Pastor's Ponderings



What do you love about summer? The weather? Beautiful gardens, plants, and trees? Opportunities to spend time outdoors? One of the things I love about summer is the freedom to do things we might not be able to do during the rest of the year. Sometimes summer feels like our time to live without limits.

But we remember just a few years ago, when COVID taught us what it felt like to live with limitations. Our travel and social gatherings were limited. Our activities and routines were limited, and many of us lived with frustration and some degree of fear, which was difficult to deal with. But we got a small taste of the sorts of limitations some people deal with more regularly. Many people can't travel, due to lack of resources, health issues, or lack of time. Some people are regularly homebound. Some deal with physical disabilities, mental and emotional issues, and other limitations.

Last summer at the ELCA Youth Gathering, my favorite speaker was Jacqueline Bussie, who spoke powerfully about the love she experienced after the sudden, tragic loss of her husband. For months, she had been profoundly limited by grief and loss. It was the love of her friends and family that lifted her up and supported her. And now, a couple years later, rather than feeling limited by her grief, she's discovered a new freedom to be there for others in their tough times. She's titled 2025, "My Year of Showing Up," for those who cared for her and who need love. She wrote, "Tragic freedom is still FREE-DOM. And I choose to compost it. To spend my freedom showing the world that love wins and that we don't have to be fully healed ourselves to show up for one another and that we are more than just our grief or the crappy things that happen to us."

I love this – the idea that we can turn our "limitations" into opportunities, particularly opportunities to share love. No matter how much we feel limited by our bodies, our life situations, or the world around us, we're never limited on how much we can love. There's great freedom in that. So this month, I invite you to join me in reading Jacqueline Bussie's book, "Love Without Limits." (See inside for information on Grace's "Summer Book Club.") This summer, may God bless you with freedom and opportunities to love without limits.

"Save the Bees" Project

In April, the Stewardship Committee (currently consisting of Connie Kreuser, Mary



Bielefeldt, and Steve Geis) worked in conjunction with Breah Klemp, the Sunday School Coordinator, to develop a short children's environmental program to raise awareness of the declining bee population and to encourage participation in the Pollinator Garden. On Sunday, April 27th, the children were shown a short presentation explaining how important bees are to our earth, hopefully inspiring

them to raise funds for the Earth Justice foundation, and to consider signing up to help weed and water our garden. "Bee Banks" were put in each classroom.

In addition, the adults of the congregation were also encouraged to help and "bee banks" were placed on the tables in Fellowship Hall. Cash or checks to Grace Lutheran Church can be placed in these jars

We will collect funds through Sunday, June 1st, and then together with the children's offerings, provide a check to Earth Justice.

Sign up sheets with helpful information will be available for those who are interested in caring for the Pollinator Garden.

Baby Kit Outreach

Summer is on its way and so is the start of the Baby Care Kits project! It's time to start stalking those garage sales for kit items. Please bring your donations to the church any time through July at the collection display near the entrance of the fellowship hall. If you wish to donate to the purchase of cloth diapers or other items, please use VENMO or write a check to Grace and include Baby Kits in the memo line. The Baby Care Kits will be boxed and sent to Lutheran World Relief in September to be distributed around the world.

The following are included in each Baby Care Kit:

- two lightweight cotton t-shirts (no Onesies ®)
- two long- or short-sleeved gowns or sleepers (without feet)
- two receiving blankets, medium-weight cotton or flannel, or crocheted or knitted with lightweight yarn, between 36" and 52" square



- four cloth diapers, flat fold preferred
- one jacket, sweater or sweatshirt with a hood, or include a baby cap TWO pairs of socks
- one hand towel, dark color recommended
- two or three bath-size bars of gentle soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping; no mini or hotel size bars
- two diaper pins or large safety pins Guidelines for Baby Care Kits
- Please include sizes between 6 and 24 months. Varying the sizes of the clothing items included will make the Baby Care Kit useful as the baby grows.
- Sweaters may be knitted or crocheted from leftover yarn, or made from heavy double knits.
- Gently used, clean clothing and blankets (no stains or tears) may be substituted for new ones. It is especially important that the items be in excellent condition, as used clothing is increasingly difficult to get through customs in many countries.
- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.
- Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.

Don't forget that we will be collecting items for the School Kit drive in August. Please look for more info to come. We hope you can help with one or both projects.

May 13, 2025

(Minutes below not approved until next Council meeting)

Call to Order. President Kelly Witte called the meeting to order at 7:02 pm.

