CIFOR-ICRAF is a world-class research institution that delivers actionable evidence and solutions to transform the way land and renewable resources are used, and how food is produced.





THE EUROPEAN UNION FUNDED FORESTRY-CLIMATE CHANGE-BIODIVERSITY NEXUS (EU-FCCB) SUPPORT PROGRAMME FOR PAPUA NEW GUINEA

TEASER

Supporting PNG's ambition to protect its biodiversity and transition to a green, carbon-neutral economy.

Papua New Guinea is composed of 78% of forests, which represent a vital source of food security for many Papua New Guineans, 85% of whom live in rural areas, and constitute a vital part of the cultural, linguistic and spiritual fabric of the country.

They are also of global significance in terms of climate change and biodiversity. In particular, PNG hosts the world's third largest rainforest after the Amazon and Congo Forest basin.

PNG'S FORESTS REPRESENT ONE OF THE MOST VITAL RESERVES OF CARBON AND BIODIVERSITY IN THE WORLD.

The environmental protection of PNG's forests, as well as the promotion of green sources of social and economic development, are priorities of the Government and people of PNG.

The European Union, as a development partner of PNG, has decided to support these efforts through the "Forestry-Climate Change-Biodiversity" Nexus (EU-FCCB) Support Programme for PNG.

With funding for € 54.7 million (PGK 216 million), this Programme is one of the EU's most ambitious forest-related programs anywhere in the world.



OBJECTIVES

In response to identified strengths, weaknesses, and challenges in the sector, and building on the existing progress in PNG's FCCB policies, the EU-FCCB Programme will support a development model (at national/institutional and at pilot community/conservation area levels) that reconciles climate change, environmental protection and biodiversity with sustainable, inclusive and gender-responsive green growth and jobs, by pursuing three specific objectives:

- SO 1** Effective implementation of evidence-based FCCB policies, governance and institutional frameworks;
- SO 2** Increased knowledge and awareness on FCCB issues among PNG's population;
- SO 3** Increased inclusive and gender responsive green public and private sector investments and deforestation-free livelihoods.
