




Jessie's parents told her that she could have her own garden in the back yard. She could plant anything she wanted. But it would be her responsibility to take care of the garden – to water it, weed it, and to harvest it when it was time. I remember thinking that was the coolest thing – to have your very own garden, like a real grown-up. I was so excited to watch Jessie's garden grow from seed to harvest.

But I had no idea how much time and energy it would take to take care of Jessie's little garden. Jessie was a very responsible gardener. I'd get impatient sometimes, wanting to play, but she'd say, "I can't play until I take care of my garden. My parents gave it to me, the plants are my responsibility, and I want to do a good job." By the end of the summer, Jessie had a beautiful garden, filled with gorgeous sweet corn, tomatoes, cucumbers, and pumpkins. It was amazing to see what began as tiny seeds turn into wheelbarrows full of crops, because of my friend's hard work in partnership with God's creation.

This fall, we've been talking about Tending God's Garden. GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES October8, 2024

(Minutes will be reviewed & approved at next Council meeting)

Call to Order. President Kelly Witte called the meeting to order at 7:01 PM.

Attendance. Present: Sandi Aston Hall, Pr. Jennifer Jelinek, John Jensen, Bob Koepp, Connie Kreuser, Charlene Luchterhand, Peggy Punsel, Kristin Rue, Richard Scott, Amy Simdon, Kelly Witte. **Absent:** April Mickelson, Shawn Whitman.

Devotions. Kristin shared devotions.

Approval of Minutes. John moved to approve the September meeting minutes. Kristin seconded the motion. Unanimously approved by those who attended the September meeting.

Approval of Agenda. Sandi moved to approve the agenda. Amy seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Correspondence. None

Treasurer's Report. (Amy) In sum, both giving and expenses were higher than last year at this time, but nothing unexpected. We had a net loss of \$1,786.33 in September and a net loss of \$4,735.27 for the year. Our year-to-date (YTD) General Giving at the end of September was \$13,203 higher than 2023 and \$3,262 under the YTD budget. YTD Special Giving was \$10,464 more than last year and \$8,913 more than budget. Our YTD expenses were \$72,786 more than last year. If we didn't include our one-time expenses of the sabbatical, Youth Gathering and the door project, our expenses would be \$3,193 more than last year. We are \$26,060 over our budget due to those same one-time expenses. We would have a \$1,531 loss if the sabbatical grant and expenses were not included. This is about \$7,264 less than last year at the end of September. The checking balance was \$1,692 less than at the end of August with the general fund balance approximately \$3,636 less. Char moved to approve this treasurer's report and send it to audit. Bob seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Pastor's Report.

Pastor will attend the ELCA South-Central Synod Fall Theological Conference this coming Thursday and Friday. She will be in Florida October 24-27. Pastor Erik Jelinek will fill in Sunday, the 27th. November 3 is both confirmation and All Saints Sunday. There are 14 students in confirmation class this year, including one 6th grader, who would have been alone in class next year. Organizers for the Cambridge Community Café missed scheduling our congregation this year. We will be scheduled to serve in October 2025. Committee Reports. (Provided in writing and/or discussed in the meeting as needed.)

• Outreach & Social Justice. (April) The committee has accepted the challenge to assist the food pantry for Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners. Our goal is to provide 200 cans of green beans by October 28. Our November challenge is 200 cans of cream of mushroom soup.

Sabbatical Team Report. (Bob) Pastor Jennifer will be writing a report to Lilly Endowment Inc, the foundation that supported her sabbatical with Bob writing the congregational component. Bob will e-mail some questions to council members to solicit our feedback for this report.

Old Business.

• Health Insurance for Pastor. Discussed options for the family policy. A decision is due before midnight Monday, October 14. Erik Jelinek joined via phone, as more information is needed regarding the health insurance coverage he will receive now that he is on disability leave. He will contact the ELCA benefit provider, Portico Benefit Services and let us know. We will continue this discussion and vote via e-mail when we have more information.

New Business.

- **Congregational Security & Emergency Policy.** A congregational task force is being established. Topic to be discussed in the future.
- **2025 Budget.** Amy distributed Fiscal Year Budget Request Forms to Council representatives of committees and requested completion. Amy will try to have a draft budget available for the next Council meeting.
- Stewardship Campaign. (Connie) The 2024 campaign entitled Tending God's Garden is starting this month. The Stewardship Committee tweaked the time/talent sheet. They are planning an electronic survey for use in future years. As in the past, there will be speakers at several Sunday services.

Adjournment. Sandi moved to adjourn the meeting. Amy seconded the motion. Unanimously approved. Meeting adjourned at 8:07 PM. We ended with the Lord's Prayer.

Next Meeting. Our next meeting will be held on Tuesday, November 12 at 7:00 PM. Peggy is scheduled to present devotions.




