

# Tips for pickleball recycling bins



## The type of bin

Consider something very simple – like a bucket, box or basket.

If the bin looks too familiar – people will likely put trash or other recyclables in it.

Consider putting a top on the bin and marking the top clearly to indicate “Pickleballs Only.”



## The placement

Put it where people can see it – or at least notice the sign.

If the site is monitored (like a club) you can place a small bin on or behind the counter so that you can watch for balls only.



## And

If possible – “seed” the bin with at least one broken ball.

For outdoor bins, consider drilling holes in a bucket so it doesn’t collect water.
