GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES August 13, 2024

(Minutes will be reviewed & approved at next Council meeting)

Call to Order. President Kelly Witte called the meeting to order at 7:04 PM.

Attendance. Present: John Jensen, Bob Koepp, Charlene Luchterhand, April Mickelson, Kristin Rue, Pr. Linda Schumacher, Pr. Loren Schumacher, Amy Simdon, Kelly Witte. Absent: Sandi Aston Hall, Connie Kreuser, Pr. Jennifer Jelinek, Peggy Punsel, Richard Scott, Shawn Whitman.

Devotions. Pr. Loren led devotions in the sanctuary based on the labyrinth.

Approval of Minutes. Amy moved to approve the June meeting minutes. John seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Approval of Agenda. The agenda was amended to table the item "Ideas for Realigning Duties" under Old Business until September and to add the topic of "Sunday School Funds" to New Business. John moved to approve the amended agenda. Amy seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Correspondence. None

Treasurer's Report. (Amy) Amy presented both the June and July budgets. While we have had a net loss, it is not alarming as the budget reflects funds that were donated in previous years, but not expended until recently. Following are July highlights. We had a net loss of \$7,723.84 in July and a net loss of \$1,573.44 for the year. Our year-to-date (YTD) General Giving at the end of July was \$5,428 higher than 2023 and \$2,086 over the YTD budget. YTD Special Giving was \$6,377 more than last year and \$5,591 more than budget. Our YTD expenses were \$60,724 more than last year. If we didn't include our one-time expenses of the sabbatical, Youth Gathering, and the door project, our expenses would be \$1,351 less than last year. We are \$27,874 over our budget due to those same one-time expenses. YTD net ordinary income would be about +\$395 if the sabbatical grant and expenses are not included. This is about \$10,235 less than last year at the end of June. The checking balance was \$7,973 less than the end of June with the general fund balance approximately \$7,200 less. Kristin moved to approve this treasurer's report and send it to audit. John seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Pastor's Report. (Prs. Linda & Loren) The pastors and council expressed mutual appreciation. Pastors Linda and Loren shared that they enjoyed the opportunity to serve our congregation, appreciated the openness of the congregation to new ideas, such as the labyrinth, felt renewed, and praised the council. Kelly read a note of appreciation and thanks from our congregation, which was given to the pastors along with a gift certificate to the Cambridge Market Café.

Committee Reports. (Provided in writing and/or discussed in the meeting as needed.) **Education.** (Kristin) Vacation Bible School was cancelled due to low enrollment and not enough people to teach. The committee is working through ideas for next year. Planning is underway for Sunday School in the fall; a teacher meeting will be held this Thursday.

They have been painting and updating the classrooms and hallway. Some rooms have been re allocated, so they are all closer together. They have two questions: 1) Can the cost of paint come from another source? 2) Can the dehumidifier in the hallway with a cord into a classroom be moved? (See New Business).

Sabbatical Team Report. (Bob) Pastor Jennifer's stole will be returned to her on August 25. Cake and balloons are planned for that day. Pastor and her family will host a dinner for the congregation on September 8.

Old Business. Ideas for Realigning Duties. No discussion. Tabled until next meeting.

New Business. Bank First Line of Credit. Amy noted that she heard from the bank that this is due. She questioned if it is still needed. Following discussion, Bob moved that if there is no cost for the renewal, we will renew. If there is a cost, but we learn that there is an advantage to leaving it open, e.g., a locked-in lower rate, we will also leave it open. If there is a cost and no advantage to leaving it open, we will let the line of credit lapse. John seconded the motion. Unanimously approved. If it is left open, signers will remain the same: John Jensen, Richard Scott, and Amy Simdon.

Health Insurance for Pastor. She currently has a Gold Plus Policy. Cost will be increasing and will affect the 2025 budget. In the past, the cost has been shared with Erik Jelinek's church. More information is needed regarding the family's plans for coverage. Discussion tabled for next meeting.

Sunday School Rearrangement. The possible movement of the dehumidifier has been referred to the Property Committee, who will report back at our next meeting. The rearrangement of classrooms also led to the issue of safety of the Sunday School rooms. This is an important topic to be addressed at a future meeting. Pr. Linda suggested we might find guidelines at the South Central Synod office and Lutherdale.

Sunday School Funds. Cost for the paint used in the Sunday School rooms will be allocated to the Property Committee rather than come from the Education budget.

Adjournment. Amy moved to adjourn the meeting. Char seconded the motion. Unanimously approved. Meeting adjourned. We ended with the Lord's Prayer.

Next Meeting. Our next meeting will be held on Tuesday, September 10 at 7:00 PM. Shawn is scheduled to present devotions.




