May the grace and peace of our Lord, Jesus Christ, be with you today and always, Pastor Nicki





The Gathering has a mission and a mission field. Our mission is: To restore hope and community through experiencing the hope and salvation of Jesus Christ.

We are all missionaries, sent to our community as our specific mission field. As such, we seek to complete the mission of Jesus Christ in reaching the people. We will follow Jesus' lead and example. We will seek to reach people in their hurt, loss, and brokenness as well as be with them to celebrate the victories in life. We seek to encourage, educate, and care for the whole person: mind, body, and soul. In doing so, we seek to compassionately come along-side everyone and to equip, train and educate our community.

We cannot achieve this mission alone. We need your help. 50% of the people we currently serve are recovering addicts. 88% of the people we serve have no ability to financially contribute to this mission. 15% of Auburn's roughly 13,000 population (almost 2000 families) live at or below the federal poverty level. That means, for a family of 3 their income is \$21,700 or lower. This statistic is unacceptable. Auburn can thrive and we can help each other overcome our circumstances.



AXIOS

(YOUTH GROUP)

Axios means worthy in Greek. We are all worthy of God's love and the love of others. Axios is the youth ministry of The Gathering. This ministry opportunity is open for those in grades 4-12. Currently, we are not meeting, for the summer. We will resume meeting, with a kick-off party at the YMCA of DeKalb at 3 pm on August 1st. The van will bus the kids to worship after where we will feed them during worship. Pick-up will be 6:30 pm. We will meet every Wednesday after that from 6-7:30 pm. Transportation can be provided.

We have a time of discussion about life, circumstances, etc., a sort of check-in. We then go into reading our Bible passage and one of us will draw what the group thinks is relevant to that passage. This way, each time they pass these drawing which are hung on The Gathering's walls, they will remember what they have learned and what God's word and promise says.



AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAMS

The Gathering is happy to announce that we plan on launching a new after school program for at-risk youth. At-risk can mean various things from behavior issues, self-harm, learning challenges, or challenges at home. We will be piloting this program with 5 students from McKenney, 5 from Watson, 5 from the middle school, and 5 from the high school.

We will be focusing on physical and mental health, behavior, school work, financial literacy, and lifeskills such as cooking, cleaning, and personal hygiene.

There will be ways to earn rewards as well. We will introduce "Hope's Closet." This will be where they can spend their rewards and "purchase" items such

as clothes, gift certificates toward new shoes, personal hygiene and school supplies, snacks, jewelry and purses, games, toys, etc. They will be earning "money" to spend in the closet by completing all their homework, reaching their goals, parent reported good behavior, and through community service hours.

We will be working with various community members over the summer to build a curriculum and expectations for the students. We already have 3 McKenney, 2 Middle School, and 1 High School students committed to attending.
