"Blessings of Community" is our Stewardship theme this fall, and just for fun, I looked up the meaning of "community." Here's some of the definitions I found:

- a unified body of individuals: such as the people with <u>common</u> interests living in a particular area;
- an interacting population of various kinds of individuals in a common location;
- joint ownership or participation;
- social activity: <u>Fellowship</u>

Did you know that the Outreach Team ministry is reaching out to our own members, members of our community, and globally with hundreds of projects for Lutheran World Relief such as layettes, quilts, and school bags?

Their purpose is to expand our church outreach by reaching people who want to hear the Word of God through our broadcast. Year to date, our Facebook broadcast has had over 60,000 views. Did you know that our Monday Night Bible Studies are a marvelous way to get to know your fellow believers and grow in your faith? We build fellowship and community there by sharing our stories, learning more about God and each other, and enjoying a surprising amount of laughter!

Did you know our Ruth Circle ladies find community within our church body by meeting to study the Scriptures while working within many of the other ministries at Grace? They also sponsor the Scandinavian Bake Sale with proceeds going to Lutheran World Relief.

In worship, we've been hearing about each of these ministries, but there are also many more ways that we build community here at Grace. We welcome you to use your gifts and passions here to help grow and sustain our community. In this season of thanks, we invite you to prayerfully consider how you will help support our community in 2026. Ever Wonder about Our GLC AV Team?

<u>Our Purpose</u> is to expand our church outreach to individuals inside our church, homebound members and non-members, members travelling, potential new members, and individuals that just want to hear the word of God through our TV and/or Facebook broadcasts.

Each Sunday, our Grace AV team happily volunteers to assist with the broadcast of our church service (and other church events). Our responsibilities each week:

- <u>Sound System</u>: We run the sound system within the church, and out to local cable TV (Channel 987 on Spectrum), and to Facebook (live and streaming). We actively use 10 microphones for each service.
- <u>Video Broadcast:</u> We video broadcast the church service for Local Cable TV
 (Channel 987 on Spectrum) and Facebook (live and streaming), with 3 cameras.
 Over the last 5 weeks, we averaged roughly 190 views to our church Facebook
 broadcast each week. Unfortunately, cable viewership numbers are not provided
 to us by Spectrum.
- Worship Slides: We run 100+ slides produced by our office administrator during our worship service each week, for our front projection screen in the sanctuary, and to our outside broadcasts.
- **<u>Program Uploads</u>**: After each church service we download our program on Facebook and local TV for future views.

<u>Our AV Team includes</u> Sam Grender, Jim Leser, Steve Oostdik, Todd Tatlock, and Kris Tobias. We're always happy to include more team members; consider joining us!

GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES October 14, 2025

(Minutes will be reviewed & approved at next Council meeting)

Call to Order. President Kelly Witte called the meeting to order at 7:03 PM.

Attendance. Present: Pr. Jennifer Jelinek, Connie Kreuser, Charlene Luchterhand, April Mickelson, Peggy Punsel, Kristin Rue, Richard Scott, Amy Simdon, Kelly Witte. **Absent:** Sandi Aston Hall, Steve Bielefeldt, John Jensen, Marcia Klemp.

Devotions. Kristin shared his faith journey and Pastor Jennifer led us in prayer.

Approval of Minutes. April moved to approve the September meeting minutes. Amy seconded the motion. Unanimously approved by those who attended the September meeting.

Approval of Agenda. Amy moved to approve the agenda. April seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Correspondence. We received a note of thanks from Coach Nelles for serving the football team at the community dinner we hosted.

Treasurer's Report. (Amy) We had a net gain of \$544 in September, giving us a total loss of \$4,097 for the year. Our General Giving through September was \$682 more than 2024 and \$10,905 less than the 2025 budget. The Special Giving through September was \$6,928 less than last year and \$5,514 less than budget. If the sabbatical and Youth Gathering expenses are not included, the expenses through September were \$7,648 more than last year, and we were \$12,411 under budget. The checking balance was \$7,248 more than at the end of August with the general fund balance approximately \$3,482 less. Char moved to approve the treasurer's report and send it to audit. Peggy seconded the motion. Unanimously approved.

Pastor's Report. Four fifth graders celebrated their first communion this past Sunday: Bentley Bauler, Paige Neuenschwander, Josey Rue, and Avery Schutte. Elliott Bernhardt will celebrate first communion this coming Sunday, October 19. Also that day, five boys will be confirmed: Crew Cunningham, Cael Klemp, Peter Mabie, Brady Thayer, and Aiden Williams. Rehearsal followed by dessert will occur this Wednesday. The theme for our stewardship campaign this year is "Blessings of Community." Commitment Sunday will be Sunday, November 9. Time/talent sheets can be completed via paper or online. We will not be having a Thanksgiving Service but are invited to Thanksgiving Eve Service at Deerfield Lutheran Church. (More info forthcoming.)

Committee Reports. (Provided in writing and/or discussed in the meeting as needed.)

- **Education.** (Kristin) First day of Sunday School was 9/7/25. Wi-Fi in the basement still does not connect. Sunday School staff to speak with Kris Tobias.
- Outreach & Social Justice. (April) Our Thanksgiving Cambridge Food Pantry goal is to collect 100 gravy packets and 100 packages of stuffing. April will share info in a stewardship talk Sunday, November 2. The Blue Jay backpack project will occur in April.
- **Property.** (Richard) Has been checking into when someone can work on the lights in the parking lot. Also contacted three tree trimmers. Will be going with Krizsan's in Fort Atkinson, who had the lowest bid of \$3500. Trees will be trimmed and a dead one removed.
- Stewardship. (Connie) The Stewardship campaign is being launched this week.
- The theme is "Blessings of Community."

Old Business.

- **Church Property—Records Review.** Postponed until Steve is available. Noted that minutes are to be kept indefinitely.
- **Jelinek Memorials.** Pr. is exploring an option for an outdoor bench. Will discuss use of other memorial funds in a future meeting.

New Business.

• **Pastor's Health Insurance.** Portico, the nonprofit benefit ministry of the ELCA, is offering four options for health insurance in 2026. Our cost for this benefit will be increasing given that we will be paying the entire amount rather than sharing the cost with Central Lutheran Church in Edgerton. The Value HDHP 4000 policy was selected. This was the lowest in price of the options; Pr. Jennifer feels it will be fine for her family's current needs.

Adjournment. Char moved to adjourn the meeting. Amy seconded the motion. Unanimously approved. Meeting adjourned 7:52 PM. We ended with the Lord's Prayer.

Next Meeting. Our next meeting will be held on Tuesday, November 11, at 7:00 PM. Marcia is scheduled to present devotions. For this meeting, all Council members are to review their own position description in their respective binders to determine if we are doing what is written and if any duties need to be added, deleted, or revised.


