Shot clock operator instructions - Officials

Two visible shot clocks:

- Shot clock operator should have NO other duties during the game
- · Validate shot clocks operate and are synchronized
- · Validate that there is a horn on the clock when clock reaches zero
 - If no clock horn does field have a working horn
 - If no clock or working horn then home team needs to resolve the issue
- Shot clock operator to reset the shot clock only on the officials signal and verbal reset call
- · Shot clock will start and stop on the official's whistle starting or stopping play of game
- · DO NOT reset the shot clock after the end of the period without the officials approval
 - If penalty time at end of period could result in no reset
- · Shot clock is always running, even if game clock is below 80 seconds on reset
- · Shot clock operator will verbalize 60 alerting the officials of the 60 second mark

One visible shot clock:

- Shot clock operator should have NO other duties during the game
- · Validate the single shot clock operates
- · Validate that there is a horn on the clock when clock reaches zero
 - If no clock horn does field have a working horn
 - · If no clock or working horn then home team needs to resolve the issue
- · Shot clock operator to reset the shot clock only on the officials signal and verbal reset call
- Shot clock will start and stop on the official's whistle starting or stopping play of game
- · DO NOT reset the clock after the end of the period without the officials approval
 - · If penalty time at end of period could result in no reset
- Shot clock is always running, even if game clock is below 80 seconds on reset
- · Shot clock operator will verbalize 60 alerting the officials of the 60 second mark

No visible shot clock:

- Shot clock operator should have NO other duties during the game
- Shot clock operator should be as close to the field as possible and safe
- Validate shot clock operator has a timing device that counts down from 80 seconds and can be reset quickly
- · Validate there is a working horn
 - If no horn then home team needs to resolve the issue
- · Shot clock operator to reset the shot clock only on the officials signal and verbal reset call
- Shot clock operator will need to let the officials know by announcing when every 10 seconds has passed
 70, 60, 50, 40, 30, 20, 10
- · At the 10 second call the operator will put their arm in the air
- At 5 seconds the operator will lower their hand then point in direction of the ball is goingand to count the last 5 seconds
 - 5, 4, 3, 2, 1, horn
- · When 0 is on the clock the operator will have to sound the horn
- Shot clock will start and stop on the official's whistle starting or stopping play of game
- DO NOT reset the clock after the end of the period without the officials approval
 - If penalty time at end of period could result in no reset
- Shot clock is always running, even if game clock is below 80 seconds on reset

Note: Please dress in street clothes with a NTLOA logo shirt/coat. No whistles or flags are needed nor should the operator address the coaches except for a shot clock question. Please watch officials and not the game. Additionally, no comments about any on field calls/no calls should be made during or after the game.
