Pastor's Ponderings



When you hear the word "Revelation", what do you think of? Rapture? Beasts and dragons? The antichrist? Signs of the end-times? Fear, punishment, and destruction? Hope and promise? Have you ever tried to read Revelation? How was that experience? Revelation is one of the strangest books of the Bible, and reading it can be quite challenging, especially if we try to read it with the understanding that it's like the other books in the New

Testament.

The last book of the Bible "The Revelation to St. John", which we simply know as "Revelation" (no "s" at the end) is probably the most feared and misunderstood book of the Bible. I think many of us are afraid and intimidated by this odd book, sometimes because of how it's been used and misused by others. Its images have been used in movies, art, other media, and by more fundamentalist Christians, which have often formed our ideas of it. But despite the fact that our denomination is called the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, we interpret the Bible differently from those our culture calls "evangelical" Christians. So from a Lutheran perspective, what is Revelation actually about? Is it really supposed to scare us into believing? What was Revelation saying to its original audience? What (if anything) does it have to say to us today?

Exploring those questions will be our focus in worship this month as we look at passages from Revelation for the next 5 Sundays. To give you a little sneak peek, here are some fun facts about Revelation:

Revelation was written to early Christians who were being oppressed, to give them hope.

Revelation was written as something like a code, so insiders would understand it and outsiders would be confused.

The Greek word for Revelation is "apocalypsis," (English: apocalypse), which actually means "unveiling" or "uncovering."

"Rapture" is never actually mentioned in the Bible. It's a 19th Century mash-up of a couple Bible passages, then falsely attributed to Revelation.

Revelation is really about Christ, not the antichrist.

There are many references from Revelation in our worship liturgy and hymns. We'll explore some of those.

I'm looking forward to this intriguing, faith-inspiring journey through Revelation. May God bless our learning, our understanding, and our worship.


