

The Mirage is a deep reflection on dreams, disillusionment, and the quest for a new identity in a foreign land. The play highlights that life on the other side is not necessarily better and brings to light the challenges and sacrifices of migrants.



Since then, her passion for movement has been unwavering, complemented by her rhythmic talents on the bendir during family celebrations. As a performer and educator, Amar advocates passionately for the global recognition of Algerian dance.


Her career started in Normandy, her birthplace, where she enriched the local arts scene through teaching and performances at the Couleurs d'Afrique festival.

In 2021, she expanded her reach, participating in esteemed events like the Magheb Dance Congress and "Un seul héros le peuple." Algerian Artivist festival, and now for the first time in NYC!

With each engagement, she reinforces her belief in the cultural significance of Algerian dance on the international stage.

We also partnered up with **Liverpool Arab Arts Festival** [LAAF] to bring more Algerian dance workshops to **Liverpool**.

Explore **Kabyle** and **Chaoui** dance styles presented by the brilliant Hayet AMAR, A highly respected Algerian dancer and percussionist specializing in **Amazigh** (indigenous N. African) dances whose talent and movement vocabulary will inspire anyone who has the privilege to witness her.

A tale of resistance, sisterhood and the shameful past of two colliding nations. This extraordinarily immersive narrative thrusts its reader into the Algerian city of Bou Sâada during the 1930s & into the story of the Naili dancers.

Hamza Koudri, MA in English Literature and Civilization, is the Country Director at the British Council in Algeria. With expertise in education and international development since 2008, he leads English, STEM, higher education, and cultural programs. His initiatives span the MENA region, including mentorship programs at US universities.

As a writer, his novel "Sand Roses" was shortlisted for the Island Prize 2022.

The Beatles of Algeria. founded in the 80s by four musicians from Sidi Bel Abbès, Algeria. The birthplace of Raï music.

Their style mixes Raï, rock and Diwane, it merges traditional rhythms and with rock instruments, considered a pioneer of modern Raï sometimes called "electric Raï".

Their most celebrated hits which are still widely successful with younger and older generations include "Ya Zina", "Til Taila", or "Hagda.