Attendance. Present: Sandi Aston Hall, Steve Bielefeldt, Pr. Jennifer Jelinek, Marcia Klemp, Charlene Luchterhand, April Mickelson, Peggy Punsel, Kristin Rue, Richard Scott, Amy Simdon, Kelly Witte. **Absent:** John Jensen, Connie Kreuser.

Devotions. Aprilshared her faith journey, and Pastor Jennifer led us in prayer.

Approval of Minutes. Amy moved to approve the April minutes. Sandi seconded the motion. Unanimously approved

Approval of Agenda. Amy moved to approve the agenda. April seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Correspondence. None

Treasurer's Report. (Amy) We had a net loss of \$9,217.76 in April, giving us a total loss of \$8,187 for the year. Our General Giving through April was \$19,500 less than 2024 and \$13,260 less than the 2025 budget. The Special Giving through April was \$559 more than last year and \$798 less than budget. Our expenses through April were \$24,692 less than last year mainly due to the sabbatical expenses and we were \$6,121 under budget. The checking balance was \$9,200 less than at the end of March with the general fund balance approximately \$8,900 less. Sandi moved to approve this treasurer's report and send it to audit. Marcia seconded the motion. Unanimously approved. Discussed the decrease in giving. No need for alarm at this point, but we will include gentle reminders in the monthly newsletter and Sunday bulletin, to try to avoid financial challenges later this year.

Pastor's Report. Will be officiating at Willie Nagel's funeral tomorrow. High school graduation is May 23. Has been trying to pin down a date with graduates to recognize them during a Sunday service. Synod Assembly will be held this coming Friday and Saturday. Tami Collin and Kelly Witte will attend along with Pastor. She updated Council on her husband's health.

Committee Reports. (Provided in writing and/or discussed in the meeting as needed.) **Education.** (Kristen). Vacation Bible School is tentatively planned for the afternoon of August 24. Volunteers and teachers are needed. The last day of Sunday School for the 2024-25 year is May 18. The kids will also lead the worship service that day. Teachers will be needed for the 2025-26 year. This summer the youth room will be painted and the mural in the downstairs hall-way finished. Flooring options will be discussed after the youth room is updated. Wondering if smoke alarms and carbon monoxide detectors should be added.

- Outreach & Social Justice. (April) The Lenten Challenge raised \$3,495.50 for refugees in Wisconsin. The committee added \$504.50 from their budget, rounding the total to \$4,000, which was sent to Lutheran Social Services for this purpose. Focus for June and July will be collecting items for Baby Care Kits. In August, items for School Kits will be collected. There was limited discussion about God's Work, Our Hands. It is a huge undertaking, and there are no plans currently to initiate service projects.
- Worship. (Sandi). Holy Week and Easter services were all well attended. There was a bit more music this year, including involving kids and adults playing instruments for the opening song. Plan to repeat that next year. Flowers and decorating were lovely. Thanks to Jill Jensen and her crew for decorating. Jeanine Thurow made new Easter paraments. Transitioning to summer schedule, so there will be no choir or handbells, but likely ensemble and solo, vocal and instrumental music for worship services.

Old Business.

- Church Preservation Projects/Bids. Boxes of materials no longer needed will be taken to a shredder on Saturday. A hose has been staked in place from the water source to the pollinator garden, making it much easier to water the garden this summer. Continuing to look at replacing outdoor lights.
- **Personal Safety Commission.** Had first meeting. Will be looking at all types of safety: fire, weather, medical emergency, violence. Many details were discussed, among them a written plan, signage, purchasing safety items, locking some doors at times, training for ushers and others, identifying members with expertise in various areas, and writing grants. Bill Becker and Breah Klemp are taking the lead. Next meeting is in August.
- **Pictorial Directory.** Printed copies are now available for pick-up. Requesting a small donation to defray the cost of printing. Later an on-line directory will be available for anyone who prefers it.
- "Save the Bees." Mary Bielefeldt attended the meeting, filling in for Connie Kreuser. The Sunday School kids viewed the power point presentation on April 27. Mary outlined plans for family involvement this summer with the garden and a fundraiser to "save the bees" through the organization Earthjustice.

New Business.

- Church Picnic. Scheduled for July 27.
- Smoke Alarms/Carbon Monoxide Detectors. Ordered 6 combination units.

Adjournment. April moved to adjourn the meeting. Peggy seconded the motion. Unanimously approved. Meeting adjourned at 8:11 PM. We ended with the Lord's Prayer.

Next Meeting. Our next meeting will be held on Tuesday, June 10 at 7:00 PM. Char is scheduled to present devotions.




