

<u>Title</u>: The Hidden Language of the Common Core

**Description:** As per *Council of Chief State School Officers and the National Governors Association Center for Best Practices*, the Common Core State Standards (CCSS) provide a consistent, clear understanding of what students are expected to learn, so teachers, parents, and any service provider working with students knows what they need to do to help them. The standards are designed to be robust and relevant to the real world, reflecting the knowledge and skills that our young people need for success in college and careers. With American students fully prepared for the future, our communities will be best positioned to compete successfully in the global economy.

New Jersey is one of the forty-one out of the fifty states, the District of Columbia, four territories, and the Department of Defense Education Activity (DoDEA) that has adopted full implementation of the Common Core State Standards. The purpose of this presentation is to explore the Common Core State Standards and illustrate how SLP goals can be created directly from the Common Core State Standards to ensure students will succeed in the classroom.

<u>Presenter</u>: Dr. Elisabeth Mlawski is currently a Clinical Assistant Professor at Yeshiva University in New York. She completed her Undergraduate degree at The Ohio State University, Master's degree in Speech-Language Pathology from Northern Arizona University and PhD in Health Sciences with a concentration in Speech-language Pathology at Seton Hall University. She began her career in 1994 working in the NYC Public Schools as a school-based speech therapist. She has presented research both nationally and internationally on mechanisms for peer learning relating to the Common Core State Standards, using peer learning as a tool in clinical and academic education, language acquisition and supervision. Her areas of interest include normal/disordered language development, literacy, clinical training, assessment/diagnostics, and supervision.
