

His novel, The Couscous Western, was the runner-up for the 2023 Graywolf African Fiction Prize.

His short story, 'The Last Shot of Ahmed Bey's Cannon' won the inaugural 2020 Toyin Falola Prize, and 'Citizen Sarah' was longlisted for the 2023 Afritondo Short Story Prize.

Rooted in centuries-old **Gnawa** and **Sufi traditions**, **Diwane** is a sacred musical rite born from healing ceremonies — fusing hypnotic rhythms, calland-response chants, and the deep pulse of the **Guembri** (three-stringed lute).

From the oasis city of **Béchar**, where Arab, Berber, and Sub-Saharan cultures meet, Gaâda Diwane revitalises this powerful heritage with vibrant energy, bringing ancient trance into dialogue with contemporary sound. Prepare for an unforgettable evening of ancestral grooves, spiritual ecstasy, and the timeless heartbeat of the desert with this rare UK performance.



About Gaâda Diwane Bechar

One of Algeria's most celebrated musical ensembles, known for preserving and revitalising the sacred Diwane tradition — a spiritual musical form rooted in Sub-Saharan African heritage and passed down through generations of Gnawa communities in southern Algeria.

Formed in the city of Béchar in the 1986 by master musician Abdelkader "Baba" Hamida, the group blends traditional percussive instruments like the goumbri and krakebs with trance-like rhythms and call-and-response chants that evoke themes of healing, ancestral memory, and communal unity.

Over the past decades, Gaâda Diwane Bechar has brought Diwane to international stages, from Africa to Europe, while remaining deeply rooted in the ritual and communal aspects of the tradition. Their performances are immersive, hypnotic, and profoundly moving — offering audiences not just a concert, but a spiritual and cultural experience.

Their presence at DzFest is both a celebration and an act of cultural preservation, connecting UK audiences with one of Algeria's richest and most soulful musical legacies from the Edge of the Sahara to London.
