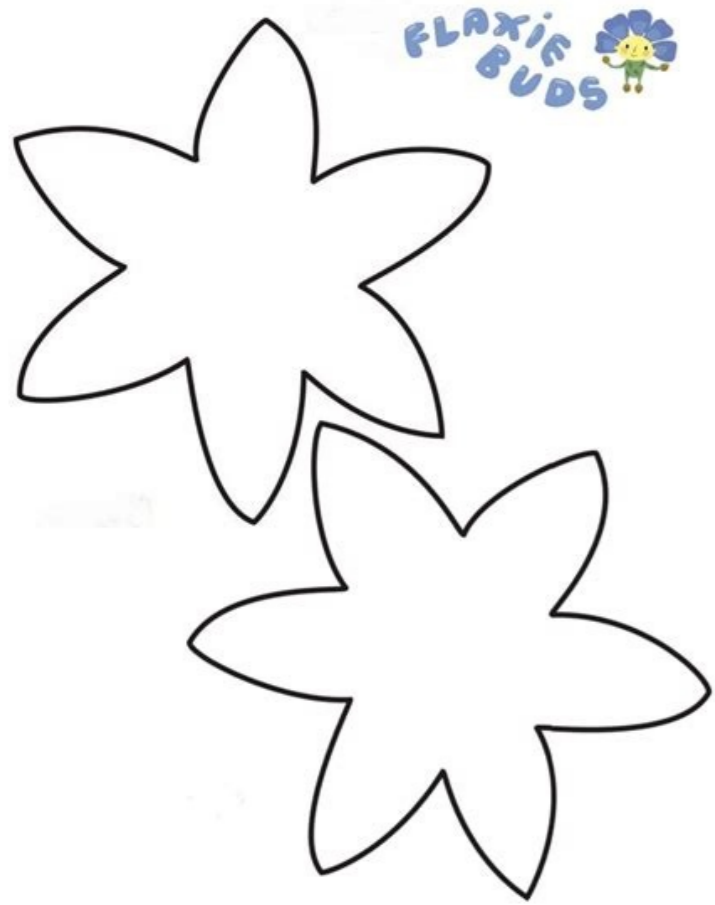

Winter seems to last for ages and I know my kids and I are always excited about the change in seasons when daffodils start to appear, with their cheerful color they feel like proof that brighter days are coming soon. There are three different PDF designs that you can download and as normal I'll be sharing some ideas for ways that you can use these printables to make some easy crafts together. Daffodil Template Daffodils have to be one of my favorite flowers and throughout the spring season you'll normally find some in a vase in our home, I think they're an instant way to brighten your mood.

Daffodil template

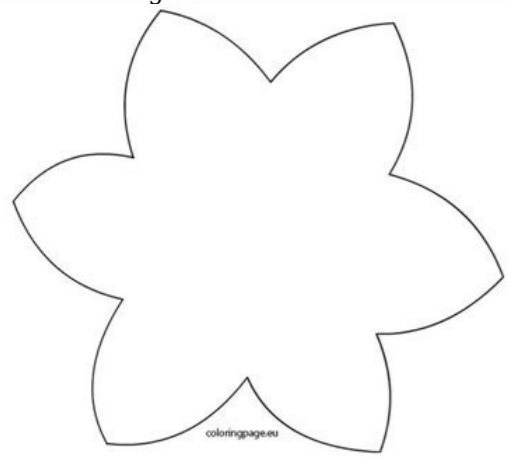


As well as being perfect for spring themed crafts and activities, daffodils are also the national flower of Wales so they're perfect for St David's Day crafts. There are three different daffodil designs available, the first is a full daffodil flower including it's stem and long leaves. The second picture is a close up on the flower showing its petals and trumpet while the final image is a basic outline of the flower shape. You can print out all three images or just the one that you want and of course you can print as many copies as you like making this perfect for preschool, kindergarten or classroom use too. More Flower Templates We love sharing free printable templates for kids crafts because they're a great way to get creative with your kids without spending a fortune. With each printable I also share some ideas for ways that you could use it at home or in a classroom to help fire up your imagination - I know you'll think of loads more cool ideas too! As well as our daffodil template you could also download these flower templates. They're both free and I think they'd look brilliant colored and cut out as part of a bulletin board display. Flower Template Tulip Template Sunflower Template Daffodil Craft Ideas Coloring - these templates would make brilliant daffodil coloring pages and it's a great activity for quiet time with your children too. All you need to do is print out the daffodil outline you want and grab some crayons, markers, pastel chalk or coloring pencils and you're ready to get started. Want to use these as painting templates? Just grab your green and yellow paints instead! Tissue Paper - use two different methods to decorate your daffodil. First grab a glue stick and stick some yellow tissue paper squares onto the petals of your flower and then scrunch some more tissue paper into ball shapes which you can glue onto the trumpet in the centre of it. Dot Painting - dot painting is a fun way to color in templates for a change from using a paintbrush. You can either create dots using a bingo dabber or dip a cotton bud (q-tip) into some paint and dab this onto your template to color it in.

