Traditionally at Grace, we'd be organizing service projects to offer for you to take part in on Sunday, September 13. Of course, COVID-19 has made "traditional" things difficult or impossible this year. But through these challenging months, we've found new and creative ways to do important things, haven't we? COVID can prevent us from gathering, but it can't stop us from serving God and others, in new and creative ways. Serving is a part of who we are as Lutheran Christians, whether we serve together or serve apart. God works through our hands no matter what.

So this month, I encourage you to have your own "God's Work, Our Hands Sunday." Choose a day, whether it be September 13 or another day this month, and devote it to serving others or serving the community in some way. Help a neighbor, pick up trash, send cards of encouragement and appreciation, bake for first responders, put together care kits, or do anything else that you feel called to do to serve others or your community. And please take pictures of what you do, and share them with us at Grace via e-mail to the office. Seeing how our serving hands are working this month will undoubtedly touch and inspire one another.

Outdoor and Physically-distanced Service Projects

Identify members in your congregation or community who could use some help with yard work. Then roll up your sleeves and get to work with activities such as:

- Lawn mowing
- Window washing
- Raking
- Chopping wood
- Clearing brush
- Painting
- Weeding
- Planting
- Washing cars
- Clearing gutters

Pick up litter to care for creation and beautify your community.

As church, we are guided by our life in Christ to share the love of Jesus and serve our neighbors — even if such acts of service look different this year.

This year our church — and our world — are living through the COVID-19 pandemic. Physical distancing has changed the way we worship and serve. But the need is still great, and **God's church is our work**. Here are some service project ideas you could do from home (or think up your own service project!):

Drive-through Service

Deliver groceries to folks who aren't able to go out.
Ask them to supply a list, or arrange to fetch a curbside-pickup order on their behalf. Drop off a home-cooked meal or bring over a take-out order. Be sure to inquire about allergies and dietary restrictions ahead of time.

Fill the Food Pantry Shelves

Gather donations of food or hygiene products from friends or neighbors.
Check with the food pantry about specific needs. Contact the Cambridge Food Pantry to arrange a drop off time.

Meal delivery

Arrange for meal deliveries from restaurants. Place an order on behalf of anyone in your community who could use a meal, and coordinate with them ahead of time about what they would like from the menu. Be sure to inquire about allergies and dietary restrictions.

Signs of positivity

Create or order lawn signs with a positive message.

Call, video chat, Zoom in

Call or video-call seniors or those who are homebound or isolated. Include the whole family by doing things such as:

- Reading books to children (or having them read to you!)
- Playing "show and tell" with items nearby
- Playing an online game together
- Sharing favorite memories of your church community

Post your compassion

Write cards or letters, or send care packages. Every community has people who are always ready to serve. Express your gratitude for emergency workers, teachers, frontline healthcare workers, postal and delivery workers, those in the military and all essential workers, or remembering members of your church.

Advocate

Engage with ELCA Advocacy on a range of topics and initiatives:

- Advance voting rights through ELCA Votes.
- Take action on racial justice through items on the ELCA Anti-Racism Pledge.
- Write letters to your elected representative using these templates.
- Visit the ELCA Advocacy Action Center to send messages directly to your representatives on vital issues affecting our communities.

Prayer partnering

Coordinate and participate in a 24-hour prayer chain. Members of your congregation can sign up for 30-minute increments around the clock to pray for a world in need.

Reach out to those who speak a different language

Start a conversation partnership with someone learning English as a second language. Reach out to a local organization that supports immigrants and refugees, and offer to participate in video calls.

Personal care kindness

Pack hygiene kits for people experiencing homelessness.

