

A SYNOPSIS OF FARO CHURCH'S HISTORY

- **2001** Small Bible study is started in Mission Viejo, CA. Among many others, the Marroquin, Canon, Bran, Fernandez, and Pinto families were present.
- **2002** The small group grew and began to meet at Mission Hills Community Church in Rancho Santa Margarita on Saturday Nights.

Joshua Pinto is named Senior Pastor.

The Board of Elders is established (Joshua Pinto, Aldemar Canon, Chris Bran, Juan Carlos Rada, Rene Marroquin, Teofilo Pinto, and Aurelio Fernandez)

Later that same year, Faro Church began to meet at Canyon Hills Community Church's administrative office building in Lake Forest.

For the first time, Faro began to meet on Sunday mornings.

On November 21, 2002, "Centro Evangelistico Faro a las Naciones" was launched and incorporated as an official non-denominational church.

- 2003 Pastor Steve is ordained as Associate/Youth Pastor and joins the Board of Elders.
 - Pastor Jacqie is licensed as Children's Pastor.
- 2004 Faro launches a second Sunday service.
- **2005** Faro Church signs its first lease and operates in its own building (20918 Bake Pkwy. Suite #108). CA an Somos Nueva Creación
- **2006** Acquires lease of additional building for children ministry use (20914 Bake Pkwy. Suite #104).
- 2007 Pastor Henry Thomas is licensed as Faro's Media Pastor.

Pastor Ricardo Trinidad is licensed as Faro's Worship Pastor.

Becomes affiliated with Assemblies of God SoCal Network.

2008 Faro Church membership is officially launched with 79 Members.

LABI extensions launched.

Faro launches a third Sunday service.

Pastor Krystal Baca is licensed as Youth Pastor.

2009 Pastor Steve Pinto is hired as full-time Associate Pastor.

Faro presents its first DCAT Conference Training for church members.

2010 Faro outgrows current facilities, plans to remodel main building and seeks additional space.

- **2011** Pastor Ricardo Trinidad is hired as full-time Worship Pastor.
 - Faro Church acquires lease of youth/administrative building and expands main sanctuary (20918 Bake Pkwy. Suite #112).
- 2012 Pastor Joshua Pinto is hired as full-time Senior Pastor.
 - Pastor Omar Tellez is commissioned as Young Adult Pastor.
 - Pastor Araceli Godoy is commissioned as Jr. High Pastor.
 - Faro celebrates its 10th year anniversary.
- **2013** Faro Church acquires a five-year lease of present location on (15 &17 Spectrum Pointe Drive).
- **2014** Faro Church commissions new Worship Pastor Tony Deras and Creative Arts Pastor Beto Castillo.
- 2016 Re-structured leadership: Pastor Mauricio: Ministries; Pastor Roy: Youth; Pastor Araceli: Outreach; Pastor; Omar: Administrative; Pastor Henry: Creative Arts; Pastor Beto: Spiritual Formation; Pastor Roger: Executive.
- 2017 Faro Church celebrates their 15th Anniversary.
- **2018** Faro Church begins planning for Community Development Center and launches Faro CDC.
- **2019** Faro church begins the initiative to parent churches, plant churches and partnerships with churches.
- 2020 Faro Church parents its first three churches, Generations Church in Irvine, CA; Rooted Church in Sylmar, CA an Somos Nueva Creacion, in Chihuahua, Mexico. Faro begins food pantry to serve community.
- **2022** Faro celebrates its 20th year anniversary.

- Holy Communion: The Lord's Supper, consisting of the elements bread and the fruit of the vine is the symbol expressing our sharing the divine nature of our Lord Jesus Christ (2 Peter 1:4), a memorial of his suffering and death (1 Corinthians 11:26), and a prophecy of His second coming (1 Corinthians 11:26), and is enjoined on all believers "till He come!"

7.	The Baptism in the	

All believers are entitled to and should ardently expect and earnestly seek the promise of the Father, the baptism in the Holy Spirit and fire, according to the command of our Lord Jesus Christ. This was the normal experience of all in the early Christian Church. With it comes the enduement of power for life and service, the bestowment of the gifts and their uses in the work of the ministry. (Luke 24:49 | Acts 1:4; Acts 1:8 | 1 Corinthians 12:1-31)

This experience is distinct from and subsequent to the experience of the new birth. (Acts 8:12-17; 10:44-46; 11:14-16; 15:7-9)

With the baptism in the Holy Spirit come such experiences as:

- an overflowing fullness to God and dedication to His work, Acts 2:42
- and a more active love for Christ, for His Word and for the lost, Mark 16:20

Sanctification is an act of separation from that which is evil, and of dedication unto God. (Romans 12:1-2 | 1 Thessalonians 5:23 | Hebrews 13:12)

The Scriptures teach a life of "holiness without which no man shall see the Lord." (Hebrews 12:14)

By the power of the Holy Spirit we are able to obey the command: "Be ye holy, for I am holy." (1 Peter 1:15-16)

Sanctification is realized in the believer by recognizing his identification with Christ in His death and resurrection, and by the faith reckoning daily upon the fact of that union, and by offering every faculty continually to the dominion of the Holy Spirit. (Romans 6:1-11; 6:13; 8:1-2; 8:13 | Galatians 2:20 | Philippians 2:12-13 | 1 Peter 1:5)

The Church is the Body of Christ, the habitation of God through the Spirit, with divine appointments for the fulfillment of her great commission. Each believer, born of the Spirit, is an integral part of the Church. (Ephesians 1:22-23; 2:22 | Hebrews 12:23)

Since God's purpose concerning man is to seek and to save that which is lost, to be worshipped by man, to build a body of believers in the image of His Son, and to demonstrate His love and compassion for all the world, the priority reason for being part of the Church is:

- To be an agency of God for evangelizing the world. (Acts 1:8 | Matthew 28:19-20 | Mark 16:15-16)
- To be a corporate body in which man may worship God. (1 Corinthians 12:13)
- To be a channel of God's purpose to build a body of saints being perfected in the image of His Son. (Ephesians 4:11-16 | 1 Corinthians 12:28; 14:12)
- To be a people who demonstrate God's love and compassion for all the world. (Psalms 112:9 | Galatians 2:10; 6:10 | James 1:27)