Torn Paper - tearing paper is really good for fine motor skills and it's a really good way to use up any scrap materials that you have lying around. Look for yellow and green construction paper, printer paper or even colored pages in magazines. Once you've torn your paper into pieces just stick it onto your daffodil to color it in. Suncatcher - make the most of sunnier spring days and use the template to make a daffodil suncatcher. If you haven't made a suncatcher before then I've attached a little video tutorial to this post to help show you how to make it, we recommend using colored cellophane for the brightest colors with your contact paper but tissue paper works as well. More Flower Crafts and Activities This coffee filter flower craft is one that I made with my daughter and it was really good fun as well as the end product looking fantastic! The process for creating the colors is so simple even toddlers can join in but the finished effect is pretty enough that older kids will enjoy this activity too. You just need to follow our step-by-step instructions to make a sweet bouquet like this one. These frozen flowers are another activity that was a hit with my kids and if you want to make it we've even got a simple tutorial video to help you. This is a great activity for warmer days or for playing with in a tuff spot. Practice scissor skills with this easy flower craft, these would look great on the front of a card for Mother's Day too. I designed these paper daffodils to the ones right outside the house. I even used my super expensive shimmer cardstock because they are that special. It's a shame you can't see the shimmer on the cardstock that well in the photo, they are really pretty in person. I like using these in wall art and shadow boxes so my technique putting them on stems is not perfect. But if you are making a large bouquet and the base is hidden, then it doesn't matter much. *this article contains affiliate links for your convenience, see full disclosures here Cardstock - For paper flowers, I like using medium weight cardstock with a colored core. It flexes easily and the edges match the petal color Assorted Starter Pack - Basic assorted colors, great starter pack, perfect weight for most papercraft projectsCricut Joy Insert Card Packs - You don't have to use these with the Cricut Joy, they are nice material kids for cardmaking.Cardstock Warehouse Brand on Amazon - I love the quality of all the matte-colored cardstock with Cardstock Warehouse. It is my go-to brand for individual matte colors that I might needPoptone Assorted Variety Pack - This is the perfect peppy assortment of colors of heavy cardstock. It's a heavy cardstock assortment with colors I actually use frequently for cardmaking.Seasonal Assorted Variety Pack - This is a slight variation on the Poptone assortment and has a quite few neutrals that complement almost any accent color.Stardream Metallics Line - For paper crafts, the Stardream line is the go-to for a metallic shimmer finish. It is the perfect sheen to make any project pop. The core is also colored is which hard to find for metallic paper. Glue - I use Tacky Glue Floral Wire and Tape - I actually just use green masking tape like this one. There are lots of floral stems and wire options. Cutting Machine - I use a Cricut. Check out my recommendations for Cricut machines and accessories for beginners for more info. Template - I've included my Paper Lily templates in my resource library. Sign up for my templates and tutorials newsletter and get access to these templates along with tons of other projects: Tutorial for making Paper Daffodils Step 1: Cut out all the pieces from the template I've made 2 types of daffodil templates, one is for a bouquet while the other is for flatter paper art. Step 2: Curl the petals I like to use my scraper device but any straight firm edge would work. Step 3: Assemble the center piece. If you are making the rolled center piece, make sure the base of the centerpiece is small so it can slot into the petal loops. I just fold out the petals but you can curl them if you'd like. I also offset the inner loop a bit but that is up to you. If you are making the petals center piece, I glue each individual petal to each other. Step 4: Stack each piece on top of each other and glue the base. Just glue the center piece onto the base. Optional: Prep the floral wire if that is what you are going to use. I like to string the wire through the base of the flower and then make a loop it keeps it there. Step 5: I then use some masking tape to hold the base in place while the glue sets. I've also included an extra base leaf piece if you want to glue that on as well. Here is the photo of that option from another flower I did.
