. Peggy Punsel reported that she had been asked by Breah Klemp if the Hospitality Committee could provide special treats (tokens or food treats) for children attaining Milestones. Everyone agreed that she could do so as long as she could fit it into the Hospitality Committee and could work with the Educational Committee and Breah on those matters.

(b) Sewing Retreat - Barb. April had further information from the quilting group about their proposed Sewing Retreat. They would like to hold that October 24-27 from 9 a.m. - 5p.m. They would invite the community to come in for several days of crafting, sewing, quilting, or whatever people chose, to work on whatever project they choose in a community setting. They will offer a potluck lunch. The church will supply some supplies and people can bring their own sewing machine and other supplies as well. The council reviewed their proposal and agreed that this would be a good kind of outreach project. In addition, the quilting group would like to have a "Little Dresses for Africa" workshop in connection with the Christian non-profit group of the same name. They proposed three days in mid-October, with the first two days being devoted to cutting and sewing and the third day being devoted to embellishing the dresses. The council also reviewed this proposal and, again, felt this was a great outreach project both in terms of inviting the community and in terms of the project. Pastor Jennifer was asked to let Barb know that these proposals were approved and to work with Barb on the specific times and other details to get these set up.

Adjournment. There being no further business, Bob Koepp moved to adjourn the meeting, Bill Reay seconded the motion, and it was unanimously approved.

The next meeting date will be September 12, 2023, at 7:00 p.m. at Grace and via Zoom. Mary Behling will lead devotions. The meeting was adjourned, followed by the Lord's Prayer.
