Hello Nob Hill Indivisibles,



I watched a wonderful documentary at the Guild the other day, "Meeting Gorbachev", a beautiful portrait of Mikhail Gorbachev.

How we need more like him in these dark days. I found the director, Werner Herzog, was trying very hard to paint Gorbachev as a tragic figure, having not realized all he envisioned with Perestroika, but Mikhail held strong...and pointed out that, even though his full vision was not realized, the amazing progress that was made under his shepherd. Indeed, an historic Intermediate-Range Nuclear Forces Treaty was signed between the US and Russia in 1987, eliminating a total of 2,692 of nuclear weapons by the treaty's deadline of 1 June 1991. That was 30% of the existing arsenal!

But, as we know, Trump withdrew the U.S. from the treaty in February 2019, accusing Russia of non-compliance. My first thought when I walked out of the theater was sorrow, but then I thought, "two steps forward, one step back". Isn't that how history unfolds?

We are in the throws of "one step back" on so many fronts. But the momentum was going forward (remember the last few newsletters, momentum continues unless reversed by a more powerful force), if we toe the line, hold onto that rope, the momentum will NOT reverse. We can pull it forward again, and send it reeling ahead! This is indeed our moment of reckoning, and our moment to reverse history...it's a very exciting time to be alive and get involved! Keep doing that kids! We WILL overcome!

Actions

National actions:

- 1. This week Mitch McConnell said he would confirm a Supreme Court justice in a presidential election year, contradicting what he said about Obama's nominee Merrick Garland. Why, because he's being supported by huge dark money spending: Rightwing dark money donors have spent \$250 million to pick extremist nominees. Call your House Representative and ask them to EXPOSE the dark money donors that support this plan to stack the Court with extremist judges. Ask them to cosponsor and publicly advocate for the DISCLOSE Act now! You can also send a letter via May Day, by clicking here. Want to read more about DISCLOSE, click here.
- 2. The Trump regime has announced its plan to change EPA methodology on how they estimate future health risks of air pollution. Now, at Trump's behest, the U.S. Geological Survey -- the scientific arm of the Department of Interior -- is halting the prediction of climate change's long-term effects on the country. Instead of predicting climate impacts out until 2100, the agency will stop at 2040. Tell the Dept of Interior and our MoCs to do

- 3. The 2016 election was targeted by foreign adversaries who wanted to undermine our democracy and influence the outcome to benefit their own interest. The next set of guidelines for voting systems in the U.S. are being written by the Election Assistance Commission (EAC) now. Tell them that they must do everything in their power to secure our elections. Experts have warned that connecting voting machines directly to the public Internet through wireless modems or other means increases the vulnerability of those systems to hacking. Email the EAC and urge them to administer guidelines that ban wireless modems and Internet connectivity in voting systems. You can send a letter by clicking here.
- **4.** I'm hot on this one!!! Tell the Dem Presidential candidates to take the 2020 pledge. The pledge calls on the now 23 presidential candidates to treat the primary as an exchange of ideas while respecting their opponents and to immediately support the eventual nominee, working together to "do the work to beat Trump." **Send a letter and/or tweet to all the candidates** and ask them to take the pledge. - 5. What are your thoughts on impeachment? Want to tell Indivisible? Take their national survey by clicking here.

Baby steps?

- After the ACLU published a report documenting that nearly 2/3rds of recently retired or defeated U.S. lawmakers who now have new jobs outside of government, have secured positions influencing federal policy. Here are some examples:
- *Former U.S. Rep. Joe Crowley (D-N.Y.), defeated by Ocasio-Cortez, now works for lobbying giant Squire Patton Boggs.
- *Former U.S. Rep. Lamar Smith (R-Texas) now works for lobbying firm Akin Gump, where he is registered to lobby in favor of the same controversial copper and gold mine in Alaska that he pushed for while in Congress.
- *Former Rep. Lynn Jenkins (R-Kan.) launched her own lobbying firm before she even left Congress.
- In response to the report, Ocasio-Cortez tweeted that she favors a lifetime ban on former members of Congress serving as paid lobbyists. Are your ready, Texas Senator Cruz tweeted back: I agree. Yup, read it here. Now, AOC is in the House and Teddy is in the Senate so that makes for a tough union, but he said it, hold him to it!! Write or tweet him here.
- Sites like Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, and YouTube have an outsized impact in our social lives. We treat these platforms as a "public sphere" using them to discuss issues, connect with friends, and engage in activism and debate. But while these platforms may be used by the public, they're ultimately owned by private companies with their own rules and systems of governance that control—and in some cases, censor—users' content.

 Onlinecensorship.org is pushing companies to operate with greater transparency and accountability toward their users as they make decisions that regulate speech. They offer resources and information on how to appeal different media platforms, and original research on what content is taken down. They also reveal why companies make certain decisions about content, and how content takedowns are affecting communities around the world. Read more here.
- A national movement for 100% clean energy is happening. More than 125 cities and five states (including NM) have made 100% commitments -- proving that transformational

change is possible. The **Sierra Club is taking it one step further with its 100% Clean Energy School Districts campaign!** In partnership with Ready for 100, they are working with parents, families and community members to encourage school boards in districts across the country to pass 100% clean energy resolutions. - We Americans tend to get myopic, but the **EU just had their elections**. Like here, the EU is facing division and siloing, but also, like us, some are listening to the wake-up call. **Voter turnout was the highest ever and several nationalist, populist parties did not get the majorities they anticipated**. There is still lots of turmoil and the far-right is pushing back, but overall, Europeans resoundingly said NO and that they wanted to remain unified. To read more click here.