OUTREACH and SOCIAL JUSTICE

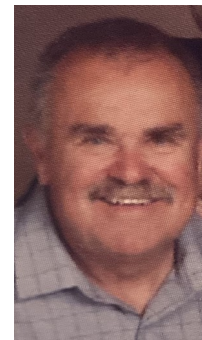

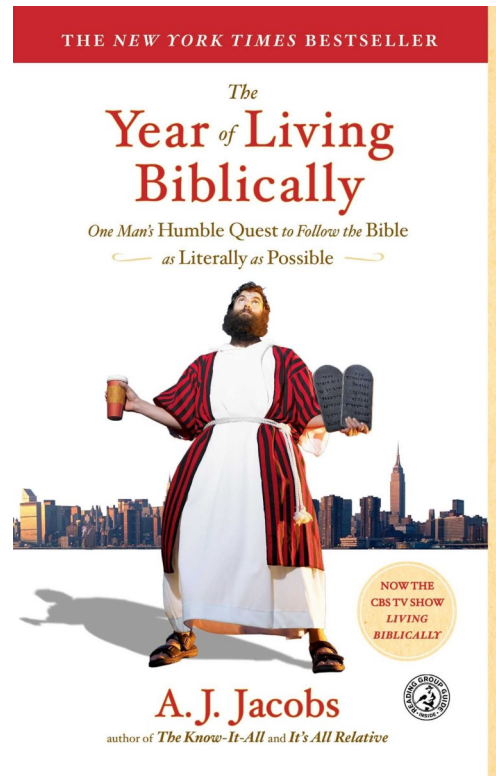

GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

August 11, 2020 Via Zoom from Home during Quarantine

Meeting called to order by President Steve Geis at 7:35 p.m. **Attendees.** Steve Geis, Tim Neuenschwander, Erik Olsen, Amy Simdon, Amanda Kosanda, Tom Kosanda, Mary Behling, Jean Scott, and Jennifer Jelinek. Kris Tobias, Lori Jensen & Ann Engelstad were excused.

Devotions Ann Engelstad was scheduled for devotions but was unable to attend at the last minute, so we shared our week and Pastor Jennifer offered a prayer.

Approval of July Minutes

Jean Scott moved to approve the July Minutes as written, Tim Neuenschwander seconded, and they were unanimously approved.

Consent Agenda

Jean Scott reported that the Outreach Committee is continuing to make quilts with a goal of 90-95 quilts. They are continuing to collect items for school kits until the second Sunday in September. No other committees met last month.

Property Report

Tom Kosanda stated that he is continuing to work on coordinating a group to paint the beams.

Treasurer's Report

Income was down about \$5500 in July, but expenses were down as well, so there was still a slight net income for the month. Net income for the year is still up over \$47,000. Renewing Grace contributions have declined, but are still coming in. The Bank has notified him that they are starting to look at applications for forgiveness of the PPP loan. There is no rush yet as the deadline is 10/31/20. Amy Simdon asked about making a payment on the Renewing Grace loan, but Tim recommended that we wait until the PPP loan decision is made. Amy Simdon moved to approve the Treasurer's Report, Amanda Kosanda seconded the motion, and it was unanimously approved.

Pastor's Report

Pastor Jennifer will be on a short vacation on Wednesday 8/12 and will be back on Sunday 8/16. She wondered if we should consider scheduling another outside service, as the last one went well. We agreed she should look at another one in a couple of weeks. She will be starting a new 6-week book study soon on The Year of Living Biblically. Grace Gab has moved outside on Tuesdays and there are some new attendees. She and Theresa Neuenschwander will be doing Zoom meetings soon with Sunday School parents. The returning and new Confirmation students would like to meet in person, so they will be figuring that out. Confirmation is set for October 25th and Pastor Jennifer is working on how to accommodate that – split services, a separate service for them and their families, other ideas? She received a letter from Church Mutual regarding necessary record keeping for workers' compensation purposes which she will give to Tim to review. The National Youth Gathering has been postponed a year until 2022. A new bishop will be elected August 29th.

Old Business

Discussion was held regarding the PPP loan and the gift that has been offered, the conditions of repayment, possible penalties, etc. It was agreed that we would wait to vote until we can have the full Council available to discuss this. Regathering Guidelines. There are really no changes in Wisconsin's situation or the data at this time. Pastor indicated that she is not receiving much pressure to open lately, so we will just continue with our preparations. Judy Brandt has requested that the choir be able to sing as soon as possible, but we agreed that that possibility does not seem to exist, at this time.

New Business

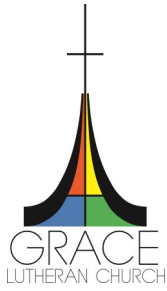
A request has been made to use church property for giving private lessons. After much discussion, Amy Simdon made a motion to allow certain limited lessons, but the motion died for lack of a second. Tom Kosanda then made a motion to not allow any non-church-related extra-curricular activities in the church at this time. Erik Olsen seconded the motion, and it was passed. Steve Geis will pass the Council's decision on to the person who made the request.

Adjournment

Next meeting will be September 8 at 7:30 p.m. at Grace if possible and, if not, by Zoom again.

There being no further business, Jean Scott moved to adjourn. Amy Simdon seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously, followed by the Lord's Prayer. Jean Scott is scheduled for September devotions.
